Weighing in on Holiness

The root *Kadosh* קדוש which translates as “holy” appears in many guises throughout the Torah and Halachic writing. We are familiar with the rituals of Kiddush, Kaddish and Kedusha. Martyrs, who are called *Kadoshim* die *Al Pi Kiddush Hashem*, in the sanctification of God’s Name. The word *Kadesha*, is used euphemistically when Yehuda encounters Tamar in the guise of a harlot (Bereshit 38:21). The use of an antonym is explained as the Torah trying to use לשון נקי polite language to condition us against filling our mouths and minds with filthy expression. Sources alternatively explain that religious prostitutes were key features of some cults. Mostly, though, holiness is suggestive of aethereal piety.

Ramban explains the instruction קדשים תהיו “You shall be Holy” at the beginning of our Parasha (Vayikra 16:2) to mean פרושים תהיו “You shall be separate” from sin and an excess, while adhering to Godly ways. The word פרושים *Perushim* is the Ivrit for (and origin of) “Pharisee”.

The Parasha deals with holiness in very tangible terms; correct sacrificial procedure, justice and charity, avoiding gossip, not harbouring malicious or vengeful thoughts, statutes against mixed species, idolatry, witchcraft and a listing of prohibited relationships. In all, there are 51 of the 613 mitzvot in Parashat Kedoshim (and many additional mitzvah instructions which are not counted among the 613). Given its brevity, it has the densest *mitzvah to possuk* ratio of all 54 Parshiyot.

Tucked at the end of a paragraph dealing with our relationships with strangers and converts are two mitzvot concerning weights and measures (20:35-36). We are instructed that as a part of not being unjust, all weights and measures should be used correctly and also that they must be properly calibrated. There should be no heavy fingers on the scales, nor, states Rashi, should one store weights in salt, which gradually erodes them. Why are these verses placed in this context? This conduct is oppressive of the vulnerable or easily deceived and Hashem liberated us from oppression to be Holy, not oppressors.

Much later in the Torah, unjust weights and measures reappear in a listing of laws for when we come into the Land of Israel (Devarim 25:13). They are preceded by the mitzvah of Pikuach nefesh to save the pursuer from his pursuer, even at the expense of the latter’s life and followed by the mitzvah to remember Amalek, who ambushed us. Sandwiched between these matching mitzvot is the prohibition of even owning inaccurate scales or weights (irrespective of any intention to abuse them.) What is the rationale for this mitzvah to appear where it does and not back in Vayikra?

The Gemarra (Bava Batra 89b) emphasises the extent of the prohibition on keeping false measures at home – they should not even be used as toilet seat. There is something inherently wrong in giving space to false representations of what should be true. Having them in the house dignifies them and might plant a seed of deceptive intent in our minds. Having a false measure is embedding the capacity for us to become ambushed by evil.

Whereas the instruction in Kedoshim addressed our respect for the other, this is about our care for ourselves. When we come to the new land, we and our houses must be clean from deception and graft.

Incidentally, real £2 are not magnetic, but we’re accumulating quite a collection of dodgy ones from the Tzeddaka boxes each week! It is quite possible that these numismatic curios are not allowed as collectibles under Devarim 25:13. It is absolutely certain that they demonstrate how easily one can short-change the unsuspecting poor!



While Holiness is ultimately about aspiring to emulating Hashem through elevated conduct, it begins with the truth and sincerity in our day to day dealings with each other and our sincerity in cherishing truth at home.

Yom HaAtzmaut

It was a pleasure as always to mark Yom HaZikaron and begin the celebration of Yom HaAtzmaut with Bnei Akiva. For BA UK this is their 80th year. Hannah Reuben, the Mazkira, remembered the late Arie Handler, who as an émigré from Germany in the '30s



was one of the founders of Bnei Akiva. On his passing in 2011, Arie was the last living person who had attended Independence Hall as Ben Gurion's guest

for the Declaration of Independence in May '48.

In this week's Parasha of Kedoshim we are told that "when you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not reap the very corners of the field, nor gather the gleanings of the harvest." Like the edges of the vineyard and the fallen fruit from the trees, these are to be left for the poor and the stranger.

When Bnei Yisrael were given this instruction, they were wandering in a wilderness. They had just emerged from backbreaking slavery. They had no food of their own – were dependent on miraculous welfare – yet Hashem tells them "Have faith and know.... You will have a land. You will farm your land. And in that land, you will look after your own poor – you will even offer hospitality to strangers."

From Avraham through Moshe, Israel was the chance to dream... More than that, there was a duty to dream, to have faith that Hashem would deliver the impossible. And within that dream, even before we could take home our harvest, there was a responsibility to give and sustain others.

Yom HaAtzmaut celebrates a remarkable anniversary.

What was the impossible dream for our parents and grandparents is our blessed reality. A thriving democracy of around 9 million souls, a country that is a world leader in technology, in the knowledge economy, in agricultural development, disaster relief, in search and rescue.

A country that dreams, out-of-this-world dreams, touching down on the moon. 3D printing an entire heart replete with cells, blood vessels, ventricles and chambers incorporating human tissue. From the microscopic to the cosmic, Israel is a force for good in our world. We are so proud of our country – and all

those who give of their lives and who have given their lives to make it so.



How tragic that Israeli lives continue to be lost at our borders and in our cities, by those who would deny us security or peace. Tonight we add to the Yom Hazikaron memorial roll, Moshe Agadi, a father of four from Ashkelon, Ziad Alhamamda, also from Ashkelon, Moshe Feder from Kfar Saba, and Pinchas Prezuazman from Ashdod.

How tragic, also, that the vilification and demonization of Israel continues to find support... even in this country and even in our Parliament. Sometimes by those who are overtly hostile, sometimes by those who disparage Israel's advocates – sometimes by those who fail to call out anti-Semitism when it is manifest... But always by people who pretend that they deplore racism and bigotry in all its forms.

We will not be cowed. For ours is a noble and godly dream.

Our dream has always been about outreach. When we come to the Land, we share its produce and expand the ambit of Kedusha. Torat Eretz Yisrael is our most authentic fruit.

It is with pride that I extend again an invitation to join us for our scholars in residence next Shabbat and on Sunday 18th when we mark the remarkable scholarship of our Zionist yeshivot in our 4th Day of Inspiration here at Kinloss.

This year I am particularly delighted that we will be honoured with a keynote address by Chief Rabbi Mirvis.

With Mizrachi, our partners in our vision, we invite you to spend as little as an hour or as long as a full day with fellow dreamers. I guarantee that you will leave excited and enriched – and that the event will be enhanced, a better day for you having attended.
