This week's parsha talks about the creation of world and the creation of man and woman. After G'd created Adam He said – **לֹא טוֹב הָיִיתָ לְבַדּוֹ, אֶעֱשֶׂה לוֹ עֶזְרָא כְנֵגְדּוֹ** - It's not good that man is alone, I will make him a **helpmate against him** (Beraishit 2:18). There seems to be a contradiction here, did G'd create woman to be a 'helpmate' to man or to be 'against him'?

Rashi explains that this is talking about different times in a relationship. **זָכָה עֶזְרָא, לֹא זָכָה – כְּנֵגְדּוֹ**. There will be times where 'man merits and his wife will help him and at other times, if he doesn't merit, she will be against him'.

The Netziv, Rabbi Naftoli Tzvi Yehuda Berlin (1816-1893) offers a different explanation. G'd is teaching us, the help man needs is actually *by* his wife being against him. Each husband and wife has their own identity and opinions, which can create tension. Disagreements can result in arguments, one spouse becoming defensive, withdrawing or shutting down. The Torah is teaching us however, that this tension, if acted upon with sensitivity and respect, creates an opportunity for growth. The example the Netziv gives (which I'm sure no one can relate to), is that sometimes a spouse may become angry or disgruntled about some perceived injustice that has been wrought upon them. One's other half can at this point be an **עֶזְרָא** – 'help' by agreeing with how terrible the next door neighbour, the parking attendant or the boss (or whoever they are ranting about) is. However, this may just 'fuel the fire' and actually be **כְּנֵגְדּוֹ** - 'against him'. When appropriate, another option is to listen empathetically, *without* necessarily agreeing. Even though they may initially be upset that their spouse does not agree, in the long term this may actually be more helpful. By being 'against him' she is actually guiding him to a place of clarity and growth, a place from which he can make better decisions.

G'd and His people are often compared in Tanach to a groom and bride, thus the verse **לֹא טוֹב הָיִיתָ** can also be understood regarding the relationship between G'd and humanity. Prior to creation of the world G'd was 'alone'. Even after creating the world, G'd could have chosen to reveal His presence in our lives in an open and clear way. Yet he chose to create human beings with the ability to deny His existence and to ignore Him. The reason He chose to create the world in this way is because "It is not good for Man to be alone; I will make Him a helper against Him." Symbolically G-d's profound pleasure and 'help' stems precisely from this opposition to Him. When a human being, who feels detached from G-d, take steps towards discovering the light of G-d within; when a person challenges preconceived notions or takes one small step towards G'd, observing one extra Mitzvah, however 'small' — this allows for the blessings of a real relationship. This "grants" G-d the joy of engaging in a genuine relationship with the human person. We become co-partners in the work of repairing and healing the world.

The Baal Shem Tov (1698 – 1760) taught that the way we prepare and conduct ourselves on Shabbat Bereishit sets us up for the way we experience the whole year. This is the Shabbat where we take the energy of the High Holydays and apply it to our service of G'd all year around. The atmosphere in Kinloss over the High Holydays has been truly inspirational. May we all take this energy with us into the year, and use it to inspire our tefillot, shul services (your attendance and participation **does** make a huge difference!), our relationships, and our service of G'd. Shabbat Shalom.

Mitzvot: There is only one mitzvah in the Sidra, which is the first in the Torah: to be fruitful and multiply.
 Verses: 146 (8th longest of the 54 Sidrot)

 Letters: 7235 (11th longest)
 The mystery of the samechs: The last letter to make its appearance in the Torah is the samech. Remarkably, out of the 7,235 letters in the Sidra, there are only 7 samechs.

Keeping up with the Calendar – Planning Ahead

Tuesday and Wednesday are Rosh Chodesh. Tuesday will be the 30th day of Tishrei and Wednesday 1st Cheshvan.

The month of Cheshvan is reputedly the only Jewish calendar month without any festivity. Accordingly, it has acquired the epithet **מר-חשוון** Mar-Cheshvan or “Bitter” Cheshvan. Of course, some think that after the month of shul, feasting, disrupted work etc getting back to “normal” living and full working weeks is as sweet as it can get!

