Minding the Gap

Parashat Vayetze opens with one of the Torah’s most visual scenes. As, Yaakov is fleeing from his brother, Eisav, to Haran, he spends a night in the desert. There, he dreams of a ladder climbing to heaven, with angels ascending and descending. On awaking, he makes the observation. **אָכֵן יֵשׁ יְהוָה בַּמָּקוֹם הַזֶּה וְאֲנֹכִי לֹא יָדַעְתִּי** : “Surely Hashem is in this place and I hadn’t known it.”

There is plenty of Rabbinic debate over this line. There is the concern that Yaakov, with all his piety, may have been unaware that Hashem was everywhere. Could this be??? Surely he knew!

There is also a debate over where the “this place” was. Many Midrashim place it on Mount Moriah, the site of the binding of Isaac and later, the Temple. However, Yaakov calls this place Beth El, which we know is to north of Jerusalem. He had been heading northwards from Beer Sheva and he must have passed Mount Moriah on the way.

So where did Yaakov spend that night and dedicate his altar?

The Midrashim which contend with the geography of it all have the ladder slanting – its foot in Beer Sheva, where he started; its midpoint over Jerusalem and the head – the entrance to heaven right above Yaakov’s resting place in Beth El.

Some also suggest that the earth moved or bridged Beth El with Jerusalem to make them physically one and this connection topographically possible. In deconstructing the verse, I think there is an aspect to the image of the ladder which should neither be missed nor dismissed. The Torah so far has presented a Hashem up in heaven and humans down on earth. When mankind and Hashem interact, be it through dialogue or through angels, Hashem’s voice booms from the heavens or the angels are wandering on earth.

So far, heaven & earth have been presented as two separated entities – a little like a child’s drawing with green grass and trees at the foot of the paper, a blue sky with the sun and clouds at the top of the paper and a hefty patch of white paper separating the two.



Our ladder – Yaakov’s ladder – is the first indication that the two connect. Yaakov knew that Hashem was in the heavens. Yaakov knew that Hashem was to be found on earth. Yaakov knew that Hashem was there in Beer Sheva... and in Jerusalem... and in Bet El. But there was something different that Yaakov appreciated when he awoke from his vision. Now, Yaakov knew that heaven and earth were bridged.

Moreover, a channel to Hashem existed in that void. There was an acknowledgement of Godliness in the white space – in the in between.

Often, we divide up our own lives a little like Yaakov’s first impression – a little like a child’s picture. We have pockets of Godly life, what we eat, the Shabbat and festive rituals, the time we spend in shul – but in our work, in our leisure, our relationships and friendships we are different selves.

True spiritual living isn’t apportioning moments for me and moments for Hashem – it’s making sure that there are no Hashem free gaps in anything we do. We could do that by running around and filling in the blanks one patch at a time. What we learn from Parshat Vayetze is the concept of Dveikut – connecting ourselves with Hashem BaShamayim with the bridging bond – and then there are no blanks in our lives – at all.

Kinloss trip to Lodz

From beginning to end, the Kinloss trip to Lodz introduced us to social and moral tensions.

We began in the Jewish cemetery at the grave of R' Eliyahu Chaim Meisel (1821-1912), who had been Rabbi of the recently established industrial city of Lodz from the time when it had a population of 10,000 Jews through to his death when it had 160,000 (about a third of the total population.) R' Meisel, named Eliyahu after the Vilna Gaon, and Chaim after R' Chaim Volodziner, was a genius, reputedly recognised as a prodigy by the age of nine and attaining semicha from the Volodzin Yeshiva aged 13! As Rabbi, he championed the poor, their welfare and education. Many stories attest to his energy and mettle, raising funds for schools and



breaking into the Russian army camp to make Seder for 2,000 Jewish soldiers who hadn't been released for Yom

Meisel's comparatively modest grave is to be contrasted with the mausoleum for R' Israel Posnanski (1833-1900), the textile magnate and one of his wealthy patrons.



Beyond, the cemetery which survived the war as it fell within a part of the ghetto, contains a huge field with 43,000 unmarked graves of those who perished in the ghetto from disease, starvation, suicide etc (aside from the hundred thousand plus transported from Lodz to extermination in Chelmno).

The ghetto is famous for one of Jewish history's most challenging characters, Chaim Rumkowski (1877-1944).

Rumkowski was appointed head of the Lodz Judenrat (Jewish Ghetto Council) and maintained an uncomfortably close relationship with the Nazi leadership. He ensured the smooth running of the ghetto, but lived a privileged life within it. He represented himself as the ghetto saviour – and unlike the other ghettos which were liquidated, the Lodz ghetto lasted with almost thousands, till the Russians were at the edge of the city.

Rumkowski collaborated in the ghetto deportations and in Sept 1942 delivered a terrible address urging the population



to "give me your children"... "Give me these sick people, and perhaps it will be possible to save the healthy in their place." I know how precious each one of the sick is in his home, and particularly among Jews. But at a time of such decrees one must weigh up and measure who should be saved, who can be saved and who may be saved."

The 150,000 – 200,000 who perished in Chelmno were mostly gassed 70-100 at a time, packed into the back of three furniture trucks, converted so that the exhaust fumes were diverted into the sealed cargo area.

Rumkowski, himself, died in Auschwitz. It is not clear if he was gassed or killed by angry Sonderkommando inmates who recognised him.

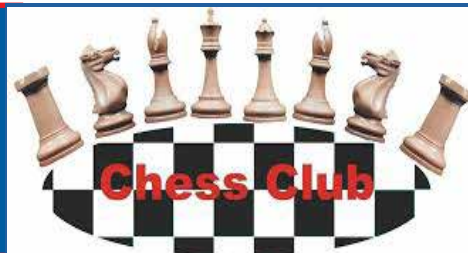
