Some Thoughts on the Sidra By Rabbi Michael Laitner

The name maketh the man

'And Moshe came and spoke all the words of this Song in the ears of the people, he and Hoshea bin Nun' (Devarim 32:44)

There is a name in the above verse which looks out of place. Hoshea refers to Yehoshua (Joshua) but apparently is his previous, original name! Hoshea was identified as Yehoshua many years earlier, such as during thé battle against Ámalek (Shemot chapter 17) and even 'renamed' Yehoshúa before he joined the spies on their scouting mission to the Land of Israel (Bemidbar chapter 13). Why does the Torah revert to his previous name here?

Rashi (d. 1105) explains this is to show Yehoshua's humility in front of his teacher, Moshe, who was present at this time of transition just prior to his passing, handing the baton to Yehoshua. Yehoshua reverted to his previous name to show he was still Moshe's student. Rabbi Avraham Ibn Ezra (d. 1167) adds that the people still knew Yehoshua as Hoshea; his changed name was only known to the leadership. In using the name Hoshea, the Torah teaches us about his popularity as well as his humility.

The Kli Yakar (Rabbi Shlomo Ephraim Luntschitz, d. 1619) writes that the extra letter 'yud' which changed the name Hoshea to Yehoshua was done to invoke the name Name of G-d (by putting the 'yud' before the 'hey') as a prayer to protect Yehoshua from the malicious plans of his fellow spies, other than Kalev. By the end of Moshe's life, all of the spies and their generation, other than Kalev, had passed on so there was no need for Yehoshua to keep his changed name at this point. The malicious plans had gone, so he could revert back to his original name.

Presumably, Hoshea's name was subsequently changed back to Yehoshua, the title we use for the next book in the Bible and named after him, to indicate the divine assistance which he would require as he led

the conquest of the Land.

THIS WEEK'S HAFTORAH BY RABBI ANDREWS
The Haftorah parallels this week's Torah reading as they both contain a musical composition by the most significant Jewish leaders of their day. In Parshat (portion) Ha'Azinu, Moshe (Moses) sings his final song as instructed by Hashem. In the Haftorah, II Samuel 22:1-51, a song by David Hamelech (King David).

The Haftarah begins after David has been delivered from his foes, including Sha'ul Hamelech (King Saul). David sings "God is my rock, my fortress, and my deliverer," (22:2). David describes being insnared: "The waves of Death compassed me; the floods of Belial assailed me...The foundations of heaven did tremble; They were shaken because He was wroth" (22:5-8).

David describes God in various guises. Hashem saves him from drowning (22:17), He is an intimidating judge (22:23), and a hunter (22:33).

The common theme that permeates the reading is that while Dayid, as a man, was helpless in the face of the machinations of the world, Hashem, the ultimate power, continuously saved him.

David concludes his composition with ecstatic exaltation: "The Lord liveth, blessed be my rock, and exalted be God...Therefore I will give thanks unto thee, O Lord, among the nations, and will sing praises unto thine name."

David's song offers an example of an important Jewish leader relating his life and framing God's intervention. It contrasts with Moshe's warning in his song found in Parshat Ha'azinu that there will come a time when the Jews will refuse to adopt such a devout outlook.

The Rabbi Writes



On Shabbat 20th October, we are delighted to be celebrating the centenary of the birth of **President Chaim Herzog** (born 17th September 1918) in Belfast.

The Service will be led by Chazan Shai Abrahamson, Chief Cantor of the IDF, in conjunction with the Neimah Singers.

President Herzog's father, R' Yitzchak Halevi Herzog was first Chief Rabbi of Ireland 1921-1936 and from 1936-1959 was Ashkenazi Chief Rabbi of the Mandate and then Israel.

Chaim Herzog studied in London, Cambridge and Sandhurst. He joined the Hagana in 1935 and served as a British Officer in the Second World War participating in the Normandy Landings and the Liberation of Bergen-Belsen. He returned to Palestine after the war, was in the battles for Latrun, securing the Jerusalem Road in the War of Independence. He retired from the IDF in 1962 with the rank of Major General.

He was Israel's permanent representative to the UN 1975-78 – articulating our defence to the Zionism is Racism resolution 3379 – and tearing it up before the assembly.

He became a Chaver Knesset in 1981 and then served as **Israel's Sixth President** over two terms from 1983-93. He died in April 1997.

His son, **Isaac "Bougie" Herzog** will be joining us for the Service. Isaac Herzog is currently Chair of the Jewish Agency, a former Chair of the Labour Party who has held several ministerial postings.



Kinloss will also be marking the **Centenary of the Armistice** with an exciting **lecture series** 24th Oct through 5th December and a

Civic Service on Sunday 11th November, the Armistice Anniversary itself.

The Service (7pm - 8.15pm) will be in conjunction with AJEX and with His Worshipful the Mayor Reuben Thompstone and Mike Freer MP.



This new class is designed for the parent/carer to be able to have some fun and exercise to the Latin beat with their child freely roaming around and dancing to a mixture of Latin songs.





A walk through time through the history of London's Jewish community in the East End and a tour of the nation's childhood collection of toys and childhood artefacts.

The tour encompasses a tale that embraces the poverty of the pogrom refugees and the glittering success of the Rothschilds; the eloquence of Prime Minister Disraeli and the spiel of the Petticoat Lane stallholder. Set amid the alleys and back streets of colourful Spitalfields and Whitechapel, it's a tale of synagogues and sweatshops, Sephardim and soup kitchens.

Meet your London Walks guide and fellow walkers by Tower Hill tube station. The Walk ends nearby Liverpool Street station. Then travel to Bethnal Green on the tube to The V&A Museum of Childhood, the largest institution of its kind in the world. It holds numerous toy exhibits featuring rare, hand-crafted objects sitting alongside well-loved toys from the 20th century including a variety of furniture, miniatures, dolls and games. The visit will include a guided tour

as well as free time to peruse the four main galleries.
