This week's Kol Kinloss is sponsored by Joseph Szlezinger in loving memory of his father
Samuel Szlezinger Z"l who perished in Auschwitz Concentration Camp in 1942

At the end of *Parshat Ki Teitzei* last week, we read the commandment to remember ‘what *Amalek* did’. This week, *Parshat Ki Tavo* starts with the *mitzva* to bring *Bikkurim* (First Fruits) to the Temple in Jerusalem, when *Bnei Yisrael* would harvest the produce of the Land of Israel.

וּלְקַחְתָּ מֵרֵאשִׁית כָּל־פְּרִי הָאֲדָמָה אֲשֶׁר תִּבְרֵא מֵאֲרָצָךָ...
you shall take from the first fruit of the soil, which you harvest from the Land...
(Devarim 26:2)¹

Rabbi Moshe Alshich (16th Century Sefat) explains that the essence of *Bikkurim* is *hakarat hatov* (expressing gratitude) to Gd. As individuals and as a nation, recognising and appreciating that Gd constantly bestows goodness, is integral to Judaism.

I recently read in Harvard Health² that

.....gratitude is strongly and consistently associated with greater happiness. Gratitude helps people feel more positive emotions, relish good experiences, improve their health, deal with adversity and build strong relationships.

The *mitzvot* of *Bikkurim* and remembering *Amalek*, do not seem to have much in common, however Biblical commentators explain the connection. *Bikkurim* is contingent on living in the Land of Israel and if *Amalek* had succeeded, *Bnei Yisrael* would not have entered the Land.

Upon hearing about the miracles in Egypt, the nations of the world greatly feared Gd and the Jewish people. No one dared lift a finger against them!

Without any realistic expectation of defeating the Jewish people, *Amalek* attacked. Their goal was not victory. They wanted to demonstrate that *Bnei Yisrael* were not invincible and did not enjoy any special Divine protection, rather their success was random.

After living a desert existence of open miracles, once in the Land, *Bnei Yisrael* began farming. They were warned against being deluded into thinking

כְּחִי וְעַצְמִי יָדִי עָשָׂה לִי אֶת־הַתִּלְוָה הַזֶּה
My own power and the might of my hand have made me all this wealth
(Devarim 8:17)

Bringing *Bikkurim* served as a reminder that the fruits of their labour were not independent from Gd and they needed to express gratitude.

Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks ZT'L emphasises this concept in *Essay on Ethics*³

Part of the essence of gratitude is that it recognises that we are not the sole authors of what is good in our lives.

Bnei Yisrael brought the First Fruits to the Temple in Jerusalem acknowledging that everything comes from Gd.

Amalek represents the ANTITHESIS, rejecting Gd – promoting the ideology that everything is subject to arbitrary variables.

Today without the Temple in Jerusalem, *Bikkurim* might appear to be irrelevant. Even though we may not be living in Israel, may we always remember to show our gratitude to the Almighty, for the many blessings that we experience in our daily lives. We should reject the atheistic culture of *Amalek*, espousing coincidence and happenstance.

May we merit to see the Temple being rebuilt in our lifetime and to involve ourselves in the *mitzva* of *Bikkurim*.

Devoted to Your Service

Please do join us on **Motzaei Shabbat at 10.45pm for Memorial Prayers for Her late Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II.** This will be followed by our **Choral Selichot Service, led by Chazzan Avromi Freilich.**

Also, please take the opportunity to join the congregation in expressing condolences to the Royal Family through signing the **Condolence Book**, which is outside the Beit Midrash.

Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II devoted her life to the responsibilities of her Office.

The great Medieval Rabbi, Don Isaac Abarbanel stated that "only one whose thoughts are pure, who shuns sin and who is modest in manners deserves to be Monarch.... for a Monarch to be true to his duties, while ostensibly acting as the People's Master, he should virtually be the People's Servant."

Queen Elizabeth was such a monarch.

Her Majesty was a consistent role model of faithful public service and honoured her vow "before you all, that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service..."

She has inspired our nation with resolve and with comfort in the face of conflict and crisis. She has brought light to our celebrations and shown dignity in personal and public times of grief.

Throughout her reign, our Queen has counselled with faith, with integrity and with wisdom.

A woman of valour, an Eishet Chayil, she is deeply mourned and will be greatly missed.

Our sincere condolences to her family and her loyal subjects.

May her soul be forever at rest in God's Presence.

In his address at the United Synagogue Memorial Service on Wednesday evening, the Chief Rabbi drew on the motif of our Rosh Hashana Mussaf service. In the Mussaf Amidah, the sections leading up to the shofar blasts are the Malchuyot (verses on Hashem's Sovereignty), Zichronot (verses on Hashem's remembering our ancestors and transcending our lives) and Shofarot (verses heralding greatness and radiating hope for Salvation under God). He highlighted matching qualities of Her Majesty that

should inspire us, as we reflect on her life and on our lives at this holy season.



Queen Elizabeth wore the Keter Shem Tov, crown of a Good Name. Pirkei Avot describes this as the crown which exceeds (or according to some commentaries, underpins Dominion, Priesthood and Torah. Around the world and throughout her life, Queen Elizabeth won respect for her good name, her integrity, her insight and her compassion.

When wishing mourners well, we might wish them Long Life or Length of Days. The first suggests longevity, and does not always obviously address the emotions of the bereaved. Length of Days implies that each day lived, whether life be long or short, is meaningful. Her Majesty was blessed with the first. Through her devotion to public service, she achieved and excelled in the second.

An early adopter of new communications technologies, the late Queen brought the monarchy closer to the people and presented messages of support and hope. Drawing on her deep faith Queen Elizabeth was a consummate diplomat and a Rodef Shalom, a pursuer of peace. From the dark times of WW2 and its aftermath, through till her passing last Thursday, Her Majesty addressed our apprehensions, sought to unify her realms, was an ambassador of virtues to world leaders. She radiated hope.

May she continue to inspire the generations of Elizabethans.
