Who knows Aleph?

Some books have memorable first lines. “In the Beginning Hashem Created...”, “Call me Ishmael.”, “It was the best of times. It was the worst of times.”, “It is a truth universally acknowledged, that a single man in possession of a good fortune, must be in want of a wife.”

This week in shul we shall read the Parasha Vayikra – beginning the book of the same name.

The book opens וַיִּקְרָא אֶל־מֹשֶׁה, He called Moses, וַיְדַבֵּר ה' אֵלָיו מֵאֹהֶל מוֹעֵד לֵאמֹר: and Hashem spoke to him from the tent of meeting, saying...”

“He called Moses, and Hashem spoke to him from the Tent of Meeting, saying...” Who would ever start a book like that?

It is strange to begin with “He called Moses.” For starters, we need to know - Who’s the ‘He’?

Why not just say “Hashem called Moses from the Tent of Meeting, saying...” or better yet, set the scene and also cut out the redundant “saying” altogether. “From the Tent of Meeting, Hashem said to Moses...”

When it comes to the Torah, we can hardly complain that the author lacked style or that the editing was sloppy!

Some consider that Vayikra is out of character with the books that precede and the books that follow. Thematically, that’s true. It is a book very different to the narrative that we have become used to; the evolution of a family into a tribe and a nation. It is resplendent in mitzvot, predominantly concerned with purity and sanctity, worship and sacrifice. Vayikra is personal. It is about us drawing close to Hashem.

In this vein, we can revisit the opening line...

Wherever the text seems cumbersome, it is seen by the commentaries as a signal for explanation. What is the point of the “Vayikra”? And He called.

The commentaries say, the word, Vayikra, and He called, contains the Hebrew root, יקַר *yakar*, He endeared.

Says Rashi, “there is no calling without *Chibba*,” bonding. A dialogue with Hashem is not just about responding to a command. It is about coming together in a bonded relationship – an endearing relationship.

The double expression, *Vayikra* and then *vaydabber* – “He called” and then “He spoke” serves to highlight this idea of Hashem drawing closer and the sense of intimate conversation.

When the word Vayikra is written in the Torah scroll, it is always written with the Aleph at the end as a small letter. It has been this way in scrolls for as long as we have records.

“Vayikar”, he endeared, with a small aleph.

What’s an Aleph? Aleph is the first letter. It’s number one. It’s Number One in capitals – Echad mi yodeah? Who knows One? One is Hashem!

When Hashem calls Moses, even to tell him something, even to give him a list of instructions, the relationship comes first. It is done in a loving way. It is done in a bonding way it is done in an endearing way – and instructions are given with a small Aleph. Number one takes a slightly smaller place. It’s still there, but it is secondary to the relationship.

Here we see a clear contrast with the villain of the Purim story. Haman was all about Number 1 and putting himself first.

There is no doubt that Jewish living makes some heavy demands and sometimes some demands we can scarcely fathom. Climbing the spiritual staircase seems a formidable challenge – it can be difficult to persevere.

It is at such times that we are reminded - *Vayikra el Moshe*, He called Moses, *vaydaber Hashem aylav me-ohel moed*. And Hashem spoke to him from the Tent of Meeting, saying...”

Hashem took the very first steps in our direction in approaching us in a spirit of endearment. He even approached us with a small Aleph – the paradigm endearing relationship is greater than the ego.

Dear Families,

We are delighted to see so many of you returning to shul over the recent weeks and months. It can be quite common to see children moving around the building without supervision. We wanted to take this opportunity to remind you that when your children are in shul they are the responsibility of their parents and you should know where they are at all times. Should they be injured or hurt in some way, please note that shul cannot be held responsible.

The only exception to this, is of course, when your children are attending a structured activity such as one of our popular children services on a shabbat morning from 10:45-11:30:

- Ages 0-4 in the Silver Suite run by Michal Bassalian and Coral Harding
- Reception to Year 2 in the Nemetnejad Room run by Natalie Somner
- Year 3-4 in the classrooms run by volunteers
- Years 5-6 in the Newman Room run by volunteers

Whilst parents will attend with their children for the younger services, older children can be left unattended. All children's service leaders have undergone a DBS check and are experienced at working with children.

It is our preference that your children remain with you or in one of the children's services on a shabbat morning. This is because many unattended children have run freely which has put themselves and others at risk. Several have caused damage to the building and shul property.

Please do speak with your children about how they should behave in shul. Your cooperation with this is appreciated.

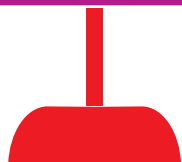
