Blessed with Everything

וְאַבְרָהָם זָקֵן בָּא בַּיָּמִים וְהָ בָרַךְ אֶת אַבְרָהָם בְּכָל:

After the burial of Sarah, aged 127 years, we learn that “Avraham was old, well on in years, and Hashem had blessed Avraham with everything.” (Bereshit 24:1)

In Birkat Hamazon, we acknowledge Hashem’s blessing of our ancestors “Bakol Mikol Kol” **בְּכָל מִכֹּל** – with everything, from everything, everything. The **בְּכָל** comes from this blessing of Avraham. The **מִכֹּל** comes from Yitzchak, who has enjoyed the tastes of everything (Bereshit 27:33). The final **כֹּל** is used by Yaakov, when he is reconciled with Eisav and notes that he has everything (or all that he needs). (Bereshit 33:11)

What is the **כֹּל** that is Avraham’s everything?

The continuation tells of Avraham instructing Eliezer to return to Haran and find a wife for Yitzchak. The “everything” he enjoyed certainly lacked a daughter-in-law and grandchildren to carry on his name.

Rashi notes that the gematria of **בְּכָל** is 52, which is the same as **בֵּן**, a son. Inasmuch as Hashem had enabled Avraham and Sarah to have Yitzchak in their nineties, and Yitzchak had lived through the Akeida, Avraham now had confidence that a wife, grandchildren and inheritors would follow. The “everything” is therefore more than a son. The son is symbolic of Avraham having complete Emunah in Hashem fulfilling the blessing of copious blessings.

There is a debate in the Talmud (Bava Batra 16b) over the possibility that blessed with “everything” means that Hashem had blessed Avraham with a daughter (R’ Yehuda) or conversely had blessed Avraham with not having a daughter (R’ Meir). R’ Yehuda’s opinion is the easier and more palatable. Our daughters are certainly great blessings. They may elevate our lives in different and additional ways to our sons. Far harder to reconcile is the opinion of R’ Meir. Ramban

and R’ Shimshon Rafael Hirsch point to the anxiety that Avraham would have faced with a daughter: with whom could she marry? Whereas a wife for Yitzchak would come into Avraham’s monotheistic and faithful home, Avraham would have worried that any daughter would leave the security of his household and be plunged into an environment of idolatry.

Amongst the many interpretations offered for **בְּכָל**, is the idea that Avraham merited living according to the Torah. Ramban explores the notion that the Avot kept the mitzvot and explains how it could then be that Yaakov was able to marry two sisters (prohibited in Vayikra 18:18). Given that Yaakov married Leah and Rachel outside of Israel, he is able to use this to develop an important thesis that true mitzvah observance is connected intrinsically with the Land.

The Gemarra cited above also suggests that the blessing of everything means that Avraham saw Yishmael return to the fold within his lifetime (and in a similar vein, that Eisav did not rebel while Avraham was still alive.) Yishmael’s return is found at the end of our Parasha (25:9), where Avraham dies and is buried by Yitzchak and Yishmael in the cave of Machpela, the selfsame cave with which our reading began.

Happiness is certainly relative and bound up in the cycle of our lives. Whether we are considering our confidence in their future security, the knowledge that they will carry on in our ways, the mere fact that they succeed us or the comfort they might bring, in this possuk, our commentators have highlighted family, particularly our children, as the apogee of blessing.

In our children and in our families, may we all be blessed. Shabbat Shalom

Calculating Kislev

This Thursday and Friday are Rosh Chodesh, the thirtieth day of the month of Cheshvan and the first of the month of Kislev. The Mishna (Rosh Hashana 1:3) records Kislev as one of the six months where messengers would be sent out from the Sanhedrin in Jerusalem through the diaspora to advise of the sanctification of the New Moon; in this case, so that Channuka would be celebrated on the correct day.

Though we take the calendar very much for granted, one of its peculiarities is that Cheshvan and Kislev may each be 29 or 30 days long. Accordingly, until the determination in Jerusalem that it was either 30th Cheshvan or 1st Kislev, one couldn't know which night to light the Channukia or deep fry the latkes.

In a "regular" כסדרה year, the months alternate with Tishrei having 30 days, Cheshvan 29, Kislev 30, Tevet 29 etc. A "regular" non-leap year has 354 days. A "regular" leap year has 30 intercalated days of Adar Rishon (followed by 29 days of Adar Sheini), making 384 days.

In a "defective" חסרה year, Kislev drops to 29 days, yielding years of 353 (or 383 in a leap year) days.

In a "full" שלמה year, Cheshvan gains a day and becomes 30 days long, yielding a full 355 or 385 day year.

The adding of the days is to ensure that Yom Kippur (10th Tishrei) never falls on a Friday or a Sunday and that Hoshana Rabba (21st Tishrei) never falls on a Shabbat (which would preclude the beating of the willows).

The calculation is further complicated by trying to ensure that the "molad", anticipated first visible sliver of moon in Jerusalem is not too late in the day before Rosh Hashana.

We know that Tycho Brahe, the Danish nobleman and astronomer who provided pioneering and accurate charts of planetary motion, dying in 1601 in Prague corresponded with his contemporaries, the Maharal (d1609) and David Ganz (the Tzemach David, d1603) on matters of astronomy.

The molad, which is announced in many congregations is the projected new moon based on a precise recurring cycle of 29 days 12 hours and 44+1/18 minutes. The molad is truer to the actual occurrence of the new moon than the proclaimed Rosh Chodesh, as it does not reflect the gerrymandering of the calendar to avoid

Yom Tov/Shabbat clashes. It is, nonetheless, not "true" and left unbalanced, our calendar overruns the lunar cycle by two hours every 19 years or almost one day every 216 years.

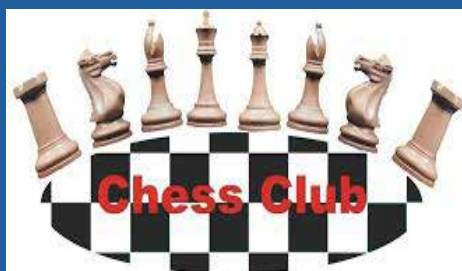
