My Father's favourite mitzvah - Chazan Eli

This past Thursday I commemorated the sixth yahrzeit of my father, R' Mordechai Tzvi ben Yosef Chaim obm. It is no coincidence that this week's Torah Portion, Ki-Teitzei, is the portion that mentions one of my father's favourite mitzvot. Among the 74 mitzvot mentioned this week, is the mitzvah of שלוח הקן. The verse reads: 'If you come across a bird's nest on a tree or upon the ground, containing chicks or eggs, and the mother bird is roosting upon the chicks or upon the eggs, then you must not take the mother along with the young. You shall surely send away the mother and only then take the young, *in order that it might be good for you and so that you shall merit length of days*' (Devarim 22:6-7). If one finds a nest and wishes to take the chicks or eggs, one must first send the mother-bird away, before the chicks or eggs are taken.

This is a perplexing mitzvah and there are many Talmudic discussions about it. According to the Tosafos Yom Tov (1579 – 1654), Berachot 5:3, a mitzvah is a Divine decree, there are numerous levels to mitzvot and mitzvot cannot be *limited* to our own understanding. Some 'partial explanations' follow. Maimonides (1135-1204) writes that the reason for this mitzvah is to spare the mother bird the pain of seeing her eggs being taken. Nachmanides (1195-1270), explains that the Torah wishes to train us in compassion, by behaving compassionately we internalise the character trait of compassion. Sefer Hachinuch (a discussion of the 613 mitzvot, written anonymously in the 13th century) suggests that the reason for the mitzvah is concern for the species, if we took the mother bird together with her eggs the species would die out. By sending away the mother bird we express our concern for the longevity of the species, allowing the bird to return and lay more eggs.

Regarding this mitzvah the Torah specifies that the reward is a long life. The only other mitzvah in the Torah that mentions this specific reward is honouring one's parents. Why are we rewarded with long life for this puzzling Mitzvah? Rashi (1040 – 1105) explains that the Torah is teaching us that if for such an 'easy' mitzvah we are given this huge reward, how much more will we be rewarded for mitzvot that take more time, effort and commitment. The Ibn Ezra (1089 – 1164) explains that the verse is enumerating two rewards, 'it will be good for you' *and* 'you shall merit length of days'. He explains that because we act with compassion for the mother bird, G-d will act compassionately towards us. רחמנות, compassion, means acting kindly, without considering where the person we are showing kindness to is 'deserving' or not, rather we act out of the goodness of our heart without judgement. The reward for acting compassionately is that G-d will be good to us and give us more than we actually deserve. On Rosh Hashana, after the shofar is blown we say **אב רחמינו כרחם אב**..... היום הרת עולם. **על בנים** - we plead with G-d to 'have mercy on us as a father has mercy on his children'. We pray that G-d should act mercifully even when we are not deserving. Moreover, the Ibn Ezra explains, because we did not take away the bird, allowing the species to continue, we are rewarded accordingly ie with long life.

The Midrash lists additional rewards for this mitzvah; marriage, children, and a new home (Midrash, Devarim Rabbah 6:6-7, Yalkut Shimoni 930). Sefer Hachinuch explains that since a person is careful to preserve G-d's species through this mitzvah, G-d blesses them with children. For this reason, my father obm, would help couples who were not blessed with children, do this special mitzvah. As he became known for doing this mitzvah, people would often tell him if they happened to find a nest, and he would rush to do the mitzvah with people who were waiting to be blessed with children. In fact, there is a shelf in my father's study full of interesting eggs of all different shapes, sizes and colours. My father was passionate about Torah and mitzvot and loved helping people in any way he could, spending hours lending a listening ear and words of encouragement or advice to people going through difficult times. He would share his love for G-d and the Torah with others, Jew or non-Jew, with warmth and humour, wherever he was. He didn't want anyone to miss out on a chance to do a Mitzvah and connect with our Creator. At least one of our shul members can attest that he was busy sharing mitzvot with the doctors even during his last days in the hospital! My father was a proud Jew who lived every minute to the full, and this way certainly merited 'length of days.' One of his favourite songs was the verse regarding this mitzvah, which we would often sing together and sang at his bed side during his final hours. A year ago, my 7 brothers and I recorded this song professionally in his memory. Feel free to look up 'kan tzipor' on YouTube! May my father's memory be for a blessing, and may the blessings associated with this unique mitzvah be fulfilled upon us. Shabbat Shalom!

Ellul - It's Time to Return!

There is a general principle that 30 days before a festival we begin our preparation. In the case of Rosh Hashanah and the High Holidays, shul offices have been hard at work with timetables and tickets since May. However, for the congregations the solemn season begins with Rosh Chodesh Ellul.

Here at Kinloss, we are delighted that through Ellul and Yom Tov, we shall be joined by **Chava Wulwick** as a Scholar in Residence and the JLE's **Rabbi Dov Cowan** as an additional Spiritual inspiration.

Chava is well known to us for her excellent and thoroughly prepared shiurim over the years. Last Monday evening she gave a powerful presentation on "Do I still have time for Teshuva before Rosh Hashana?" (Spoiler Alert: Yes, of course! – But it was the source and context rich exposition that was outstanding.) Please join Chava for her break-out sessions on Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur.

Rachel's Tears: Repairing Broken Relationships (a session for women, 1st Day RH), **Hearing the Voices in the Kriyat HaTorah** (for everyone, 2nd Day RH), **The Scapegoat** (YK)

We are also delighted to welcome back Rabbi Dov Cowan, who ran uplifting **Spiritual Workouts** for us in May. Rabbi Dov will be back next week on Shabbat 17th September and on first Day Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur.

