D'VAR TORAH BY RABBI LAITNER

What's in a name?

"And Moses said to the Children of Israel: See, God has called by name, Betzalel the son of Uri, the son of Chur, from the tribe of Judah. And has filled him with the spirit of God, with wisdom, discernment and knowledge, and every creativity" (Shemot 35:30-31)

Betzalel, after whom the famous art school in Jerusalem was founded, is given special creative talents which the commentators define for us. How did his name come about?

As the commentary of Kli Yakar (Rabbi Ephraim Shlomo, c.1550–1619) explains, Betzalel means, "in the shadow of God"; the name was chosen on the basis of the special skills with which Betzalel was blessed.

Betzalel was the 'architect' of the Mishkan (Tabernacle), a place where God's Presence rested. Kli Yakar continues that the Shechina (God's Presence) is linked to a shadow, and thus Betzalel is aptly named to construct the Mishkan.

This seems somewhat prophetic and causes Rabbi Moshe Feinstein (a great 20th century rabbinic figure in Russia and America) to ask how we would know how to give an infant child an appropriate name.

Rabbi Feinstein answers that it appears God gives people special inspiration which allows them, should they choose to do so, to pick an appropriate name which says something about the character of the person being named.

This answer emphasises that all of the attributes which we have can be harnessed in the service of God since our names reflect attributes that we may possess. Our Sidra has a particular focus on artistic and architectural attributes. Gold, for instance, is one of the themes of the Book of Shemot. It can be used for decorating the Mishkan in its finery, or it can be used for a golden calf. The same seems to apply to our personal attributes as humans. We just need to choose wisely!

A Weight of Silver

Shabbat Shekalim is the first of the four special Shabbatot which fall around Purim (Shekalim, Zachor, Parah and HaChodesh). Shekalim is normally read before, and sometimes on, Rosh Chodesh Adar (Adar Sheini in a leap year). The four Shabbatot are identified in the Talmud (Megilla 29).

Shekalim reminds us of the obligation to bring the Half-Shekel **מחצית השקל** used to purchase communal offerings. In Temple times, on the first of Adar, they would make a public announcement and send out messengers to raise the half Shekel levy. It is also symbolic that the reading of Shekalim for the Temple should precede the reading of Haman's Shekalim in the Megilla.

The Shekel first appears in Tanach in the story of Avraham's purchase of the Cave of Machpela (Bereishit 23,16) where he pays 400 Shekel-Kesef (**ארבע מאה שקל**-) to Ephron the Hittite. Though reference to currency is found here and in the Joseph story (sale of Yosef to the slavery for **עשרים כסף**, return of the brothers' money in their sacks etc), this is a pre-coinage era. Avraham lived c2000 BCE. The word shekel means weight. Avraham would have transferred a measure of silver, not shiny minted currency.

The earliest known coins we know are from c650 BCE, from Lydia (ancient Greece/Turkey). This is around the time of King Josiah and the prophet Jeremiah. The earliest "Jewish coin" (now in the Israel Museum) is

is considered to be a silver Drachm from about the 5th century BCE. Roughly contemporaneous with the return from Babylon and the beginning of the Second Temple, it is from the Persian era, and contains the word "Judea" in Aramaic.

Coins from the 4th Century BCE (Alexander the Great) through the Bar Kochba revolt 132-5 CE become increasingly prevalent.

Ancient currency had intrinsic worth. Unlike today, the precious metal did not represent a greater value – it was worth its weight in copper, silver or gold. Care was taken to distinguish between coins of the same name but different weights (true values), from different regimes or eras. "Tyrian money" (**כסף צורי**) is the base for most Torah valuations. Most reckonings of money in the Mishna and Talmud use "State Money" (**כסף מדינה**)

which uses the same denomination names, but denominations are worth 1/8 of their Tyrian equivalent.



The Biblical Gera **גרה** (Shemot 30:13) was 1/20 of the Shekel HaKodesh used for the census and the Chetzi HaShekel referenced in the beginning of last week's Parasha and this week's Shabbat Shekalim Maftir. In the Second Temple period, there was a 20% devaluation. The Shekel was revalued 24 Gera. The Gera was renamed the Maah **מעה** and the Shekel HaKodesh became the Selah **סלע**.

As exactly a half shekel needed to be given per person, if someone wanted to exchange a single coin into two half Shekels (or even wanted

to pay for two people at once), a small premium of one Maah, known as the Kalbon **קלבון** became payable (Bava Metzia 61b).

The lowest currency value is the Peruta **פרוטה** which is a copper coin with the value of half a barleycorn's weight of silver. (Think of the English expression "peppercorn rent"). One Peruta corresponds to 24mg of silver. The Rabbinic Shekel is 384 Perutot, or 9.216 grams of pure silver. That's £5.35 at Wednesday lunchtime.

A zuz **זוז** is a quarter shekel – so whether you are dad buying a kid for Pesach for two zuzim or a congregant paying your half shekel **מחצית השקל**, it's £2.67 plus a Kalbon of 53p unless you have the exact change!

In a Responsum of R' Moshe Feinstein (EH4:91), written in 1980 concerning the 200 Zekukim Kesef value of a Ketuba, he declared it to be the equivalent of 45.5Kg of silver, which he said represented one year's maintenance.

1980 was a bad year for silver. It was valued at \$57 per Troy ounce in January and crashed to \$10.20 per Troy ounce in March when the Hunt Brothers, Nelson and William could not meet their debts and had to sell their accumulated silver in a hurry. Apparently, they owned 200 million ounces (5.67 million Kilos) of silver, which was half the world's deliverable supply!

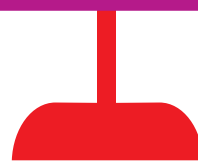
