A Fitting Icon for the Jewish People – Leora and Harry Salter

The beginning of Parshat Behaalotecha explores the symbolism of the Menorah. In modern-day concept, the state of Israel has adopted the Menorah as one of the symbols and icons that helps stitch the Jewish history to our legacy, our past and our heritage. It appears on the shekel and in front of the Knesset. The symbols and icons use the great continuity to the Jewish history.

There is a Midrash highlighting different aspects of the attempted renewal. On the one hand the Midrash asks why Hashem instructs us to light the menorah in the Beit HaMikdash. Surely Hashem is the source of light and His presence should be enough to radiate that? So, what's the symbolism, the function or the message to the Jewish people about lighting the menorah?

It says in this week's Parasha (8,2):

דַּבֵּר אֶל־אַהֲרֹן וְאָמַרְתָּ אֵלָיו בְּהַעֲלֹתְךָ אֶת־הַנֵּרוֹת אֶל־מִוֶּלֶכְךָ הַמְּנוּחָה יָאִירוּ שִׁבְעַת הַנֵּרוֹת:

‘Speak to Aaron and say to him, “When you mount the lamps, let the seven lamps give light at the front of the lampstand.”’

Chazal were very sensitive to the word ‘Behaalotecha,’ because this passage in the Torah is repeated elsewhere but this is a very powerful phrase. It's not natural. Normally you would find something along the lines of ‘lehadlik et hanerot’ etc. It's that word that bears much of the message and the meaning of this Midrash. So, the Midrash begins with Am Yisrael telling Hashem that there is no reason for us to create light, you Hashem reside in the light. Yet you tell us to light the menorah? Hashem replies to them that of course I don't need your light, but I want you to provide light in the same way that I do. That would suggest some aspect of imitating Hashem but presumably imitating Hashem must have some function, some consequence. We don't just imitate Hashem.

One statement of the Midrash, the first thrust of the Midrash is that in order to raise the Jewish people's dignity, their presence and prestige in the international community, the gentile nation should see not just the lighting of a candelabra but a divine activity and the reciprocity between Hashem providing light and our provision of light. We are radiant in the same way that Hashem is and this is ‘Behaalotecha et Hanerot’ – we raise the flicker of these flames and by raising these flames our prestige rises amongst the national community.

The Menorah seems a very fitting icon for Israel because one of the thrusts in creating a state and advancing a state is because we feel that we are the representatives of Hashem. The rise of the Jewish people and the rise of a state is a Kiddush Hashem and represents Hashem's presence in this world. The drama of our prestige amongst the nations being associated with our relationship with Hashem typified by the menorah is very much the dynamic of the modern state of Israel and is very resonant that the menorah is adopted as part of this whole process.

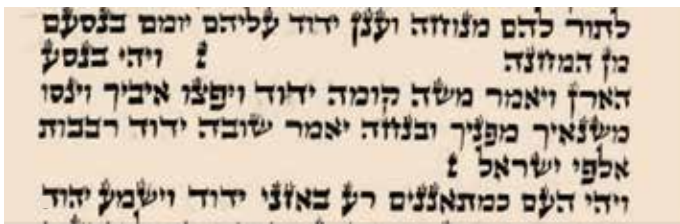
A Whole Book in Parentheses



We know that there are Five Books of Moses. However, within Parashat Behaalotecha, there is an unusual passage of Torah text; Bemidbar 10 35,36 describing the Ark of the Covenant being lifted to decamp and then placed to encamp in a new site.

וַיְהִי בִּבְסֻעַ הָאָרֶן וַיֹּאמֶר מֹשֶׁה קוּמָה יְדֹד וַיִּפְּצוּ אֲבִיבִיךָ וַיִּנְסוּ
מִשְׁנֵאִיךָ מִפְּנֶיךָ: וּבִנְחָה יֹאמֶר שׁוּבָה יְדֹד רַבְבוֹת אֲלֶיךָ יִשְׂרָאֵל: ַ

These two verses are “bracketed” in the Torah by the inverted letter Nun and described as a Book of its own or a Book within a Book.



ויהי בנסוע הארון. נקוד עליו מלמעלה ומלמטה, מפני שלא היה זה ממקומו. רבי אומר: מפני שהוא ספר בעצמו.

“When the Ark would journey... These verses are signed above and below in order to demonstrate that they are out of their correct place. Rabbi taught, they are a book in their own right.” (Sifrei Bemidbar 84, 1)

The Talmud (Shabbat 115b) cites Rav Huna Bar Haluv in discussion with Rav Nachman whether a Sefer Torah that is possul can be rescued from a fire on Shabbat. Based on this “book” / these verses, he holds that a Sefer Torah retains its sanctity if it contains 85 kosher properly written, sequential letters.

The two verses are very familiar. Fittingly, the first is used as we open the Aron Kodesh to remove the Torah Scroll before leining; the second, as we return the Scroll to its place on completion.

The “book within a book” talking about decamping and setting up camp separates the narrative of Exodus/Sinai/Mishkan/Camp from the succession of tragic events and challenges to authority which lead into and continue through the forty years of wandering in the wilderness.

R’ Shimshon Rafael Hirsch explains that these two expressions of Moshe teach us that every landmark, departure or arrival, whether for the better or worse should give us pause to connect with Hashem – to drive away adversity and bless our nation with tranquility. Further, our overarching benchmark should not be our personal performance, but the progression of Torah.

Halacha acknowledges/enshrines this in the laws of Sifrei Torah. The Shulchan Aruch (Yoreh Deah 282, 2) instructs, הרואה ס"ת כשהוא מהלך when a Torah Scroll passes by, all who see it must stand (and should face it) until it has come to its resting place.

This is not merely guidance for the service and the Sefer Torah that is being used. It applies equally, for example, to a Sefer Torah being taken to or returned from another service, elsewhere in the premises.

Standing during the leining itself is not a halacha. Some Rishonim, (Mordechai, Shabbat 222) attribute the origin to Ezra who stood for the reading (Nechemia 8,4). However, Rav Amram Gaon (Seder Rav Amram 2, 25) says that this is not the source, nor is it a requirement. He rules that the nation “standing” for the Torah means being silent and attentive. The Mishna Berura states that it is worthy to stand (OC 146:4) but the Vilna Gaon, that one should sit. This is only a concern for Ashkenazim. Sephardim follow the Arizal and sit for Kriat HaTorah.

Many Poskim address the custom to stand for certain passages (e.g. the Ten Commandments) with the reservation that it suggests that some pessukim are more significant than others. Accordingly, those who are seated always try to stand a couple of verses early.

The Shulchan Aruch notes that there are exceptions to requirement to stand before a Sefer Torah in motion. One such case (YD 282, 3) is when one is transporting a Sefer Torah on one’s donkey. (If you haven’t seen the “Frisco Kid”, it is a great Torah trigger film and this week’s homework!) In such a case, the rider will necessarily be seated. The Torah Scroll should not be placed on the back of the beast, like luggage behind the rider – but held upright against his/her heart.

There is a constant challenge in shuls. We want to be welcoming and for everyone to feel comfortable. However, it is important that reverence for sacred objects and sacred spaces is not diminished. On one side, as leaders, educators and facilitators, we aim to **bring** Torah to the people. On the other, it is our mission to **raise** our families and our nation to the Torah.
