“And Moses saw the entirety of the work, and behold, they had performed it as God had commanded - so had they done - and Moses blessed them” (Shemot 39.43)

The Mishkan (Tabernacle), is now completed. Two questions immediately emerge from the text. Stated chronologically, why is the description of performance repeated, and what was the blessing that Moses gave?

We will look at the second question initially.

Rashi explains that Moses’ blessing was that the Divine Presence should rest over their work, invoking a verse found at the end of Psalm 90 and said in Shabbat morning prayers (p. 338 in the green Siddur).

This is one of the 11 Psalms in the Book of Tehilim (Psalms) attributed to Moses, as noted by Rashi in his commentary to that Psalm. Those 11 Psalms correspond to the 11 tribes blessed by Moses in the Sidra of Vezot HeBeracha (Devarim chapter 33).

Rabbi Shlomo Efraim, commenting on our verse in his 16th century work, “Keli Yakar”, sees the construction of the Mishkan and the blessing as repairing the damage caused by the building of the golden calf. Ironically, perhaps the golden calf was a catalyst for the construction of the Mishkan, as people needed a designated place where they could pray communally.

This emphasises the power of community and shul. It is a place where our very presence by itself provides the setting to enable all present to flourish, a process enhanced by our active participation.

Turning to the first question, Keli Yakar notes that the description of performance could also hint that the Jews carried out similar activities in both the construction of the Mishkan and the building of the golden calf. Moses prayed that in building the Mishkan, the people’s activities and motivations would be correct, worthy of receiving God’s blessing.

Keli Yakar concludes by noting that Moses prayed that the correct approach to constructing the Mishkan would lead to the realisation of one of the earliest verses describing the Mishkan, “And they shall make me a Mishkan and I will dwell amongst them”, (Shemot 25:8). Proper construction of the Mishkan, the very opposite of the construction of the golden calf, could demonstrate the worthiness of the people for God’s Presence to dwell within them.

May we emulate this to the best of our ability in our shuls.

The Rabbi Writes

Thanks to everyone who made Shabbat UK at Kinloss so successful! From the Challah bake, through the children singing, to the services, the luncheon and the entertainment, we enjoyed a packed programme with inspiring Divrei Torah and shiurim. We were particularly fortunate to enjoy the talents of **Rabbi YY Rubinstein**, rich with anecdotes and humour as well as a though-provoking shabbat afternoon shiur on Kiddush Hashem.

We might wonder that so many strange events happen to a single person, each of which combine to teach a powerful Torah idea. In fact the opposite is the explanation – when one's life is imbued with a Torah outlook, then everything that happens can be viewed and presented in a way which connects one with the *hasghacha* or providence of the Almighty. In Tehillim 86:21, King David states, ה' דַּרְכֶּךָ אֶהְיֶה בְּאֱמֻנָתְךָ, "Teach me your ways, Hashem, and I shall walk in your Truth, consolidate my heart to revere Your Name." As we are schooled in learning, we see that we are walking in the Divine ordained path. Our faculties grow in increasing awe of Hashem.

On Monday morning, I attended a meeting set up by **Mike Freer MP** at the Home Office with the **Rt Hon Caroline Nokes MP, Minister for Immigration**. Also



attending were Rabbis Jonathan Wittenberg and Rebecca Birk. The Minister wanted to brief

us on the position of unaccompanied child refugees and the Our Turn Campaign, set up in the 80th year after the Kindertransport. We looked at the challenges and costs of successful Anglo-integration, schooling and community support.

The humanitarian support of children, which is costly, becomes very politicised when we address questions of family reunification, having the children joined by parents, elder siblings etc. After my grandfather passed away, we found a letter that he had kept, for 50 years, which was from his mother. It pleaded with him to help her join him in England, that she would be happy to take any job, even cleaning latrines. We also have the correspondence that she was ineligible as a refugee – and we know when she was transported from Berlin to Riga, and when she was killed.



In my Monday night shiur we looked at the laws of Muktzeh; the different categories of utensils which may or may not be moved and/or used on Shabbat. We learned the passage from the Gemarra (TB Shabbat 123b) which tells of an original draconian restriction to allow just three table implements, which was relaxed in different stages over time. Muktzeh has twin roles; as a way of preserving Shabbat as a day apart, where our weekday tools are off-limits. Additionally, some implements are excluded as a "fence", so that we won't accidentally come to break Shabbat.

On Wednesday, we had the second interview in our Rabbis series. In the chair this week was **Rabbi Joseph Dweck**, leader of the Spanish and Portuguese community. We explored his heritage as a "Western Sephardi" (his mother's family had come to the United States in 1901), and his close relationship with Rav Ovadiya Yosef (who is also grandfather of R' Dweck's wife, Margalit). He spoke of Rav Ovadiya's formidable knowledge and powerful persona, as well as his tender, loving side, a family man who made the Charoset and his Shabbat pickles.

R' Dweck spoke of the challenges of rebranding England's most historic community as well as the pain of the controversy over his shiurim. His greatest concern was the impact on his children, particularly as the attacks became strongly personal.

If R' Dweck had to be remembered for three teachings, he nominated: 1) Have a real idea of G-d. Know what you mean when you say and use His Name. 2) Invest in your relationships; particularly with family, learn from your children and understand their perception of their world. 3) Study. Study as much as you can. "Our brain is like a Rolls Royce or Bentley, which we often use only to take us to do the daily shopping. It can be used for so much more..."

THIS WEEK'S HAFTORAH BY RABBI ANDREWS

Parshat Pekudei marks the end of the group of portions concerning the erection of the Mishkan—the portable sanctuary the B'nei Yisroel (Israelites) used in the desert. After all the pieces of the Mishkan are in place, and Moshe's (Moses') work is ended, we read about Hashem's (God's) powerful presence descending into the inner chamber of the Mishkan, the Kodesh Hakodoshim (Holy of Holies)

The Haftorah for Pekudei (also the same Haftorah for the second day of Sukkot) describes the completion of the construction of the Bayit Rishon (first Temple), under Shlomo Hamelech (King Solomon). Having brought in all the treasures and donations for the Bait HaMikdash (Temple), Shlomo gathers the elders of Israel to install the aron (ark).

That treasure is the matter of an interesting discussion amongst the commentators as the gold and silver were collected by none other than Shlomo's father, Dovid Hamelech (King David). Rashi and Radak detail two views among the Sages as to why Shlomo did not use the gold and silver in the construction itself. According to one, he foresaw the destruction of the Bait HaMikdash and did not want to subject these items to that fate.

The other suggestion is that Shlomo did not use them because he saw them as morally tainted. In his father's time, there had been a famine for three years in a row, yet Dovid did not dip into the reserve he had been building for Temple construction to alleviate the people's suffering. Shlomo could not see using gold and silver that had been kept at the expense of the pain of those in a famine for the House of God.
