‘So that the Land will not spit you out for how you have contaminated it, as it spat out the nation which was there before you’ (Vayikra 18:28)

This verse follows laws regarding forbidden relationships. It is midway between those laws and the societal laws of chapter 19, like the ‘famous’ injunctions to be ‘holy’ (i.e. even what is permitted to you is not always good for you, according to part of Ramban’s explanation) and ‘love your neighbour as yourself’.

The Land of Israel has a kind of ‘personality’ that cannot bear sin, emphasised by the verb ‘lehaki’ meaning to spit out. The Torah says that if the Jews fall into the same ways as the previous inhabitants of the land, such as those listed in chapter 18, then the Jews’ tenure on the Land is also in jeopardy. While we always have the right to the Land of Israel, our own behaviour may prevent us from exercising that right until we are able to do so correctly.

This is a salutary lesson, whether we are in the Land or not. Verse 25 indicates that the behaviour of the Canaanites led to their loss of the Land. Verse 28 warns us not to emulate them. The prophet Yechezkel/Ezekiel speaks in similar terms in the Haftara read according to Chief Rabbi Hertz’s edition of the Chumash when Acharei Mot is read as a single sidra. (As Rosh Chodesh falls on Sunday and Monday, we read the Haftara of Machar Chodesh today.) Also see Talmud Shabbat 33a which discusses why the sins listed are linked to losing the Land.

Actions of individuals, in any society, do not impact simply on themselves. They also impact on society as a whole, as our actions can shape the kind of people we become and the kind of decisions that we make. Doing ‘your own thing’ can, in some circumstances, ultimately become a selfish decision. The Land of Israel and the Jewish people are like a corporate body. Our actions impact on ourselves and our community. The Land of Israel has a special status as a place to shine (see Devarim 11:12). Here, the Torah tells us that if we wish to exercise our rights, we have to exercise our responsibilities. Through doing so, may we ultimately find a more meaningful life.

As we prepare to commemorate Yom Hazikaron and to celebrate Yom Haatzmaut, we thank God for the precious gift of the State of Israel and fortify our commitment to the Torah and the values it espouses for the Land. With God’s help, we shall succeed, reaping the blessings and spreading them onto others too.

Out of Sync with Israel

Welcome back to all our congregants who celebrated Pesach in the Holy Land. As you step into shul this Shabbat we greet you with déjà vu, or perhaps, déjà entendu.

Seventh day Pesach was Friday. Last Shabbat in Israel, on a chametz-free first day after Pesach, the Israeli minyanim leined Parashat Acharei Mot. For Disapora communities Shabbat was Eighth day Pesach, with the appropriate Yom Tov leining. We shall lein Acharei Mot this week (again if you were in Israel) while Israelis will read Kedoshim. Our communities will remain out of sync till after the double Parasha of Mattot Masei on August 2. We will not be leining the same Kriyat HaTorah till 9th August when both will lein Devarim (which is always read the Shabbat before Tisha B'Av).

This is as long a stretch as ever happens (15 weeks or half of Sefer Vayikra and all of Bemidbar) and it is most unusual.

How we came to separate the leining is the easy one to explain. The length of the gap is a tad harder.

As is known there are 54 Parshiyot to cover between one Simchat Torah and the next. In any non-leap year that's fewer than 52 weeks so there's a little doubling up. Depending on circumstances the following Parshiyot are able to be combined:

Vayakhel & Pekudei, Tazria & Metzora, Acharei Mot & Kedoshim, Behar & Bechukotai, Chukkat & Balak, Mattot & Masei, and Netzavim & Vayeilech.

In a leap year there is less cause to double up but there are other factors which come into play like the loss of Shabbatot to Yom Tov & Chol Hamoed and the need to position certain Parshiyot ahead of or after certain calendar landmarks.

The Parasha distribution remains substantially undefined in the Talmud but from Megilla 29b we learn that the admonitions (and curses) of Bechukotai and Ki Tavo should be read before Shavuot and Rosh Hashana respectively and are ideally separated by a "buffer" week (Bemidbar & Nitzavim) so that we do not come into Yom Yov with a negative mien.

In the Shulchan Aruch (Orech Chayim 428:4) four "checkpoints" are established.



- In a non-leap year Tzav is read before Pesach and in a leap year Metzora (except when a leap year has Rosh Hashana on a Thursday and both Cheshvan and Kislev are 29 days or both 30 days) in which case Acharei Mot is read before Pesach.
- Bemidbar is always read before Shavuot.
- Tisha B'Av is always before Vaetchanan.
- Nitzavim is always before Rosh Hashana.

The astute will immediately have noticed that if Israel read Kedoshim this week and we had combined Acharei Mot and Kedoshim, the sync problem would have been instantly resolved. Moreover, we are skipping two further potential combined parshiyot before our paths converge.

This year is a leap year and Rosh Hashana was Monday, so we read Metzora on the Shabbat before Pesach. In order to place Vaetchanan the Shabbat after Tisha B'Av, Israel had to have single Parshiyot every week (meaning that Bemidbar necessarily falls two weeks before Shavuot).

However, in Diaspora, without combining, we can have Bemidbar at its ideal slot. Why not combine immediately thereafter? According to the Maharit (R' Joseph Trani 1538–1639), one of the most eminent Talmudists of his day, it is considered preferable to combine in such a way that we demonstrably put Vaetchanan in the right place and to highlight the "checkpoint", rather than doubling up earlier.

We'll then remain in step with Israel till Second Day Shavuot next year.

GUIDED VISIT TO THE CZECH MEMORIAL SCROLLS EXHIBITION & AFTERNOON TOUR OF APSLEY HOUSE WITH RABBI LAWRENCE

The Story of the rescue of 1,564 Czech Scrolls by Westminster Synagogue, which arrived at Kent House in February 1964, has passed into history as a small but remarkable episode in the tragedy of European Jewry. The permanent exhibition which was established in 1988, tells the unique story of the arrival from Prague and of their restoration and distribution to communities throughout the world.

Apsley House, a Grade I listed building is the London townhouse of the Duke of Wellington. The house is now run by English Heritage and is open as a museum and art gallery, exhibiting

the Wellington Collection, a large collection of paintings, other artworks and memorabilia of the career of the 1st Duke. Discover through the guided tour, stunning art collections, medals and memorabilia and learn about many aspects of the Duke's life and work.
