The parsha last week of Teruma gave precise instructions regarding the construction of the Mishkan (Tabernacle), the portable sanctuary used in the desert. In addition to the structure, we were also given guidance for its various accoutrements such as the Aron (Ark), the Shulchan (Table for the showbreads), and the Menora.

In this week's portion, we round out the paraphernalia with instructions to build the Mizbeach Haketoret (incense alter). Many m'forshim (commentators) ask, "why is this item not listed alongside the three mentioned above?". This question is only strengthened when we read of their actual construction in Parshat Vayakhel; all four objects are listed together. Its omission in last week's portion suggests that its character and status differs from the other three.

The Ibn Ezra (11th century) asks this question and offers the following answer. The Mishkan was more than just a location to offer sacrifices. Instead, he sees it as a house for God and, as such, required furnishings unrelated to korbanot.

In Teruma, the Torah is recording those items (Ark, Table, and Menora) which characterise a dwelling from which "The divine glory never departed". The command "Make me a sanctuary so that I dwell among them" (Shmot 25:1) implies such a residence. The Mizbeach Haketoret, however, is listed separately in this week's portion because it is a functional object which made it possible for the Cohanim (priests) to burn incense daily. Its purpose was practical and did not contribute to the metaphor of a Bayit (home).

This, however, only raises the obvious follow-up question, why does God need a home?

The Midrash (Shemot Rabbah) explains that the Mishkan was a concession to our need for a physical place to meet God:

"He said to them, 'you are flesh and blood and need a home with a Menora for light and a table for food. I do not need them as I do not eat nor require light. However, if you insist, make what you propose, but, make it as I prescribe it'."

Rabbi Isaac Bernstein writes that every equation is reversible. If the Mishkan can be a home, so too can every home be a Mishkan. We can also welcome God in our houses by instilling Godliness and spirituality in our conduct and home-lives.

The Rabbi Writes

It was a great shame that Chazan Jonny Turgel was unwell and that we needed to cancel the “Dreams of a Nation” event last Monday.

The Shabbat afternoon shiur by our visiting scholar Rabbi Jonathan Ziring was truly a tour de force as he explored halachic aspects of social media. Aside from questions of Lashon Hara, privacy, confidentiality and disclosure, R’ Ziring explored the halachic ramifications of owning and sharing information, the peddling of personal and metadata by the platforms, which then influence the products we are offered and the news to which we are exposed.

Though we are exposed to unprecedented volumes of data, online we experience a curated world and risk deluding ourselves into believing “WYSIATI”, what you see is all there is.

We looked at the weaponising of information, whether or not naming and shaming (eg Gett refusers) online was the same as posting a cherem on a street-corner, denouncing from the pulpit or in a newspaper ad. Whereas the latter all become forgotten or yesterday’s news, an online denunciation becomes part of a digital record, possibly accessible years later. We might justify that when we assume the moral high ground, but considerable harm can be wrought by malicious uploads to Youtube etc, which can stalk a hapless victim across both decades and continents.

On Sunday morning I hosted the “Monthly Munch” in the Beth Midrash after the 8.15 Shacharit. The Munch is open to upcoming Bar & Bat Mitzvahs with a parent. In the spirit of Adar we looked at the idea of Simcha in Judaism. There are many different references to happiness and joy in Tanach and in Rabbinic writings. We are directed to serve Hashem in joy בְּשִׂמְחָה עֲבַדְתָּ אֱתֵיךָ (Psalm 100, 2), to celebrate our festivals וְשִׂמְחַת בְּחַגְךָ (Devarim 16, 14) and indeed that we shall be punished for failing in happiness (Devarim 28, 45-47).

The Talmudic injunction to diminish our happiness in Av and to raise it in Adar כָּשֶׁם שֶׁמִּשְׁנֹכֵס אֶב מִמַּעֲטִין

בְּשִׂמְחָה - כִּךְ מִשְׁנֹכֵס אֶדֶר מִרְבִּין בְּשִׂמְחָה (Taanit 29a) assumes the elevation and lowering of a baseline of happiness – we should normally be somewhat happy, rather than in an emotional neutral gear of neither happy nor sad. We looked at the many synonyms for happiness and joy, radiance, jubilation etc (there are several in the Tanach). We often encounter Ashrei אֲשֶׁר־ happy is the person who doesn’t walk in the counsel of the ungodly, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of the scornful (Tehillim 1, 1). Happy are those who dwell in your house (Tehillim 84,4). Happiness is about place and purpose. It is also a foundation for healthy relationships.

This Monday evening the Beth Midrash programme resumes with Rabbi Andrews. In my Monday shiur at Mark and Eleanor’s house (contact office for details) we shall be looking at the halachot of Bread and Milk; do we need to only consume Chalav Yisrael? to what extent is it necessary or preferable to buy hechshered rather than “approved”? On Wednesday at my Lunch & Learn shiur we will look at the laws of taking medication on Shabbat.

Please do sign up for the Shabbat UK luncheon (March 2nd). Our scholar in residence for the Shabbat is Rabbi YY Rubenstein and he will be joined at the lunch programme by Rabbi Cobi Ebrahimoff. Please sign up for the Challah make on 26th February with “Challa Mummy” Allegra Benitah. Also, make a note in your diary to join me on Weds 27th Feb when I shall be interviewing Dayan Gelley, Rosh of the London Beth Din on his influences, inspirations, on the role of the Beth Din and what he sees as the challenges of our time.

THIS WEEK'S HAFTORAH BY RABBI ANDREWS

This week's Haftorah, Yichezkel (Ezekiel) 43:10-27, comes in the middle of a much longer discussion. The prophet is in the midst of a lengthy description of a Temple. It is not clear whether his prophecy is regarding the second or the third temple. However, being as his descriptions did not reflect the Second Temple, it stands to reason that he was speaking about the Third.

In the portion read as the Haftorah, the parallel to the parsha would seem to be in its descriptions of the dedication ceremony for the newly constructed Bet Hamikdash. Indeed, we discuss at great length its layout, exits, entrances, floor plan, and all the relevant laws about its construction.

Although this should be a comforting prophesy, God indicates that these details should make the people of Israel feel ashamed of their sins. Pairing rebuke with words of comfort is a frequent subject in Yichezkel. In this context, the criticism seems intended to motivate positive action-repentance.

The latter half of the Haftorah focuses on the Mizbeach (altar). This he describes in detail, from top to bottom. When this altar is erected, Hashem tells the prophet that a complex purifying process must be initiated. After these rites are performed, God promises: "I will extend My favour to you" (43:27).
