The Final Encounter?

‘And Pharaoh said to him (Moses), go from me. Be careful not to see my face, for on the day that you see my face you will die. And Moses said, you have spoken well, you will no longer see my face. And God said to Moses, one further plague I will bring on Pharaoh and on Egypt’ (Shemot 10:28-29)...

‘And Moses said, thus said God, at midnight I will go out amongst the midst of the Egyptians.’ (Shemot 11:4)

You might expect that once Moses tells Pharaoh that Pharaoh will no longer see his face, Moses would leave. However, according to Rashi (11:4) and Rashbam (his grandson) in 11:1, God speaks to Moses whilst Moses continues to stand in the presence of Pharaoh! This is also surprising because we read at the end of last week’s Sidra that Moses went outside the city, away from Pharaoh, to pray to God (9:29) as the city was steeped in idolatry, thus being an inappropriate place for Moses to pray (see Rashi there), yet here G-d seems to be speaking to Moses in the epicentre of the city, Pharaoh’s residence.

Although this seems puzzling, verse 4 above seems to bear out Rashi’s opinion. Why does the verse not identify who Moses is speaking to? The answer, according to Rashi, would seem to be that the placement of the verse and its message mean that Moses can only be speaking to Pharaoh.

Therefore, rather than Moses leaving Pharaoh after Pharaoh’s threat, Moses receives a communication from God and also speaks to Pharaoh before leaving, so that both Pharaoh’s threat and Moses’ agreement not to come back to Pharaoh only start after the end of this episode and not in the middle of it. This is also the opinion of Ramban to 10:29.

Ramban (11:1) also quotes a fascinating Midrash that God, so to speak, changed His plans and communicated with Moses whilst Moses was with Pharaoh because Moses had said that he would not return to Pharaoh. This was to make sure that Pharaoh got the message about the plague of the firstborn without Moses reneging on his promise.

Beyond a Plague of Darkness

This Shabbat has been designated as Mental Health Awareness Shabbat by JAMI, “the mental health service for our community”. It is estimated that as many as one in four of us will experience some manifestation of mental illness in the UK in any year. This might be an episode of anxiety or depression, where despite all assurances, we cannot free ourselves from an apprehension or see ourselves clear of self-doubt or self-loathing. We might experience a sudden change of character or mood swing, where our regular, rational and engaging self becomes unpredictable, chaotic, less loveable or monstrous. Sometimes these pass, often they endure.

Historically, many sufferers were forced to the margins of society or banished entirely. Through a lack of medical understanding, designations of insanity or feeble-mindedness and other pejorative labels have been applied to those with a real mental illness or people whose conduct has been unconventional, as well as others society has deemed degenerate.

With our understanding of mental health, now, we see that many people can be restored or helped to happier, self-possessed and fulfilling lives through medication, counselling and the awareness of supportive family and friends. Tragically in very many cases, the stigma or fear of how others might see us prevents us from reaching out. Tragically, in all too many cases, unsupported suffering or a lack of self-worth results in self-harm.

Mental Health Awareness Shabbat calls upon us to be aware of the suffering and the stigma but moreover the support we can offer those around us. With understanding and compassion, with the right treatment and medication, we can often help alleviate someone’s personal plague of darkness or manage the compulsions that imprison them with anxiety or doubt.

Mental illness is very real and not “all in the mind”.

The Talmud (Sanhedrin 73a) explains why doctors are instructed to practice medicine rather than interpret all illness and suffering as Divinely ordained (in which case it would be most unholy to interfere with the will of God!) We are taught “not to stand by the blood of

our neighbour” (Vayikra 19:16) – we are required to intercede to save a life. We are required, also, to return lost property when we find it (Devarim 22:2). If God desires the restoration of a missing sheep or donkey, how much more so are we enjoined to restore someone’s sight, hearing or deficient capacity when we have the means. It is a mitzvah to restore someone to being him or herself.

Depression, Schizophrenia, OCD, Bipolar disorders and other mental illnesses leave the sufferer and those around them at a loss. It behoves us who may experience episodes of mental illness to be aware that we are not defective and should not feel shame. We have an illness which should be examined and treated. It behoves us who may encounter suffering in friends and family or in colleagues and associates to be aware; it behoves us to reach out and offer support to a fellow human being.

To blind ourselves to suffering; to label and discriminate against people who are unwell is truly shameful. To be aware, understanding and supportive is a mitzvah.

Please help us create a safe and supportive environment in our community.

May 2019 be a healthy year where we look after ourselves.

THIS WEEK'S HAFTORAH BY RABBI ANDREWS

In this week's Haftorah, the prophet Yirmiya (Jerimiah) speaks of the same world events as last week's, though our previous reading was from sefer Yechezkel (Book of Ezekiel). Apparently, Nevuchadnetzar's (Nebuchadnezzar) conquest of Mitzrayim (Egypt) inspired both nevi'im (prophets), living hundreds of miles apart, Yechezkel in Bavel (Babylon) and Yirmiya still in Israel.

These two prophecies are markedly different. In last week's haftarah, Yechezkel focused on Egypt, her egotistic view of herself, and the comeuppance headed her way. For Yirmiya, on the other hand, the conquest is reflected back to the Jewish people. He encouraged them by saying that God will not abandon them nor should they fear a similar outcome as the Egyptians.

I think the difference between the prophecies stems from where the two prophets were living. Yechezkel, already in Bavel, was removed from events in Egypt; they might be interesting on the scale of world events, but not urgently or directly vital to him.

For Yirmiya, though, the fall of Egypt was a significant step towards the Destruction itself. The Jews had relied on their alliance with Paroh (Pharaoh) and repeatedly turned to Egypt for assistance with attackers. Instead of viewing the Nile valley nation as an ancient enemy, the Jews saw it as a source of salvation. For Yirmiya, their defeat drives home the point about allies and who the Jews should turn to for protection.

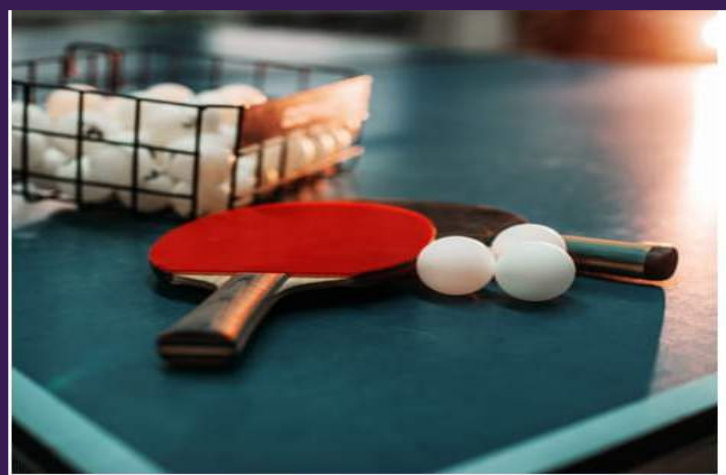

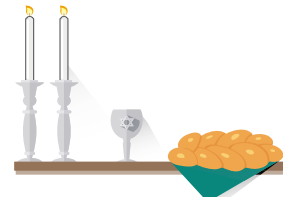

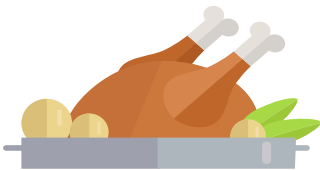
