It's Not the Numbers that Count

This Shabbat we start the book of Bemidbar, which is known in English as the “Book of Numbers”.

The Hebrew name, Bemidbar means “in the wilderness” – and indeed the book spans the 40 years that the children of Israel spent journeying from receiving the Torah at Sinai until they come to the threshold of the Promised Land itself. It is, of course, a relatively short journey, but an entire generation was held back from coming into Israel as a result of the episode of the 12 Spies we read in a few weeks’ time.

The English name, “Numbers”, comes from both the census that is taken in the Parsha, here at the beginning of the 40 years and also a subsequent count towards the end.

At the beginning of Parshat Ki Tissa (Shemot 30, 12-16), we established that a census of Jews was to be handled in a specific way – every individual would contribute exactly a half a shekel and the count would be derived from the total. We were not to just count heads or bodies. Why ever not?

A head count depersonalises us – it lumps us as a herd. However, in making us give, it signals that we are worth what we contribute. Even today, when we are checking that we have a minyan in shul, we are careful not to count off the people present 1 to 10.

Indeed, King David violated this principle (2 Samuel 24, 1-17). He did tally the people, perhaps the wrong way and without any clear reason. Hashem sent the prophet Gad to offer David a choice of punishment; three months of famine, or of flight, pursued by his enemies or of pestilence. He elected the latter

The count in this week’s Parsha is in two parts. The first is specifically of adult males of fighting strength. It is important to know the size of one’s forces. Then, and separately, Hashem instructs a count of the Levites, who were not to fight. As each Levite family is assessed, they are appointed to a defined role in the Mishkan or Sanctuary... the altars, the structure... carrying the Ark etc.

Throughout, the word that is used for number is the Hebrew “Pikud” פִּקּוּד. The word means designation. A person is numbered – not just as an anonymous entity, who is part of a greater whole – but as a person, with a task and a responsibility.

Every individual has a purpose. Each of us does not just add bulk. The entire world was created for just one individual – and we, individually are significant.

The Jewish world, instructs Hashem, should not be reckoned by the bulk of its bodies. Our strength comes from the contribution of each individual. Our collective strength is what we make of our lives and what we give of ourselves.

If we rattle off the world population totals, the Jewish community barely registers. The estimated world population is 7.9 billion. The world Jewish population is around 15.2 million. This represents approximately 1/5 of one percent. Consider, however, what we have achieved and the civilisation and values we represent... the impact we have made...

The problem with numbers is that they can mask what really matters. None of us should think of ourselves as a mere statistic. Each of us is an individual and Hashem in His Torah has charged us with responsibility. Each one of us matters.

We have our פִּקּוּד designation.

...אין לך אדם שאין לו שעה (Pirkei Avot 4:3) Ben Azzai teaches, “there is no person without his moment.”

It is in our hands to seize our chances and to make our lives count.

Ruth – A Book of Chesed

On Shavuot (Second day in Diaspora) we read the Book of Ruth, which has a number of connections with the Festival.

Nonetheless, as the Midrash points out, the Book doesn't teach us a single Halacha. "It does not contain issues of purity or impurity, nor prohibitions or permissions. So why was it written? To teach us the magnitude of the reward for those who bestow loving-kindness on others."

The Megilla opens with telling us that in the days when judges judged, there was a famine in Israel. A man leaves Bethlehem in Yehuda to settle in Moab. We're then told of his identity. He was Elimelech, and the name of his wife was Naomi, and the names of his two sons were Machlon and Khilyon. They stayed there and he died.

Avraham and Yaakov had left Israel when there was a famine and returned richer and stronger. On the face of it, Elimelech has strong precedents.

However, the Gemarra states "R' Shimon ben Yochai said: Elimelech, Machlon, and Khilyon were the greatest of their generation and the sustainers of their generation. And why were they punished? Because they departed from the land of Israel." (Bava Batra 91a)

How does R' Shimon Bar Yochai reach such a judgemental conclusion? How does he determine that this is a punishment and not some sorry death of hungry refugees?

Moreover, why did Elimelech choose Moab? It is thought strange that someone would go to Moab at a time of famine. The Moabites had a reputation as an inhospitable and immoral people.

Seemingly, Elimelech's is the only family to leave, while everyone else stayed in Bethlehem. Moreover, when Naomi eventually returns, we don't see that she's given a rapturous welcome or that people go out of their way to assist her.

