“The Lord spoke to Moses, “Hurry down, for your people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt, have acted basely. They have been quick to turn aside from the way that I enjoined upon them. They have made themselves a molten calf and bowed low to it and sacrificed to it, saying: ‘This is your god, O Israel, who brought you out of the land of Egypt!’” (Shmot/Exodus 32:7-8).

It was evident that Moshe (Moses) was aware of what the B’nei Yisroel (children of Israel) had done, yet, he still returned to the encampment with the Luchot (tablets). We then read “As soon as Moses came near the camp and saw the calf and the dancing, he became enraged; and he hurled the tablets from his hands and shattered them at the foot of the mountain (Shmot 32:19)”. Why did Moshe wait? Why did he not break the Luchot as he first heard about the Golden Calf?

The Talmud Yerushalmi (Jerusalem Talmud) provides an explanation. In Taanit 4:5 the opinion of Rav Acha is quoted by Rav Chilkia: “This comes to teach us that a person should never judge a case on the basis of surmise”. For Moshe to judge the Jewish people and declare them as unworthy to receive the Luchot, he needed to actually witness them in their moment of indiscretion. Hearsay, even from Hashem himself, is not acceptable as evidence.

Rabbi Ovadyah Sforno (16th century) presents an additional purpose behind Moshe’s actions. He explains that Moshe intended, should the B’nei Yisroel repent at once, to give them the Tablets immediately. If not, however, the shattering of the Luchot would hopefully shock them into repentance.

The Rabbi Writes

In preparing my lunch and learn shiur on medicines and Shabbat I was interested by a passage in Rabbi Eliezer Melamed's Peninei Halacha. He states, "The main idea of Shabbat is that on this day we calmly and tranquilly accept reality as it is. If we have no clean clothes, we wear dirty ones. If we forgot to cook a certain dish, we content ourselves with the food we have, or we ask a neighbour for help. If we forgot to turn on the heat, we put on a coat. If we forgot to turn on the air conditioning, we suffer a bit from the heat. Even though Shabbat laws sometimes cause suffering, they liberate us from the burden and tension of having to pay constant attention and ensure that every little detail of our lives is properly addressed. **Therefore, Shabbat is a valuable gift. The feeling of faith, tranquillity, and rest that results from accepting reality on Shabbat is enjoyable and uplifting.**"

"The Sages continue this trend through their enactments, one of which is to refrain from using medicine on Shabbat. If we experience some discomfort, even if it is irritating and unpleasant, we bear it calmly, as this too is part of Shabbat rest."

This sentiment seems to jar with the idea that Shabbat is מעין עולם הבא a "foretaste of the World to Come." This impression, which is found in the Midrash (Bereshit Rabba 17,44) or similarly in the Talmud as a "sixtieth of the World to Come" (TB Brachot 57b). My imagination of Olam Haba, while nonphysical, is generally one of some form of Perfection. There is something counterintuitive in the notion that it is grounded in reality with all its flaws; or that in being constrained to accept reality, we experience liberation.

The chapter in the Peninei Halacha goes on to outline the different gradations of illness, ranging from life-threatening (פיקוח נפש), grave enough that life is at risk (חולה שיש בו סכנה), that a limb is at risk (סכנת איבר), sick but not life-threatening (חולה שאין בו סכנה) through to essentially well, but experiencing pain or discomfort (בריא שיש לו מיהוש בעלמא). For each he delineates the extent to which Torah or Rabbinic prohibitions on the Shabbat may be superseded by the need to restore someone to good health. Of course, preservation of life is paramount, and one shouldn't hesitate to act on Shabbat where there is a clear or likely risk to life or limb.

He adds "However, if the discomfort causes pain and negates Oneg Shabbat (the enjoyment of Shabbat), the Sages permitted transgressing minor rabbinic prohibitions (שבות דשבות) to relieve the suffering. And when it comes to caring for one who is actually sick, the Sages allow us to transgress all rabbinic prohibitions, as taking care of one's health is a mitzva."

On the one hand, Shabbat exists as a time where we cannot fix what is broken and cannot cure illness which might wait. On the other hand, Shabbat is supposed to be pleasurable. Where adherence to rabbinic enactments might leave one in a state of distress or pain, without curing the illness itself, one might be able to alleviate the pain. He cites the opinions of the Tzitz Eliezer (d2006, Jerusalem), who recognises that the prohibition on medication was formulated when bespoke compounds needed to be prepared for each patient. Today's paracetamol is manufactured by the millions and already in our bathroom cabinets. His is a psak which reflects how changing and modern circumstances do impact upon halachic outcomes.

"Even though many maintain that the Sages' enactment applies even when pain is involved, in the case of mass-produced medication, where there is no concern that a private individual would try to prepare it himself, it is proper to be lenient. It is worth noting that when the technical law allows leniency, it is proper to act accordingly so as to fulfil the mitzva of Oneg Shabbat."

Sometimes we have to stop rushing around and playing God, to see God; to take stock, to experience digital detox, to talk to our families... Oneg Shabbat isn't the joy of manufacture but the joy of appreciating rest.

THIS WEEK'S HAFTORAH BY RABBI ANDREWS

This week's Haftorah from the eighteenth chapter of Milachim I (1 Kings) starts with Eliyahu (Elijah) bringing God's message of coming rain to King Achav (Ahab). The connection to the Parsha seems to be most manifest in the second half of the reading. It is there that Eliyahu and Achav meet and debate who is the cause of the drought, and then the defeat of the priests of Baal in the contest to bring fire down from heaven.

A theme in both the Torah reading and the Haftorah is that the Jewish people had lost sight of the identity of God. In the Parsha, people declared the Golden Calf as "the God Who took you out of Egypt". In the Haftorah, Eliyahu offers a choice between Baal and God, but, the people were silent and unable to choose. The prophet in each case had to prove and reinforce faith in Hashem.

The Jews' inability to choose explains some aspects of the story that would otherwise leave us quite confused. Achav greets Eliyahu rudely every time he sees him and accuses him of being the source of the people's problems via the drought. At the same time, he obeys Eliyahu's orders, gathering the people and the priests of Baal to Har HaCarmel (Mount Carmel).

It is not that Achav and his subjects lacked belief in God or Eliyahu, it was that they believed in God and Baal. Eliyahu's insistence on choosing between the two was so foreign to their perspective they could not respond.

This also helps us understand why Eliyahu mocked the prophets of Baal as they tried to bring fire on their sacrifice. It was not enough for him to win as this might only convince the people that God was the stronger of the two. He needed to be so overwhelming in his victory to erase the people's connection to Baal completely.
