‘Then you shall call out, and say, before the Lord your God, ‘An Aramean tried to destroy my father, who then went down to Egypt, and dwelt there few in number; and he became a great, strong and populous nation’ (Devarim 26,5)

This line may be familiar to us from the Pesach Seder. Here, in its original context, it is part of the declaration made by a farmer when he brought the offering of the first fruits from his fields to the Temple in Jerusalem, instilling an appreciation of his ability to farm the Land of Israel.

If you look at the Hebrew text, the meaning of the phrase we have translated as ‘An Aramean tried to destroy my father’, is ambiguous. It is the one offered by Rashi, and is also found in the Hagadah.

However, an alternative translating is ‘My father was a wondering, exiled Aramean’, which was suggested by Rashi’s grandson, Rabbi Shmuel ben Meir (Rashbam) and may seem on the face of it to refer to Avraham or perhaps to Yaakov who both moved away from Aramean lands.

Rabbi Moshe Feinstein, an outstanding rabbinic 20th century authority in Russia and New York, focuses on the first understanding, that one offered by Rashi and the Hagada, in considering the identity of this nefarious Aramean who ‘tried to destroy my father’.

The answer is none other than Lavan, Yaakov’s uncle, with whom Yaakov lived and worked for 21 years after he fled the wrath of his brother Esau (see Bereishit chapter 29). The idolatrous Lavan tried to dominate Yaakov and stifle his religious growth, but Yaakov became the first of our ancestors to flourish successfully as a religious personality while in exile, in his case by being away from his parents in the hostile surroundings of Charan, Lavan’s hometown (northern Iraq today). Rabbi Feinstein’s answer reflects a similar comment of Rashi himself earlier in the Torah. Rashi explained that the word ‘garti’ – I [Yaakov] dwelt [with Lavan] - in Bereshit 32:5 has the numerical value of 613, the number of Mitzvot (commandments) in the Torah.

This is why, explains Rabbi Feinstein, our verse about first fruits also mentions the Exodus from Egypt. Since Yaakov’s descendents were able to follow his lead, remaining faithful and flourishing Jews despite the pressures of Egypt, Yaakov’s achievement in upholding the traditions of his people in such alien circumstances paved the way for all Jews, including us.

This is a particularly relevant lesson for our times, amidst some of the challenges that the Jewish community faces, and is a stimulating thought for the current Hebrew month of Elul in the lead up to Rosh Hashanah.

Singing You're Sorry

What an amazing evening on Wednesday!

The joint pre-Selichot event with LSJS and the Shabbaton Choir set a poignant tone for the prayers we are about to begin through till Yom Kippur and hit just the right note.

Rabbi Lionel Rosenfeld and Choirmaster Stephen



Levey added their interpretations to the educational arrangement by Rabbi Dr Raphy Zarum, and our hearts were moved by young solists Rafi Posner.

One of the most fascinating expressions of Hashem's Mercy is נשא עון (Nossei Avon). Though usually translated as "forgiving iniquity", the word, נשא means to carry and is used in many connotations as bearing a burden or sin. With trademark big-screen reference, Rabbi Zarum evoked the memorable moment in "The Mission", where Jeremy Irons has



Robert de Niro haul the weapons of his past on an arduous journey and up a hill before being allowed to release them.

Such is the burden of sin. Hashem carries them with us in our state of iniquity and absorbs the burden when we are forgiven.

Selichot begin for Ashkenazim on Motzaei Shabbat at midnight, though Sephardim have been reciting them from dawn since the beginning of Ellul. Dawn is the appointed hour in the Shulchan Aruch (OC 581).

Amongst the explanations for the Ashkenazi midnight launch is that it enables us to start with song while the lingering simcha of Shabbat is ebbing away and its joy shapes our supplication with "Rina", a cry in which we appreciate the beneficence of Hashem in this world. This understanding of רנה is found in the Ralbag's Commentary (d1344) on the

verse (Melachim 1, 8:28) where King Solomon dedicates the Temple as a place where Hashem should listen to the cry and the prayer לְשִׁמְעַ אֶל הַרְנָה וְאֶל הַתְּפִלָּה.



This expression forms the refrain of the *Bemotzaei Menucha* Pizmon or Penitential Poem which we read on the first (Motzaei Shabbat) of Selichot.

The first day of Creation was Yom Rishon (Sunday), so Motzaei Shabbat represents that transitional point when the initial תהו ובהו confusion and tumult gave way to clarity and then light. It is a time of awakening into infinite potential. This should frame our mood as we step into Selichot.

It is fitting that the words of Shlomo HaMelech were his invocation as he created a space dedicated to Hashem in the physical world, a point of focus for those who come to pray; and we use them as a refrain yearning for the innocence when Hashem created all Time and Space.

While the Ibn Ezra (d1161) decried complex and ungrammatical poetry as an affront to prayer (commentary to Kohellet 5:1), the Maharal of Prague (d1609) welcomed the fluidity of song as expressive, emotive and immersive.

What a wonderful taste we had of this on Wednesday evening and thanks to all who made it so successful!

SHABBAT SPEAKER @ KINLOSS ON 28TH SEPTEMBER - JOHN MANN MP



John Mann MP was elected as Member of Parliament for Bassetlaw in June 2001. Since his time in student politics he has been vocal in his condemnation of all forms of racism and intolerance and has worked tirelessly to combat it. In the summer of 2005 he was appointed as the Chair of the All-Party Parliamentary Group against Antisemitism, supported by the Antisemitism Policy Trust. John has commissioned two major All-Party Inquiries into Antisemitism and a further inquiry into Electoral Conduct. In 2008, John established the Inter-Parliamentary Coalition for Combating Antisemitism (ICCA) which he now Chairs. In May 2009, John received the American Jewish Committee's (AJC's) Jan Karski Award in recognition of his commitment and work in fighting antisemitism. In 2010, he Chaired the Football Association's Task Force on antisemitism and Islamophobia in football.

In July 2019, John Mann was been appointed as the Government's Independent Adviser on Antisemitism in one of Theresa May's final acts as Prime Minister.

On his appointment John Mann said: "If we stay silent on the issue of antisemitism, we unwittingly allow cowardice and bigotry to speak its own repulsive language. I will continue to call out those throwing stones of hatred at Jewish people and will endeavour to give a clarion call to Government on prejudice and discrimination on this issue."

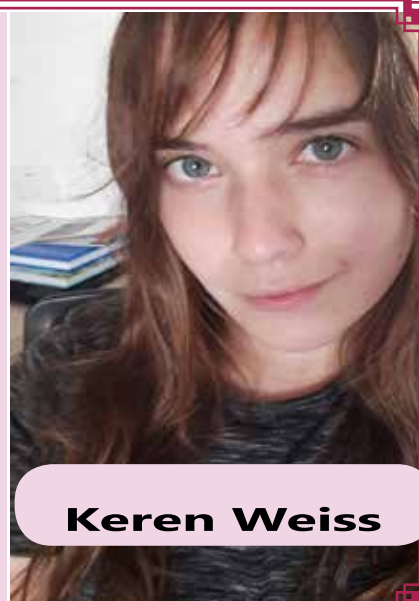
