Korach – Right out of the Blue

Parashat Korach tells of the celebrated tale of the rebellion against Moshe by his eponymous cousin. Hashem demonstrated his unequivocal support for Moshe when Korach and his followers are swallowed by a miraculously appearing pit.

Rabbinic commentary portrays Korach as both rich and wise. Chazal put the argument with Moshe into its scriptural context.

Chazal recall that at the very end of last week's Parsha we had the instruction to wear tzitzit – and to place among our fringes a strand of Techelet, a blue or turquoise dye from the marine snail known as the Chilazon (Tosefta). It is this colour which we are taught reminds us of the heavenly throne and focuses us on Hashem.

Immediately thereafter (Bemidbar 16:1), our Parsha opens - Vayikach Korach וַיִּקַּח קֹרַח. “Korach took” prompting the commentaries to ask - What did Korach take? To which they answer, he took his tzitzit.

According to the Midrash, Korach comes to Moshe and says, “See, I have here a four cornered garment. And it is all turquoise – like we are all holy. Tell me, Moshe. If I look at the garment and see all this techelet, a whole robe of techelet, of course I think about the throne of Glory. Of course, I focus on Hashem. Do you really mean to say I need to add an extra, single strand of turquoise? Look at the big picture, Moshe, your Halacha is not logical.”

Put another way, Korach suggests that petty details demean the spirituality of our Judaism. Who needs one thread, who needs something to stand out? Who needs something...? And who needs *someone* to stand out? If we are all holy, who needs a Moshe in charge?”

Moshe's response to Korach's challenge is quite enigmatic. He responds, בקר ויודע Boker veyoda – tomorrow morning... and you'll know.” Is that to be understood as an answer or a threat?

The very second Mishna in Brachot asks when we can say the morning Shema? The answer given is when daylight is sufficient that one can distinguish between the colour techelet and either white or green. They are colours which can be differentiated with sufficient light but are indistinguishable, monochrome, till dawn. The Mishna tells us that the morning Shema cannot be said until there is adequate light.

“Boker” – says Moshe. “בקר”, tomorrow in the light of day.

“Korach, you think that techelet is only a symbol - about looking at a colour and thinking about Hashem. But the symbol means much more. I look at my techelet and I ask – can I daven Shacharit yet? Is the way I wish to serve Hashem the right way? Korach, you should know that even with something as personal as prayer, we must learn to distinguish the right way and the right time.”

“Boker,” says Moshe, “daylight”. Daylight distinguishes between ideas which are confused in the dark.

Says Moshe; Tzitzit and techelet are more than idle symbols – they are about Mitzvot – about serving Hashem in the right way. It is the arrogance of Korach to simply pursue our internal assessments of what is right and wrong, spiritual or logical. Boker veyoda. בקר ויודע Hashem lets us know in the morning. We take our cue from Hashem.

Religion isn't just about imagining ourselves as godly or seeing Hashem where we choose to put Him. It is about being holy and serving Hashem in the right way. It is about making choices and decisions... fine distinctions between right and wrong.

May we choose well in all we do and how we serve.

Standing Out

Last week I attended a ceremony in Wiesbaden (just outside Frankfurt) to lay a Stolperstein (Stumbling Stone) outside the home of my great-grandfather, the composer Heinz Lewin. The ceremony was all the more beautiful as one of his songs was performed to the hundred or so gathered under the balcony of the rooms where he had lived.

Heinz's parents ran a cigarette factory, which he went on to manage, but preferred to pursue his love of music. He left Wiesbaden for Berlin, composed the definitive Tango which was taught in Krolle Dance Academy, a number of operettas and then film scores. It is not clear if he went to Hollywood, but his music was used, occasionally in MGM English language remakes of German films.

We know that Heinz was imprisoned in the Septfonds camp in France, and my mother was fortunate enough to meet an inmate who remembered him and the concerts that he composed for and presented there. He was transported to Auschwitz on 9th September 1942. Thereafter there is no record.

In 1933 Wiesbaden had a Jewish community of 2,700. In the elections of that year, the Nazi party obtained a particularly strong result. The cemetery has graves through till April 1942, when the last of the frail population died, some at their own hands, before the very last were transported to their deaths. Today, cutting through the middle of the beautiful "chocolate box" town, a large concrete wall bears the names of the 1507 Jewish souls who perished in the Shoah.



A wall is a glaring memorial. Standing below the site of the old synagogue, which was destroyed on Kiristallnacht, it is a stark constant admonition to Wiesbaden of its complicity in Nazi brutality. There is nothing much to make any pedestrian walk on its side of the road. This might be why the explanation is across the road, where there is footfall. The individual names are statistical elements, lost in the big picture.

The Stolperstein, which was laid in Heinz's memory is a flat



brass-plated cobble. It is just outside the door of Heinz's home at 2 Luisenplatz, a place my grandfather remembered from his visits. The Luisenplatz is a large and beautiful tree-lined square, containing the memorials to those who fell in the Battle of Waterloo, and a local regiment in WW1.

At 10 centimeters square, the Stolperstein is dwarfed by the grandeur around it; and yet, because it is brass and carries a name, Heinz Lewin is prominent, a stand-out feature which will be noticed by those who walk down the street or visit the adjacent café or dentist. The wall is a tribute to the many. The

stone is how we personalise the memory. "Heinz lived here. Heinz walked here. Just here is where we should falter in our footsteps and remember the damage done by evil people, and those who stood by."

As a Parasha, Korach enjoins us to consider both literally and figuratively where we stand.



Confronting Moshe were different factions and different motivations driving the rebels. Those from the first-born Tribe of Reuben felt that they had been supplanted by the Cohanim and the Levites. That was also a shift from the power of a secular elite to the power of the spiritual. Korach, himself, was a Levite. Wherein his grievance? His coterie saw a hierarchy of Cohanim then Levites. Even amongst the privileged, they could not accept the honour of distinguished service. What mattered, only, was the chance to lead.

Moshe admonishes them that they should consider quite carefully where they stand. Korach and co were swallowed by the earth which opened and then closed around them as they formed their assembly of evil. Those who stood for themselves and for schism perished in a localised plague, from which they could have stepped away. There was no safety in numbers.

There is a discussion whether the Possuk "Korach assembled the entire assembly against them..." (Bemidbar 16:19) refers to just his 250 immediate followers from the preceding verses (Ralbag) or all of Israel (Rabbeinu Bachye), who, without being overtly militant or rebellious, provided emotional or background succor to the principals. Until they declared themselves as separate from the evil, according to the latter opinion at least, they were to some extent complicit.

Today there is increased concern as issue-based factions align themselves against authority. There is a measured increase in hate politics, manifested in anti-semitism, and also directed against other groups. Often couched as arguments of reason, the hatred is directed at powerful lobbies or ethnicities/religions/cultures who don't integrate and espouse the right values.

Without (chas veshalom) denigrating the memorial, when we see the other as a mass monument on a wall, sometimes that reinforces the imagined magnitude arrayed across from us. What we need is stumbling stones in our lives, focusing us on the individuals who are impacted by our actions or inactions. Where do we stand and on whom do we step as we go?