These are breakout sessions during the services – and I invite everyone looking to come back to shul and hoping to find something a little different to join us for Rabbi Dov and for Chava.

We also welcome **Dr Harris Bor** to our Yom Kippur line-up. Harris will be giving a shiur in the early afternoon.

Our Ellul shurim continue with **Rabbi Laitner** and **Chazan Eli** on Monday 19th September. Shiurim and light supper will be at 7.30pm. Chazan Eli's topic is "**Tzedaka – what is it, and why should we be giving?**" Rabbi Laitner is offering "**Three Key ideas to supercharge our Rosh Hashana Prayers**".

The month of Av is always "full", meaning that it has 30 days. The two days of Rosh Chodesh which fell on 27th and 28th August were the 30th Av and the first of Ellul respectively. The observances of the month of Ellul such as shofar and reading **Psalm 27** began on 1st Ellul.

A consequence of Rosh Chodesh falling on Shabbat was that on Parashat Re'eh we read the Haftara for Shabbat/Rosh Chodesh and not the regular Haftara (Isaiah 54:11 – 55:5) which is the third of the seven special Haftarot of Compassion שבע דנחמא which follow Tisha B'Av. This Shabbat, we shall add those verses after the regular Haftara for Ki Teitzei (Isaiah 54:1 – 10). This combined "double Haftara" is identical to the Haftara we read on Shabbat Noach. It talks of renewal and national rebuilding after the devastation and deluge.

Each morning in Ellul at the end of Shacharit we blow the shofar. Most congregations blow a single round of Tekia, Shevarim, Teruah, Tekiah though some blow a full set of 30

blasts. The message of the shofar is to alert us and ready us for the season as well as heralding The King. According to midrash and the mystical tradition, Hashem is surveying creation and close to us, in our midst during this month. The shofar is not blown on Erev Rosh Hashanah, so that is "fresh" and we can make the "*shehechiyanu*" blessing on the day.

At the end of Shacharit and Maariv every day from Rosh Chodesh Ellul through to Shemini Atzeret we read Psalm 27, "the Lord is my light and my salvation" which exhorts us to be confident and of courage that Hashem will redeem us though we may have deviated from His path, so long as we place dwelling in His house foremost amongst our desires. Although we talk of Hashem inscribing our deeds on Rosh Hashanah and sealing them on Yom Kippur, there is a strong tradition that final judgement is set on Hoshana Rabba, leading into Shemini Atzeret (and hence the beating of our sins out from the willow sprigs on Hoshana Rabba morning.)

One of the most beautiful observances of Ellul is the recitation of Selichot prayers. For the Sephardi community, these begin from Rosh Chodesh and are recited every day before dawn. For the Ashkenazi community they begin at midnight on the Motzei Shabbat before Rosh Hashanah (or the Motzei Shabbat of the preceding week if otherwise there would be fewer than four days of Selichot).

The prayers are formulated around the 13 Attributes of God's mercy (*Hashem, Hashem El Rachum veChanun...* Exodus 34: 6 – 7). According to the Talmud (Rosh Hashanah 17b) if such anthropomorphic characterisations of God had not been written into the Torah we would have castigated them as heretical. Nonetheless, we hold that it is a unique blessing to Israel that any time we wish to atone for our sins, when we recite these attributes in a minyan, Hashem guarantees forgiveness.

The reciting of the 13 Attributes is punctuated by a variety of liturgical poems and responsive *pizmonim*. Towards the end of the Selichot service, we open the Aron Kodesh and chant *Shema Koleinu*, begging Hashem to hear our voice. The service concludes with the acrostic *Ashamnu* confession.

Most communities read Selichot through till Yom Kippur, though the Chabad custom is to stop after the fast of Gedalia (3rd Tishrei).

Please join us for a special **Choral Selichot with Chazan Avromi Freilich**, Chazan Eli and a choir led by Rabbi Julian Shindler at Kinloss at 10:45pm next **Motzei Shabbat, 17th September**.

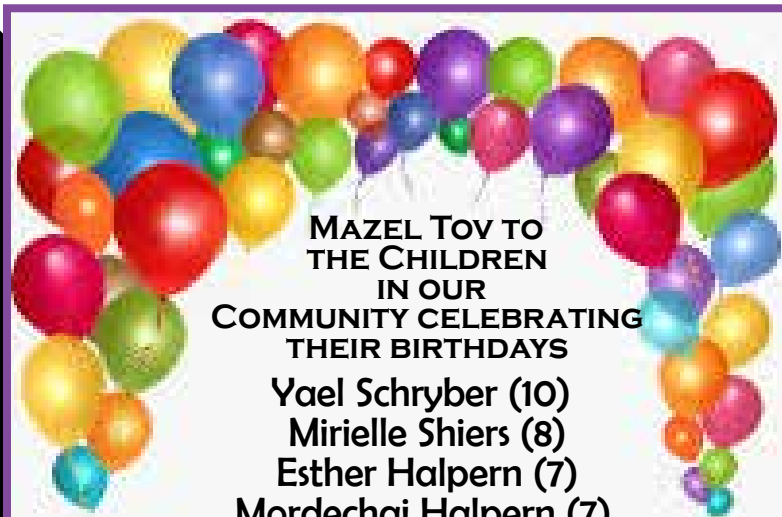
