Another meaning of Shabbat Shalom...

A major topic of parashat Tazria is tzaraat, the affliction of the skin, which was a spiritual malady and as such required both diagnosis initially and 'sign-off' clearance from a Kohen when it was cured.

What concepts are behind the laws of tzaraat?

One answer provided by the Talmud (Arachin 15b) notes that the noun metzora (denoting one who has tzaraat) represents the phrase motzi shem ra (besmirching another person's reputation) which has the same verbal root – צרע - as tzaraat.

The Talmud views this so negatively that it adds that a purveyor of lashon hara (unnecessary disparaging information about another person) is unable to 'dwell' together with God in this world. This point is perhaps to be taken seriously even if not literally – what does it mean?

The continuation of the passage relates that a purveyor of lashon hara is compared to a snake, which bites without receiving any tangible benefit in return. Such behaviour harms the social fabric of society, not just the specific people involved. Since God wants us to build a peaceful society, something for which we pray several times each day, the Talmud's message is that purveying lashon hara sits in opposition to the objective of building a peaceful society.

Contrastingly, pursuing proper social relations and a peaceful world appear to create a greater revelation of the Divine Presence on earth.

This theme is also found in our prayers. In Sim Shalom, which we recite in the Amidah, we ask that God – referred to there as our father – bless us all as one [together], from which Rabbi Shalom Noach Barzovsky, the Rebbe of Slonim (1911-2000) in his work Netivot Shalom learns that when there is unity amongst Jews, it is as if we are 'dwelling' with God in a family setting. Rabbi Barzovsky suggests that Shabbat is the ideal time to cultivate such unity and positive relationships. The opportunity that Shabbat presents to spend time with others, to be inspired by the spiritual possibilities of the day and to implement these through the mitzvot we perform is one which can promote peaceful relationships and lesson the purveying of lashon hara.

It is therefore not without reason that we wish each other Shabbat Shalom!

The Rabbi Writes

Chodesh Tov!

The month of Nissan is anchor point of the Jewish year. The mitzvah to fix our calendar around this New Moon was the first commandment given to Bnei Yisrael as a whole, while still in Egypt and in anticipation of our redemption. Our years are so arranged to ensure that Pesach always falls in the month of Spring (Shemot 23,12), which is the basis for our scheduled Leap Months in Adar, preventing a lunar calendar drift, which would otherwise see Nissan fall eleven days earlier every year (which is what happens with Ramadan).

Nissan is “the first of months” (Shemot 12,2). It marks one of four new years identified by the Mishna (Rosh Hashana 1,1). The others are in Tishrei (our cycle of Judgement and counting of years), Tu Bishvat (the tithing of tree produce) and first of Ellul for the tithing of animals. King’s reigns are dated from Nissan. However long the monarch may have been on the throne prior to Nissan, Rosh Chodesh marks the beginning of the next year of his reign and documents are dated accordingly – so that if a king came to the throne on Purim, two weeks later it would be the first month of the second year of his reign.

There is an opinion that the Creation happened in Nissan (Rabbi Yehoshua in Talmud Rosh Hashana 10b). This is the foundation for the Birkat HaChama (Blessing of the Sun ceremony) which happens every 28 years when the Sun returns to its “original position” on a Tuesday night (the constellations were set on the Fourth Day of Creation). It is the rarest Beracha we recite with frequency. The next occurrence will be dawn on Weds April 8th, 2037.

During the entire month of Nissan we do not recite the supplicatory Tachanun prayers, we do not recite eulogies and we do not fast. The Fast of the Firstborn is an anomaly established in antiquity in Masechet Sofrim. Even this fast is normally circumvented through attending a celebratory Siyyum (completion of a Talmudic Tractate) on the morning ahead of the Seder (or preceding Thursday when Pesach falls on Shabbat). The fast applies to firstborn son of either their mother or father and some have the custom that the parent of underage firstborns fast in their stead, with a

mother fasting for an underage firstborn son if the father as a firstborn is fasting in his own right.



The Nesiim (Princes of the Tribes) brought their gifts to the Mishkan from Rosh Chodesh Nissan. There is a historic custom to read the appropriate portion (from a Chumash) every morning.

Incumbent on all of us is the practice of Ma’ot Chittim, setting aside money to help poorer people purchase matzah for Pesach (Remah 429.1). Over time, it has become traditional that this is transacted as a donation when authorising the Mechirat Chametz (Sale of Chametz). THIS WEEK'S HAFTORAH BY RABBI ANDREWS

The Haftorah read this week is part of Yichezkel's (Ezekiel) prophecy regarding the messianic era. Specifically, he discusses the future leader of the Jewish people, the division of the Land of Israel, the building and structure of the third temple, as well as its regime of sacrifices.

While the reading begins with a description of the seven-day inauguration, it also mentions the paschal sacrifice offered on the 14th of Nisan. This is the apparent connection to the Maftir as the Korban Pesach is the primary instruction of this week's particular reading.

