An Aron (Ark) Which Bears Us All

‘And you (*plural*) shall make the Ark out of acacia wood...’ (Shemot 25:10)

Why have we highlighted the plural? Hebrew is a language which distinguishes between singular and plural verbs. As English does not make this distinction, a reading of this week’s Sidra in English translation will not pick up on the fact that the instruction to build the Aron (ark) in the Mishkan (Tabernacle, the portable desert Shul), is given in the *plural*.

Contrastingly, instructions for other Mishkan appurtenances such as the covering of the Aron itself (25:11), the Kaporet (golden cover) (25:17), the Keruvim (Cherubims) (25:18) and the Shulchan (Table) (25:23) are all given in the *singular*. What might lie behind this?

Rabbi Moshe ben Nachman (**Ramban**, 1190-1274), writes that the plural used in our quoted verse is linked to the first section of the Sidra, verses 1-9, which refer to the Jewish people as a whole and discuss the general communal role in constructing the Mishkan. As such, verses 1-9 also contain plural verbs and our verse therefore does too. Ramban explains that perhaps all of the Jewish people had a share in the construction of the Aron, rather than the specific constructors who assembled the other appurtenances of the Mishkan.

Furthermore, as the Torah explains in 25:21-22, the Aron had the Keruvim on top of it and that spot between the Keruvim was the place where Moses heard communication from God, as Rashi notes at verse 22. This communication was, ultimately, for the whole of the people via Moses.

Ramban continues, quoting the Midrash (earliest Rabbinic commentaries on the Torah) that the Aron was a contribution from all of the people, not from any specific group. As the Aron was a place that Torah was taught from, it was more specifically linked to the people as a whole rather than just to a cadre who were more intricately involved in the Mishkan, either as officiants or as constructors of specific pieces of the Mishkan.

Perhaps with the above ideas in mind, Ramban also explains the plural used in the instruction to build the Aron as signifying that those who associate with the Aron will merit greatness in Torah observance and study as a result of their efforts and association.

Ramban’s message resonates today, especially for those who associate themselves with synagogue communities such as ours and all facets of Torah observance within them, be those caring, educational, social or any of the ways that the Torah applies in every walk of life.

Looking and Leaping

Within the Jewish calendar, leap years occur seven times in each 19-year cycle in years 3, 6, 8, 11, 14, 17, and 19. The Jewish year, itself, comprises 12 lunar months of 29 or 30 days each. While the length of most months is fixed, Cheshvan and Kislev can be either. The 12-month lunar year is just 354 days. A regular Jewish year can be 353, 354, 355 and a leap year 383, 384 or 385 days.

The Torah instructs us to ensure that Pesach always falls during the spring (in the northern hemisphere). In order to prevent our festive calendar from slipping back 11 days every solar year and losing touch with the seasons, a full 30-day lunar month is added. The lengths of Cheshvan and Kislev are manipulated, inter alia, to prevent Yom Kippur falling on a Friday or Sunday.

The calendar as we now have it was fixed in the year 359 by Hillel the Younger, who was the head of the Jewish community still in the land of Israel.

Hillel's calendar has served us well, and we have not needed any of the draconian massaging, the adding or subtracting of days that blighted the Julian calendar, led to riots in Europe and the separation of the Eastern Orthodox calendars from the rest of the world.

But what if Hillel was wrong? Lest Rosh Hashana is in the right place, but for seven times in 19 years Pesach is not where Hashem wants it to be, the rabbis devised a "patch" in the spiritual software to counter the potential *leap glitch*, where we might be eating hamentaschen when Hashem intended that we be Chametz free and eating only Matzah.

In the Musaf Amida of Rosh Chodesh during a leap year between Cheshvan and Adar Sheini we add the two words ולכפרת פשע "and atonement for transgression" to our prayer for "a month of good and blessing, joy and gladness, etc". We pray that Hashem should set aside any culpability incurred by following Hillel the Younger's calendar.

Leap years present questions concerns minhagim for Birthdays and Yahrzeits.

In a leap year, Avelut remains 12 months and Kaddish is recited for eleven months.

Event on 30th Cheshvan:

- If in the first year after the death, Cheshvan has 30 days, the Yahrzeit will be observed on 30 Cheshvan, in all years in which 30 Cheshvan occurs. In all other years Yahrzeit is on the first day of Kislev.
- If in the first year after the death Cheshvan has only 29 days, Yahrzeit will be observed on 29 Cheshvan, in all years in which no 30 Cheshvan occurs. (Some

recite Kaddish also on the first day of Kislev.) In all other years Yahrzeit is on 30 Cheshvan.

- In years with a 30 Cheshvan, **birthdays** are marked on the 30 Cheshvan; otherwise, on the first day of Kislev.

Event on 30th Kislev:

- If in the first year after the death Kislev has 30 days, Yahrzeit will be observed on 30 Kislev, in all years in which 30 Kislev occurs. In all other years, Yahrzeit is on the first day of Tevet.
- If in the first year after the death Kislev has only 29 days, Yahrzeit will be on 29 Kislev, in all years in which no 30th of Kislev occurs. (Some recite Kaddish also on the first day of Tevet.) In all other years, Yahrzeit is on 30 Kislev.
- In years with a 30th day of Kislev, **birthdays** are on 30 Kislev; otherwise, on the first day of Tevet.

Event in Adar of a Regular year:

- In a leap year Ashkenazim mark the Yahrzeit in Adar I but some say Kaddish in Adar II as well. Sephardim mark the Nachala in Adar II.
- In leap years, **birthdays** are marked in Adar II.

Event in Adar I of a Leap year:

- The Yahrzeit is always marked in Adar I in a leap year.
- Birthdays, are marked in Adar I.