The Rabbis determine that Elimelech was not driven out by hunger. On the contrary, he is described as an Ish – a man of substance. His family had been affluent and able to provide for everyone else. They left through their own meanness of character. Elimelech had not wanted to share the burden of care for his place of birth.

Several Midrashim depict Elimelech as the stingy, recalcitrant potential sustainer.

"Why was Elimelech punished?" Asks the Midrash. "Elimelech was among the greatest people in the country and was one of the sustainers of his generation, and when the years of famine came, he said, 'Now all of Israel will surround my doorway, this one with his alms box and this one with his alms box.' He stood up and fled from them."

It's possible that the Rabbis are hinting at the Biblical symmetry. The tribe of Yehuda and a failure to step up... This might ring a bell. In Bereishit, Yehuda failed to rescue his brother Yosef and instigated his sale into exile by appealing to the others, "What profit if we kill him? Let us sell him instead!"

And Yehuda had eventually found himself humbled and begging for grain when the famine hit.

In the interim, Yehuda had moved away from his family. Two of his sons died. Yehuda was seduced by his daughter in law Tamar and fathered twins. The oldest of these was Peretz. Peretz - another familiar name. At the very end of the Megilla we discover that Peretz is the great-great great-great grandfather of Boaz.

Both Boaz and Ruth model loving-kindness. In Ruth's case, we see her loyalty to Naomi even though Ruth must abandon her homeland. Boaz instructs his workers to be even more charitable than normal – leaving extra grain for Ruth to glean – clearly at the expense of his profits. The Megilla ends by telling us that Ruth and Boaz are the Great grandparents of King David, first monarch of the redemptive Messianic house.

Within the Megilla and in its allusions the message of Ruth is clear. We are called upon to be demonstrably kind, to give of ourselves to others; to contribute rather than run from community.

Of course, the world would be an easier place if we all just received whatever we wanted whenever we wanted it. It's our ability to reach out to others when they are in need that makes it a Godly place and makes us godly people.

Let's seek out those opportunities and not be blind to hunger and homelessness. It's overseas. It's in Israel. And it's also on our doorsteps. We should show our lovingkindness in actions not just words – seek out those opportunities and give of ourselves.

A big mazal tov to our **Neshei Chayil, Mandy Lawrence, Mandy Namdar and Eleanor Mansfield**, each of them models and inspires with their leadership and Chesed!

A Note on Cooking and Candle-lighting:

Friday night candles can be lit any time from 7:27pm till 8:56pm latest.

Candle lighting for First day Yom Tov this year cannot be before Motzei Shabbat 10:15pm.

Candle lighting for Second day is ideally after 10:18pm on Sunday night and it is preferable not to prepare any food for 2nd Day Yom Tov ahead of that time. **However, our practice is: for 2nd Day Candles to be lit from Plag Mincha, at 7:28pm (Sunday) and to permit cooking food for the evening meal from then. (This should be eaten before Sunset, 9:12pm).**

When candles are lit early as above, Kiddush may also be recited early.

I have spent over 30 years in informal Jewish education & over 25 years as a Torah teacher & 'personal Torah trainer' for women & children.

I grew up in Mill Hill and was educated at Henrietta Barnett School. My love for Jewish learning came from the Jewish Teenage Centre & later the Sixth Form Centre. I spent a year learning Torah in Israel at Midreshet Lindenbaum (Brovender's). At the end of the year I married Jeremy Lawrence- a young rabbinical student committed to serving diaspora communities and we made aliyah to Jerusalem. I studied Psychology at the Hebrew University.



Our first community was the Auckland Hebrew Congregation in New Zealand. It was there that I was exposed to the model of community that I came to embrace and learned many lessons that have guided me ever since. Everyone we met was connected and committed to the Community & determined to play their part in whatever way necessary – it was a case of step up or it won't happen – so people stepped up. I also became aware that for many women connection to the community had been vital throughout their lives but it did not come through Torah. I wondered then - & it motivates me still – how many people are connected enough & familiar enough with pesukim to have a 'favourite pasuk? Since then I have tried to bring pesukim into people's lives so that everyone from the youngest to the oldest will have that access & connection.

We came to Kinloss nearly 8 years ago & I have been privileged to get to know this incredible community. I love its diversity, warmth and energy and strong commitment to Zionism. I would like to thank all the people that have supported me when I needed it. I am grateful to those who work tirelessly for the needs of the congregation – you are an inspiration.