That said, there are some serious differences between these two portions. The Korban Pesach earns the central focus of the maftir reading, while only appearing in but one verse in the Haftorah.

This prophecy may have been selected as the Haftorah for Shabbat HaChodesh precisely to contrast this prophecy with the maftir reading. The maftir focuses on the beginning of the redemption while the Haftorah speaks of its culmination. The process began with the sacrifice in Egypt and will conclude with the rebuilding of the Bait HaMikdash (Temple). This is precisely the picture that emerges from the listing of God's acts of kindness that we recite in the Haggada ("Dayenu"). We begin with "hotzi'anu mi-Mitzrayim" - the Exodus from Egypt - and end with "bana lanu et Bet Ha-bechira" - the building of the Bet Hamikdash.

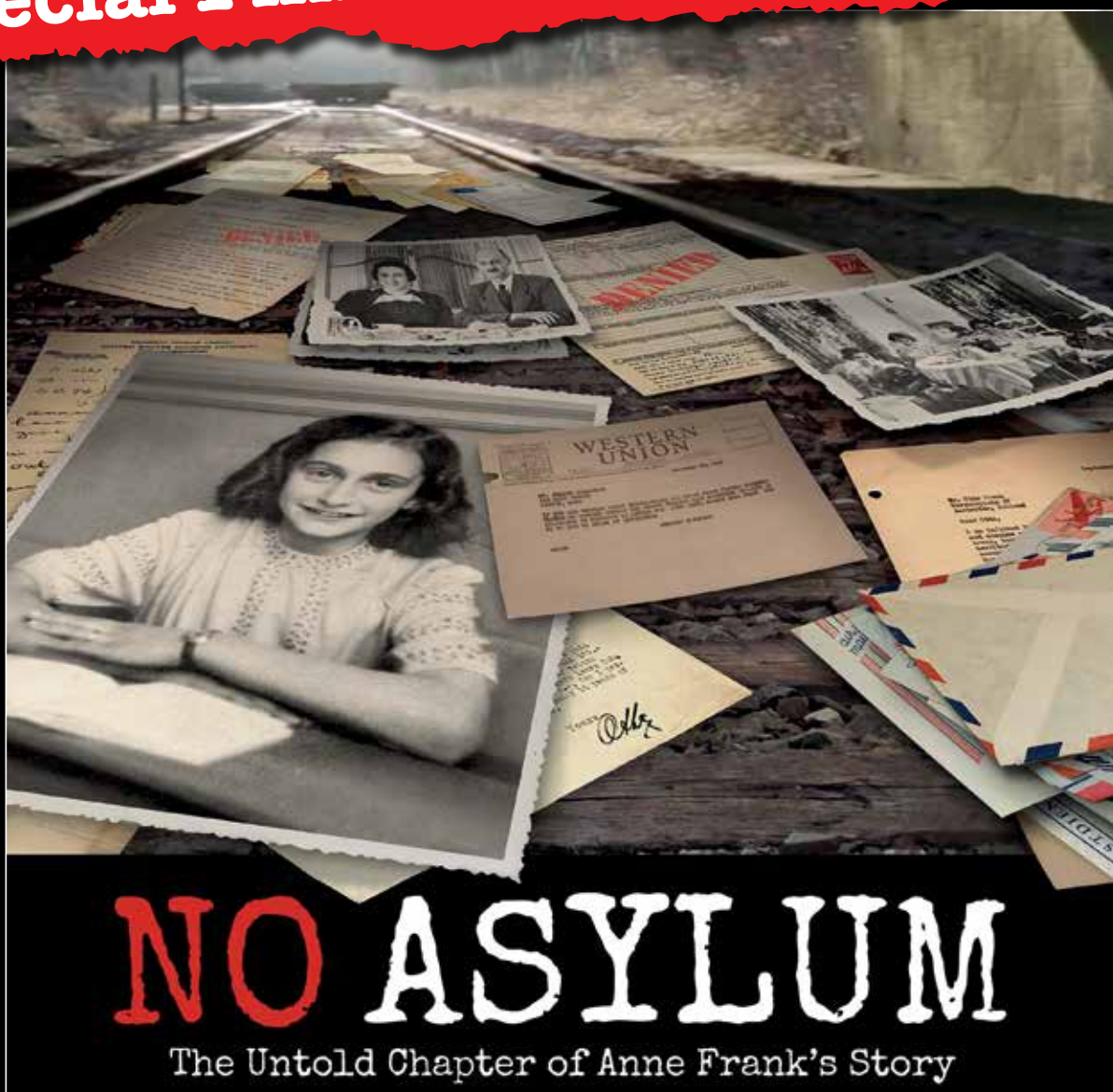

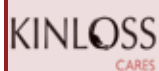