Cheshvan and Kislev, which follows are unusual in the calendar. In regular years Cheshvan has 29 days and Kislev 30. However, both sometimes have 29 days (*Chaser* חסר lacking) and other times 30 days (*Maleh* מלא full). This year (5783) both are full. 5784 both are lacking. In 5786 only Kislev will be full.

The adjustments are made to force Rosh Hashana to fall on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday or Shabbat – in turn, to prevent Yom Kippur falling on Friday or Sunday and prevent Hoshana Rabba falling on Shabbat. As a consequence, Channuka sometimes ends on 2nd and other times 3rd Tevet.

In Israel, 7th Cheshvan sees the switch in the Amidah from “*v’ten bracha*” to “*v’ten tal u’matar livracha*”(give dew and rain as a blessing). In diaspora, this doesn’t happen till the evening of 4th December (or the day after in a year preceding a Civil Leap Year.)

One might wonder

- 1) Why is there a difference?
- 2) How we come to switch from the Jewish to the secular calendar?

The dates were established by the Anshei Knesset Hagadola (The Men of the Great Assembly) who ruled Israel from the time of Ezra and the building of the 2nd Temple (c520 BCE) through till the early Hellenistic Period. One of their main contributions was the regularisation of Tefilla.

The Talmud (Ta’anit 1:3) records that 7th Cheshvan, which is fifteen days after Shemini Atzeret, allowed for Jewish pilgrims returning from Jerusalem to get home to the most distant regular pilgrim reaches, such as the lands of the Euphrates, without praying for themselves to be rained upon.

However, for those who lived out of Israel, (predominantly Babylonia) they instituted a switchover date which was 60 days after the start of halachic autumn (known as Tekufat Tishrei). Despite the Hebrew name

referring to a Jewish month, it is describing a manifestation of the seasonal solar (rather than lunar) calendar.

Even though we have Diaspora communities in all reaches of northern and southern hemispheres, with seasons and climate changing accordingly, we pray for rain according to what the Babylonian Jews (the then Diaspora hub) most needed.

The 60-day figure comes from the third century Talmudic sage, Shmuel, who calculated the solar year as 365 days and 6 hours, making a Quarter or Tekufa 91 days and 7 ½ hours. This corresponded with the Julian calendar, where Tekufat Tishrei was always Sept 24 and 60 days later was Nov 22. However, in 1582, Pope Gregory XIII changed the calendar over, making adjustments for an error in the Julian Calendar. The solar year is 11 minutes and 14 seconds shorter than had been thought and the calendar had become out of kilter with the true solar year by an 11-day lag. Gregory added 10 days in October 1582 so that October 5th became October 15th and the spring equinox would return to March 21. England only made the switch (of 11 days) in 1750.

To regulate the calendar and prevent the 11 minutes and 14 seconds from wreaking fresh havoc, Gregory set the rule of leap years, where we add one day to the calendar every four years but remove one day from the calendar every 128 years (century years, not divisible by 400).

We have explained the difference in dates and the switch in calendar.

A further question, if you examine older siddurim, is why the changeover date is creeping slowly forwards. Older siddurim have days earlier in December. This adjusts for an even more precise reckoning of the leap years and computation of the solar year by R’ Adda bar Ahava at 365 days, 5 hours, 55 minutes and 25.4 seconds! When we hit 2100, the switchover date in Diaspora will be the evening of December 5th.

Many thanks to everyone who made the Ellul and Tishrei season so warm, inspiring and uplifting. It was lovely to see so many people back in all our services and programmes with such a great atmosphere all around Kinloss. I look forward to seeing everyone through the many events scheduled in the months ahead

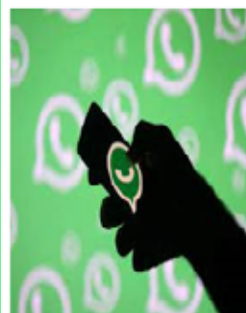
