Parshat Shemini

The latter part of this week's Parsha introduces the details of Kashrut: which animals are permitted, and which are not. It also explains that animals which have not been slaughtered appropriately or have died naturally are not suitable for Jewish consumption.

Four-legged beasts must have a cloven hoof and chew the cud. Fish must have fins and scales. Essentially birds must belong to traditional and identified groupings of non-predatory/non-scavenging types. There are some communities who believe that the turkey, which was not known in the Biblical/Temple era is *not* part of the kosher tradition. Accordingly, they hold it not to be kosher.

Insects and swarming animals are prohibited. There is an exception for a couple of designated locust species. Although, the Jewish world is largely of the view that we cannot be sure which of these species, some Yemenite and Moroccan communities do have a tradition and view stuffed locust with rice as a delicacy.

I am often asked if these laws were perhaps true to their time and grounded in early hygiene and dietary safety concerns. Aside from the fact that many cultures have fared reasonably well on grubs and rodents, frogs, snails and horses, it goes very much against the grain to accept an answer where Hashem is telling us to do something for our benefit but then allowing the rest of humanity to poison themselves.

When broad principles of ethical and decent living are given it is normally clear that they have a wide ambit. At the end of the listing of these laws, we are told that they come from Hashem who elevated us from Egypt. Implicit in this is that they are part of our national covenant. Perforce, the laws of Kashrut are to be understood on a spiritual and not a medical basis.

This proposition is reinforced by a statement by the great commentator Rashi (d1105), who observes that when we pass a non-kosher butcher shop, we ought not shudder in disgust at the treif meats on display within; rather, we should acknowledge that others are permitted to eat these foods but we are required to distance ourselves from them.

At the conclusion of the Parsha, we are told that this body of laws is, "to distinguish between the impure and the pure, and between the creature which may be eaten and the creature which may not be eaten." (Leviticus 11, 47) The commentators note that it is not enough to know the difference between a cow and a donkey, we should be sensitive to the fine distinctions between correct and improper slaughter. The Torah certainly does not leave room for "kosher style".

In calling upon us to make distinctions, the Torah hints at one of the underlying purposes of Kashrut. The Torah is

demanding of us awareness. We are supposed to consider the origin of our food; not just grab or wolf down whatever lies before us. Moreover, we are supposed to exercise self-censorship despite our tastes. Even if we are drawn to the sizzling bacon, we may not eat it. Even if we like the roast beef on offer, but it has been improperly killed, we may not eat that either.

We are reasonably adept as masters of our lives and live in a society where we like to be able to define what we want and to get it... and to get it now. The laws of Kashrut remind us that we do not have unfettered freedom. "I am Hashem who elevates you from the land of Egypt to be your God. You shall be holy because I am holy." Even on the most mundane level of what we eat, Hashem calls upon us to acknowledge that we are a part of a people, answerable to our Redeemer and charged with a noble purpose.

Keeping kosher, alone, does not make a person good. The Rabbis confirm that eating strictly kosher but in a gluttonous manner is despicable and unholy. Nonetheless, our dietary code is an essential limb of our heritage and Jewish living.

Rabbi Ovadia Seforno (d1550) observes that Hashem brought us out of Egypt so that we could become closer to him. The effort we put into learning about and keeping kosher, to do his bidding brings us closer, still. The Talmud encourages us; if a person does just a little to raise their spirituality in this regard, then Hashem will raise them many times over.

May our reach for more godly lives with each meal that we eat be met with Hashem extending His blessing to our households and our daily lives.

The Rabbi Writes

What an amazing Purim! Thanks to everyone who helped with the multiple **Megillah readings** and celebrations of the day. Also to everyone who so generously shared **Mishloach Manot** with our families and the Office. Each year I am blown away by the kids for kids readings – both at Kinloss and at **Sacks Morasha** – not just because our young people learn their portions and lein so well, but also because our young people, their young siblings and older family members are all able to sit through a full megillah in reverential quiet. When we want to, we really can!

My Purim took an unexpected turn with an invitation to meet the New Zealand High Commissioner at New Zealand House in the afternoon, and then a subsequent invitation to deliver a prayer at the

Interfaith Vigil at Trafalgar Square that evening. **Sir Jerry Mateparae** GNZM, QSO, KStJ is a former Governor General of New Zealand, chief of the NZ Defence Forces and lived in Israel for two years while supervising NZ peace-keeping forces in Southern Lebanon.

Sir Jerry has a Maori ancestry. We had a very interesting conversation about heritage and national territorial affiliation; how to preserve sacred values in increasingly diverse and cosmopolitan homelands.

Just before the vigil, the faith representatives met up



and the clergy led by the Archdeacon of Canterbury, who is a Kiwi changed into their robes. It was observed that Rabbinic attire is much the same in and out of services... until I showed them what I had been wearing for the Megillah readings just a short while before!

The Megillah emphasises that we must attend to our defence; loyal protection of community. Once that is achieved, we do not sit back. We must pursue peace and engage in



building through the outreach of charity, hospitality and good deeds.

It is noteworthy that the Megillah doesn't end with heroic adulation for the victors. Even Mordechai is described as finding favour with only "most of his people." (Which is a better approval rating than many leaders!).

But then the Megillah continues with the message that his virtue was not his success but his values. Mordechai looked to the welfare of all of his people and spoke of shalom - peace, equilibrium, stability, perfection, completion for all of his people.

Liked by most but caring for all.

This Monday evening (1st April) I will be giving a shiur on the **Halachot of Pesach** (8pm at the home of Mark & Eleanor). We will be looking at kashering the kitchen etc. Please do join us.

Looking beyond Pesach, I am really excited that we are heading into our fourth **Kinloss Day of Inspiration** on May 19th. We are particularly blessed this year to have **Chief Rabbi Mirvis** presenting a keynote address on the day. Through our partnership with **Mizrachi**, what began with five international presenters (four of them on a Skype link) is now around thirty international presenters live; a full weekend programme in London shuls and this year, also in Manchester. THIS WEEK'S HAFTORAH BY RABBI ANDREWS

This week's Haftorah from the 36th chapter of Yichezkel (Ezekiel) is paired with the special Maftir reading for Parshat Parah. In this Haftorah, the prophet tells us that God is concerned with the reputation of His name. For His sake alone God will bring the people back together and purify them. God will give them a new heart, and return the holy spirit to them so that the people follow and faithfully observe God's laws. God will also purify them: "I will sprinkle clean water upon you, and you shall be clean" (36:25).

When the people have been gathered in the Land of Israel, there will be abundant grain crops, and trees filled with fruit so that the people will never again be humiliated in front of the other nations. Ruined places will be rebuilt, and small settlements will be full of people. Thus, the peoples around Israel will see the rewards that God bestows upon his nation.

In the final two verses of the Haftorah God promises to multiply the people "like sheep" and this he will do for "their sake" (36:37). Jerusalem will be full of people who will all know that the Lord is God.

This reading is thematically connected to Parshat Parah. Parshat Parah presents an ancient rite of purification for those who have come in contact with the dead. The Haftorah foretells how Israel will be purified by God, and in fact brought back to life with a new heart and a new spirit.

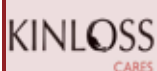