Event in Adar II of a Leap year:

- The Yahrzeit is always marked in Adar II in a leap year.

Event on 30th Adar I of a Leap year:

- Where a bereavement is on the 30 Adar I in a leap year, the Yahrzeit is 30 Shvat in a regular year. Some recite Kaddish on 1 Nissan, also.
- **Birthdays** are marked on 1 Nissan.

The Anomaly

Imagine twins born in a leap year, just minutes apart towards nightfall, but the first (Reuven) is born on 30th Adar I and the second (Shimon) on 1st Adar II. In a leap year, their Bar Mitzvahs will fall correctly.

If their Bar Mitzvah falls in a regular year, though, then Reuven's Bar Mitzvah will be on 1st Nissan, a whole month *after* his younger brother, Shimon whose Bar Mitzvah will be on 1st Adar!

THIS WEEK'S HAFTORAH BY RABBI ANDREWS

This week's Haftorah, Milachim 1 (I Kings) 5:26-6:13, describes the construction of the first Bait Hamikdash (Temple) under the direction of Shlomo Hamelech (King Solomon), echoing this week's Parsha which discusses the assembly of the Mishkan (Tabernacle) in the desert.

The reading is replete with descriptions of the numbers of workers, the hewing and transportation of stone, the laying of the Temple foundation, the dimensions of the Bait Hamikdash, and its components and materials.

It is interesting to note that the Haftorah begins by declaring that "there was peace between Hiram (King of Tyre) and Shlomo, and they both made a covenant together 'Brit'. This treaty was the matter of a fascinating rabbinic discussion as the Tosafot in Yevamot 23a points out that there is a Torah prohibition: "you shall not make a covenant with them (other nations) nor show them favour". This would seemingly place a restriction on Shlomo Hamelech's ability to sign a treaty with the King of Tyre.

In their first answer, they suggest that Hiram was a person who formally accepted the Noahide laws. As such, the Torah restriction would not apply as it only would effect bonafide idolaters.

Their second answer quotes Avodah Zarah 20a, which seems to limit the prohibition of pacts to the 7 Canaanite nations. For other peoples, the pact-rule would apply only if the purpose of the treaty was to agree to idol worship. Thus Shlomo could not have made an agreement with Hiram to help facilitate idolatry in any way.

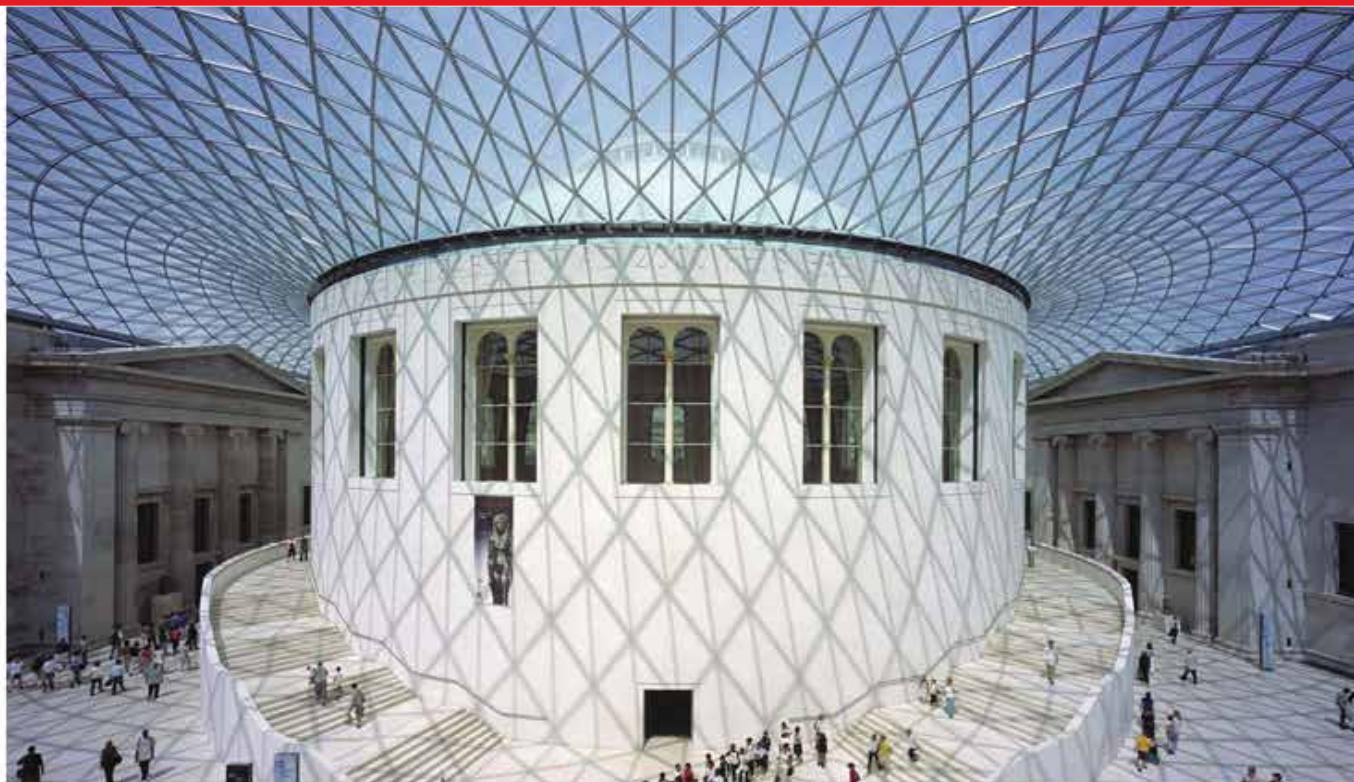

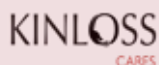
