Parashat Mishpatim, follows on from the Ten Commandments and introduces a large body of legislation covering everything from murder & manslaughter, negligence & responsibility, people sold into slavery to pay their debts, core principles of the judicial system and an introduction to our Jewish festivals.

When someone is injured, the Torah prescribes five types of compensation that must be paid. 1) depreciation for the damage that has been caused, 2) compensation for the pain, 3) treatment, 4) loss of time or earnings and 5) degradation or embarrassment. The Talmud goes on to elaborate the sophisticated means by which the values for each of these is computed.

The expression that is used by the Parsha to establish responsibility for treatment is וְרָפָא וְרָפָא “Verapo yerapeh” (Shemot 21:8) which can be translated as, “and he paid for his complete cure” or “and make him thoroughly healed.”

From this come two very significant ideas which we quite possibly take for granted in today’s society.

In Parashat Beshallah, Hashem had stated (Shemot 15:21) וְכִי אֶנִּי ה' רֹפֵאֶךָ, for I am Hashem, your healer. We may have thought from this that medicine was Hashem’s exclusive domain, that *all* healing was only in His hands, that it would have been inappropriate or even heretical for us to interfere with healing. There are cultures that believe that all suffering and illness is divine will so that the only appropriate remedy for illness is prayer.

Our Parsha teaches that from a Jewish perspective this is *not* the case. The verse, “Verapo yerapeh” immediately gives doctors the licence to practise medicine. Moreover, in as much as Hashem admits for doctors to heal, there is an implicit invitation for medical expertise and opening for medical knowledge, scientific and study. The simple phrase “Verapo yerapeh” underpins an important argument in how far we are able to progress in all manner of research.

The second significant lesson from “Verapo Yerapeh” is that a fee for healing is billable. We might take that for granted. It is, however, noteworthy that the Torah doesn’t make the assumption that it is such a mitzvah to make people better that no-one should dream of charging for medical services! Of course, *it is* a mitzvah! Nonetheless, those who service and maintain the living *are* entitled to make a living!

In the Mishna we read that King Hezekiah concealed an important tome known as *The Book of Remedies*. According to one opinion this was a volume of medical wisdom. According to another, it contained charms, incantations and potions which would enable speedy recovery from any condition. Assuming the later, the Mishna praises King Hezekiah. If as soon as you are ill, you simply apply a magical remedy, you would never stop to reflect upon the fragility of your body, the responsibility to look after yourself... and for sure, you would never dream of praying for Hashem’s assistance at all.

Even though we are told to entrust medical matters to doctors, we still believe that they are partners and not solely responsible in the healing process. Ultimately, Hashem is our healer and not everything is in human hands. We reinforce this idea when we perform the mitzvah of *Bikkur Cholim* or visiting the sick. This mitzvah is not fulfilled if we simply turn up with chicken soup or grapes and wish the patient better. To perform the mitzvah of *Bikkur Cholim* one must wish the patient that Hashem grant him or her a speedy recovery.

This way we bring a spiritual dimension into the simplest of kindnesses that we perform. We turn kindness into godliness, and we act in the image of Hashem.

To all members and friends who are in hospital or undergoing treatment this week, may Hashem grant you a *refuah shalema betoch shaar cholei Yisrael*, a speedy and complete recovery.

One Day

BBC Radio's Pause for Thought is a two-minute slot in their music programme, reaching 1.5 million people a day through their different shows. Each show has a theme of the week, often tied in with a calendar event. This week's theme, across their programmes has been Holocaust Remembrance Day. Broadcasters encouraged to frame their scripts on the importance of "One Day", with examples on the Holocaust Memorial Trust website.

I was invited to deliver the thought on OJ Borg's Holocaust Remembrance Day programme. I do hope you weren't up when it was broadcast at 2.30am! As well as the recorded pre-broadcast banter – "Have you ever bought something by accident?", we had an interesting non-recorded chat about the significance of IHRD on 27th January and Yom HaShoah 27th Nissan (Shabbat depending).

27th Nissan was adopted in Israel in 1951 as a midpoint between the end of Pesach and Yom HaAtzmaut on 5th Iyar. It was framed around the anniversary of the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising (14th Nissan / Erev Pesach) 1943 to commemorate heroism and resistance, as well as extermination and loss. From 1949, the Fast of 10th Tevet had had Shoah Commemorative events as it has long been identified as the default Memorial Day for post-Temple tragedy and destruction. The Knesset also considered September 1st, which had been the anniversary of the invasion of Poland in 1939.

27th January is the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz by Soviet troops in 1945 and the commemoration was established by 46 governments who met in Stockholm in 2000. It was subsequently recognised by United Nations in Resolution 60/7 in 2005.

Primo Levi recalled the moment of liberation in *The Truce* (1947) "So for us even the hour of liberty rang out grave and muffled, and filled our souls with joy and yet with a painful sense of pudency, so that we should have liked to wash our consciences and our memories clean from the foulness that lay upon them; and also with anguish, because we felt that this should never happen, that now nothing could ever happen good and pure enough to rub out our past, and that the scars of the outrage would remain within us forever, within the memories of those who saw it, and in the places where it occurred and in the stories that we should tell of it."

"I was overwhelmed by a new and vaster suffering, which had been buried and relegated to the margins of consciousness by other, more urgent sufferings: the pain of exile, of my distant home, of solitude, of lost friends, of lost youth, and of the multitude of corpses all around." Shortly after, "I felt closer to the dead than to the living, and guilty for being a man, because men had built Auschwitz." When he attempted to have his story published in English he was rejected by the publisher, "no one wants to hear about this thing."

I don't take it for granted that we can share our story with the world beyond. I see the opportunity is a privilege – but finding the opportunities a duty. This is my Pause for Thought:

There was a chill wind as I led my mother through the gates of Auschwitz. Here was the train platform. Here, the barracks, here the gas chambers, here the crematoria. Here was where it ended.

My mother had never known her grandparents beyond faded photos she had seen and wistful stories she had been told. My grandparents had escaped to England. Hers all perished in the Holocaust; three, here at Auschwitz.

Her father's father, Heinz Lewin, had been quite a character, who lived a colourful life. Born in Wiesbaden in 1888, he was a composer of comic opera, film scores and dance music. My grandfather recalled Heinz working at his piano with a parrot on his shoulder.

Under the Nazis, Heinz could no longer compose under his name. We know he fled to France, where he was interned in a forced labour camp. The camp archives have the programme for a musical evening put on by the prisoners, which he directed. More sombrely, we have the travel manifest recording his deportation to Auschwitz on transport 30, 9th September 1942. A wretched human cargo destined for slaughter. Of 1,000 passengers crammed into cattle wagons, 909 were gassed on arrival.

Composers and scientists, housewives, plumbers, children too young to understand. Their lives extinguished.

I stood with my mother and the ghosts of her family.

But despite the Nazis' evil designs, this is *not* where it ended.

Researching online, we found posters of his musicals. Ten years ago, I obtained the score of one operetta. Played for the first time in 70 years, my mother heard her grandfather's music.

Recently, in Wiesbaden, the municipality dedicated a brass plaque outside the home where Heinz lived. In stark contrast to the stark chill of Auschwitz, we smiled through tears as Heinz' joyous compositions filled the street; songs composed over a century ago with lyrics of passion and a zest for life. On Sunday, the Wiesbaden Council of Christians and Jews featured his music in a memorial concert. In the town of his birth, a commitment to interfaith understanding and harmony.

In taking one day to commemorate the depravity of wasted life in the past, we can celebrate the creativity and spirit of humanity. This inspires me with hope of many better days in our future.
