Retelling the Story – Leora and Harry Salter

One of the pivotal and crucial elements of the Seder night is the Mitzvah of recounting the story of the exodus from Egypt. It is deemed so crucial that the Hagaddah relates that 'one who elaborate is praiseworthy.' Also the Hagaddah says that one has to feel as if they themselves went out on the exodus from Egypt. What is the reasoning and meaning behind this Mitzvah?

We find that within the Hagaddah itself, there is much discussion about the requirements of the night. 'Even if we were all wise... there is a Mitzvah on us to tell about the story of the Exodus from Egypt and whoever increases their telling is praiseworthy.' Rabbi Chaim Friedlander, author of the Sifsei Chaim, asks why would you have thought that a wise person should be exempt from the telling of the Exodus, that we specifically have to be told otherwise? We have to understand that on this night there is a very different obligation to the rest of the year. On other days of the year we have to remember and mention the Exodus. On Seder night, the obligation is more than this, it is to actually tell the story from the beginning to the end.

There are specific requirements of the night as well to tell over the story. Firstly, it is done through question and answers. Then there is a requirement of beginning with the derogatory, how low we were when we were in slavery, and ending in praise, how Hashem performed miracles for us. Finally we have to remember the Pesach sacrifice, matza and maror, and explain their reasoning.

The Mitzvah to tell the story is a Mitzvah to elaborate on ones telling. The more one hears it, the more it becomes etched in the mind, painting a vivid picture of what happened. Therefore one may have thought that telling is only for one who is lacking insights into what went on, yet a scholar already knows it all already, they should be exempt. Instead we are told that even a scholar has to tell it over, even one alone has to tell it over, and spend time examining all the finer details. This is despite the fact that they heard it last year and know it already.

The telling over is to enable us to reach a point where we see ourselves and relate our life experiences to the exodus from Egypt. When you tell over a story and point out all the details, the image becomes more and more vivid to the listener. But the teller also benefits. When telling over the story of the exodus, the physical and spiritual oppression the Jewish people faced in Egypt, one relates to it more than simply skimming over the story. By speaking about the exodus from Egypt at length and in more detail, we come to induce feelings that it's as if we ourselves were there. Therefore there is no difference between the wise and the layman; they all have to feel this.

Appreciating the Perspectives

It was very special to meet Israeli sculptor Zadok Ben David



and see the installations at his studio in West Hampstead at Kew Gardens. Zadok is a sculptural illusionist, whose work is rich with metaphor. The facing side of a 3 m disc shows thousands of vibrant butterflies,

each intricately painted. Seen from behind, if one chooses to explore, matte black - but upon closer examination a mass of cockroaches. "Take away the beautiful wings of a butterfly", says Zadok, "and we would dismiss what is left as an ugly bug." Even closer examination of the colourful facing side, shows that in place of the torso of each butterfly, is the form of a human being. Each bug is a life. Every human being imagines taking flight and realising beautiful dreams.

The Seder offers many opportunities to reflect on the impressions we give, the judgements we make about people; illusion and perspective... We can find deeper understanding in the four sons, try to explain free will and compulsion in Hashem's hardening of Pharaoh's heart. The sages take their turns in combining Pessukim to augment the number/gravity of the plagues.

Within the Maggid section, we read of the scholars discussing the exodus through the night in Bnei Brak, till their students summoned them for prayer. I highly commend to you the essay by Rabbi Lord Sacks in his Haggada, explaining the historical context of that evening and the symbolism of their assembly and discussion. Each one of these Jewish leaders of the Sanhedrin, who had temporarily ousted Rabban Gamliel has a valuable story of his own and teachings which bear closer scrutiny.

Rabbi Eliezer ben Hyrcanus was an arch-conservative Cohen, often siding with the more stringent rulings school of Shammai. He challenged liberal and midrashic interpretations of the Torah. It was Rabbi Eliezer who sought to win an argument by summoning a tree to move, a stream to flow backwards, the walls of the bet midrash to collapse and a heavenly voice to confirm he was right. Halacha went with the majority vote and against Rabbi Eliezer (and Hashem's own interpretation!) The most quoted, teacher in the Talmud, Rabbi Eliezer advises (Brachot 28b) "Be particularly careful about the honour due to your fellow man... and whenever you pray, be aware of before whom you are standing..."

Rabbi Yehoshua ben Hananiah was a Levite. Together with Rabbi Eliezer, he had saved Yochanan ben Zakkai from

Jerusalem and brought him to Vespasian, allowing for the establishment of the new Jewish seat of learning at Yavne. It was R' Yehoshua's serial humiliation by Rabban Gamliel that led to the latter's deposition as head of the Sanhedrin. R' Yehoshua opposed unnecessary stringency. He taught that life had to go on after the destruction of the Temple and that there needed to be limits on the measure of our mourning. In Pirkei Avot (Ch2), he teaches, "an evil eye, the evil inclination, and hatred for humankind take a person out of the world."

Rabbi Elazar ben Azaria was the head of the Sanhedrin at the time of this episode. His elevation, despite being the youngest present, saw him mature overnight - hence, in the Haggada - "I am like a man of seventy..." He took the opportunity to lead the community, despite his wife's admonition that the chalice that came his way might as easily be removed. Nonetheless, he felt, the moment should be seized. In Pirkei Avot he teaches, "Where there is no Torah there is no Derech Eretz; where there is no Derech Eretz there is no Torah. Where there is no wisdom there is no fear of God; where there is no fear of God there is no wisdom... Where there is no flour, there can be no Torah where there is no Torah there will be no flour..."

Rabbi Akiva came to Torah late in life and from the humblest background. It was his wife Rachel, who nurtured and encouraged his 12 years of study. Akiva famously participated in the revolt against the Romans and believed that redemption would come through the hands of Bar Kochba. In the famous Aggadata, Moshe looks to the future of Torah study and is confused by Akiva's teachings until Akiva ties them back to the Torah of Moshe Rabbeinu. He also sees the outcome of his scholarship and study: Akiva died a martyr to the Romans; on his lips, "I have finally discovered what it means to serve God with all my soul" (Brachot 61b).

Rabbi Tarfon is recorded as a devoted son to his mother - when her sandal broke, he had her walk on his bare hands. He prepared the Shabbat home for his wife and laid out sweet foods for Yom Tov his children. R' Tarfon taught, (Avot 2,16) "You are not obliged to complete the work, but neither are you free to desist from it..."

The Hagadda is a wonderful text to begin our discussion of Yetziat Mitzrayim. Enjoy the opportunity to explore its characters and hidden depths.

And no less - make the time and enjoy the opportunity to learn the stories, the dreams and perspectives of your own resident sages at your own Seder Tables.
