DVAR TORAH BY RABBI LAITNER

Noah's rebuilding

‘And Noah built an altar to God...and God smelt the sweet smell; and He said in His heart, I will not continue to curse the earth because of mankind, because the inclination of man's heart is bad from his youth...’ (Bereishit 8:20-21)

Our pasuk (verse) appears in the context of Noah's exit from the ark after the flood waters have subsided.

The pasuk describes that the first thing that Noah did after leaving the ark was to build an altar and bring offerings to God, using animals that were designated as tahor, (i.e. kosher)‘.

In his book ‘Divrei Agadah’, Rabbi Yosef Shalom Elyashiv (1910-2012), discusses why Noah did this.

He notes that Noah used pure animals for his offerings to signify his pure intentions to play his part in building a new society which would be purer than unacceptable society which had existed at the time of the flood. Quoting the homiletical source, Midrash Yalkut Shimoni, Rabbi Elyashiv suggests that, in this spirit, we recall Noah's pure intentions at the end of each Amida prayer when we pray, ‘ve'areva... minchat...kimei olam’, (Malachi 3:4), that our prayer and offering should be fragrant to God as in days of old.

Noah's intentions are particularly praiseworthy given the apparent qualification over his righteousness at the beginning of the Sidra (Bereishit 6:9) and the Talmud's comment (Succah 52b) that the phrase, ‘the inclination of person's heart is bad’, is a reference to the yetzer hara, the inclination for bad which exists in us. Our task is to master this urge and use it for the good. Noah's offerings showed success in this respect as he used the offerings to demonstrate gratitude to God rather than for his own enjoyment.

As an addendum, the Torah's main focus on offerings (korbanot) as Mitzvot is in Sefer Vayikra (Leviticus). Those earlier instances in the Torah which describe offerings, such as our pasuk, help us to understand the religious meaning behind offerings even when they recount events rather than providing legislation.

Reclaiming a Paradise Lost

One of the early themes to emerge within the Torah is our relationship with nature and wildlife.

In Bereishit 1, 27-28 Hashem creates humans with mastery of the world and its creatures. "In the image of G-d", there is a clear hierarchy and distinction between us and other life forms. While in Bereishit, we are allowed to eat "every seed-bearing plant that is upon all the earth, and every tree that has seed-bearing fruit", animals were off-limits. Humans were designated vegetarians. However, after the end of the Flood in Parashat Noach, Hashem allows that "Every creature that lives shall be yours to eat; as with the green grasses, I give you all these. You must not, however, eat flesh with its life-blood in it."

Chizkuni (c13, France) cites a Midrash that the extension of our diet was because the animals were now beholden to mankind for saving them. While (to carnivores) this might seem a "bonus", mostly it is characterised by the commentators as a concession to our violent nature. In the same verses, we are required not to eat the limb from a living animal and reminded that the shedding of human life is off-limits.

The Talmud (Sanhedrin 108b) describes a conversation between Avraham's servant Eliezer and Noach's son, Shem. (Shem is Avraham's great x6 grandfather).

Shem said to him: We experienced great suffering in the ark caring for the animals. Where there was a creature that one typically feeds during the day, we fed it during the day, and where there was a creature that one typically feeds at night, we fed it at night. With regard to a chameleon זקיתא, my father did not know what it eats. One day, my father was sitting and peeling a pomegranate. A worm fell from it and the chameleon ate it. From that point forward my father would knead bran with water, and when it became overrun with worms, the chameleon would eat it.

It is a touching picture. Throughout the flood and until the waters drained, day and night the nine humans spent their time tending to the different and individual needs of each species. In the capsule of surviving life, mankind fulfils the mission of לעבדו ולשמרו to serve and protect.

Of course, it is Eliezer, who is charged by Avraham with finding a wife for Yitzchak and implements the test that the suitable bride would be the woman who offers water to him and his camels. (Bereishit 24).

From the order within the verses in the second paragraph of the Shema, "I will grant the rain for your land in season, the early rain and the late. You shall gather in your new

grain and wine and oil. I will also provide *grass in the fields for your cattle; and you shall eat and be satisfied.*" (Devarim 11, 14-15) we learn that it is a mitzvah to ensure our animals are fed before we sit down to eat.



The Torah is direct that we must overcome our natural tendencies to respect animal welfare. כִּי־תִרְאֶה חֲמֹר שֹׂנְאֶךָ רֹבֵץ תַּחַת מְשָׁלוֹ וְחִדַּלְתָּ מֵעֲזֹב לוֹ עֵצָב תַּעֲזֹב עִמּוֹ: When you see the ass of your enemy lying under its burden and would refrain from raising it, you must nevertheless help raise it. (Shemot 23, 5). Even as our enemy's beast struggles with its load, we should help the animal. It is not our enemy – even if it is serving him.

The recent David Attenborough programmes indicate quite sophisticated animal communication and emotion. Many scientists are wary of anthropomorphism or projecting our theory of mind upon the animal kingdom. Rabbinic literature certainly seeks to differentiate between human beings as spiritual and animals as soulless. (According to most sources, there is no doggy heaven!)

Nonetheless, from the Halacha that one should not kill an animal with its young on the same day (Vayikra 22, 28), Rambam writes in the Moreh Nevuchim: "people should be stopped from killing the two together in such a manner that the young is killed in the sight of the mother; for the pain of the animals under such circumstances is very great. There is no difference in this case between the pain of man and the pain of other living beings, since the love and tenderness of the mother for her young ones is not produced by reasoning, but by imagination, and this faculty exists not only in man but in most living beings."

Throughout the Torah and in Halacha, we see many teachings on Tzaar Baalei Chayim, prohibitions on cruelty to animals. On a fundamental level, they indicate an appreciation of our environment and respect for Hashem's Creation. However, if we look at the examples through which these halachot are presented, we see that animals are presented in the context of our human experience and inter-personal relations. It goes back to Noach and his family in the Ark – learning to look after the animal kingdom properly is a first and necessary step in saving ourselves and reclaiming a Paradise Lost.

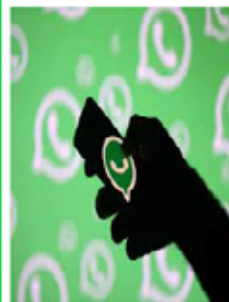
