This week's parsha (Torah portion) of Mitzorah begins with the purification process of a mitzorah, sometimes translated as a leper. The Midrash (Books of Lore) and Talmud both explain that this "leprosy" is a result of lashon hara (evil gossip or tale mongering).

The book Kochav MiYaakov explains that since lashon hara is considered such a serious sin that Chazal (the Rabbis) even warn against spreading praise of another. Their concern is that while extolling one's virtues, we may come to reveal their shortcomings.

Chazal warn us against making any statement that may verge on lashon hara. Therefore, one should not say that "the oven is always on in the home of so-and-so" even to imply that the family is hospitable and perpetually preparing food for guests. Such a statement might be construed by others to mean that the family is hedonistic and continually eating.

"...he shall be brought to the priest. And the cohen (priest) shall go forth out of the camp..." (Vayikra/ Leviticus 14:2-3)

The work Shem MiShmuel (Rabbi Shmuel Bornsztain, the second Sochatchover Rebbe, between the years 1910-1926) writes that this passuk (verse) implies that the mitzorah, even while he is still outside the camp, should be compelled by his own free will to repent and come to the cohen in order to be purified. It is in response to this personal resolve to become tahor (pure from ritual impurity) that the priest accepts him and this way brought closer to the state of purity.

Only after the mitzorah has decided to rouse himself, to take decisive action leading to teshuva (repentance) and purity, shall the "Cohen (priest) go forth out of the camp" to purify him. People must raise themselves before they can expect reciprocation from Shamayim (Heaven)

I found the above sources in the writings of Rabbi Isaac Bernstein. I hope they add as much to your appreciation of the parsha as they did for me.

Shabbat HaGadol

The former Rishon Letziyon, or Sephardi Chief Rabbi of Israel, Rav Ovadiyah Yosef, writes in his responsa that we call today Shabbat HaGadol, the “Great Shabbat”, because on this day the Rabbi delivers a great sermon, an enormous sermon.

On this Shabbat before Pesach, people come to shul knowing, expecting... that the Rabbi will give a an extensive drasha, which will be involved and it will be complex. The Rabbi must speak about *Biur Chametz*, the disposal of chametz, about *Shmirat haMatzot*, the guarding of the matza, about the laws of Yom Tov and Chol Hamoed, the festive days and the intermediate days, about the conduct of the Seder service and about the greatness of Hashem.

It will be a long drasha, he writes, but people come “*she-im achshayv lo yishma’u*” for if they don’t hear it now, “*Eymatai?*” When?

In fact, a Rabbi was traditionally required to preach on two Shabbatot in the year, six months apart. A Rabbi must preach on *Shabbat Shuva* - between Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur, when he will talk about penitence, atonement and spiritual development. And the Rabbi speaks the Shabbat before Pesach, on *Shabbat HaGadol*, when he talks about halacha, and halacha and halacha.

If your reaction is “What does Rav Ovadiyah mean, people come to shul knowing... if only we had known... then we would have stayed at home. Shabbat Hagadol, the Great British Lie In!” If that is your reaction “if only we had known...”, then just, for one moment consider, what else there might be to know.

It is, after all, the opinion of many commentators, that when we talk about *biyur chametz*, destroying the leaven and *shmirat hamatza*, guarding the unleavened bread, making sure that it doesn’t rise, that we must understand these terms on a symbolic level. We must get rid of our own inflated views, our puffs, enlargements, self-aggrandisement and elevated egos. We must rid ourselves of selfishness, the fact that we are larger than life, oh so clever in our own eyes. *Biyur chametz*.

What is important? It is the *shmirat hamatza*, the painstaking care to guarantee the basics, the integrity of the core ingredients, the nitty gritty. The kashering and the cleaning, the covering and the cooking must all be done just so. The freedom we celebrate on Pesach is a freedom of opting in, taking charge of our destiny. We do that by looking in every corner of our lives and homes, a careful, microscopic scrutiny.

One might think that one could stand back and shine a spotlight, pick out the chametz in the glare. But no! We hold a candle close, we look through the flickering and feel the texture of our surroundings. We cannot judge the chametz of our lives from afar. We hold a candle close, so close that we can feel the texture, so close that we can pick up the chametz and secrete it away for burning.

As for *shmirat hamatza* - from the point that the grains are harvested and begin to dry - we watch over them, make sure that they do not become wet or corrupted. We watch over the grinding and the sifting, the adding of still water and the kneading into dough. As we bring up our families, we watch over their development, see how they are moulded, pressed and influenced - because as we do that, we ensure that they reflect the core values. As we bring up ourselves, we must *shomer*, supervise the environment we build around us.

If we don’t, we rise, this way and that, maybe a little, maybe a lot, but if we don’t watch, or perhaps we don’t even know what we’re watching for - then we won’t be kosher for Pesach.

If we don’t know what Jewish life is about, if we don’t conduct ourselves Jewishly, if our homes are not Jewish environments, then our kids will not grow into *shmurah matzot* or *shomrei mitzvot*. When our kids make their own Seder, if they do, there won’t be a wise and a wicked and a simple child at the table. There will be *four* lovely children, who don’t know what to ask. And just as well, because the parent won’t begin to know what to answer.

My Shabbat Hagadol Drasha will be on Shabbat Afternoon after Mincha (7.20pm) entitled “What’s with all the Questions?”

Wednesday Evening (17th April) we will be running **Hagalat Kelim** and Libbun, to kasher cutlery, kiddush cups, oven racks etc on the evening of Weds 17th April (7-10 pm).

Thursday night (18th April) is Bedikat Chametz. As soon as possible after nightfall, take a candle and a feather and a wooden spoon, turn off the lights, go through the kitchen cupboards and the drawers, the sideboard, all those places where we store food and drink, all the extra places where the kids store them for us... the car, under the sofa cushions and look really carefully. Is there chametz there?

If it seems a fruitless exercise, just reflect that we never normally think about Hashem or being Jewish when we access those places normally. Just think how much room there is to be Jewish in all those areas that we let the chametz in, but that Hashem never gets to touch. Correctly, one should not talk during the search nor be distracted. Peer in close.

Spiritually and physically, we can never spend next year in Jerusalem if we spend Seder night without any real intention to leave Egypt, if we leave the personal chametz to rise and we aren’t *shomer* our *mitzvahs* or our *matzahs*.

The Siyum for the Fast of the First Born will be Friday Morning 7.45am. That is the very latest that you can hand me Sale of Chametz forms. (A clarification from last week’s Kol Kinloss. The Fast of the First Born moves to Thursday when Seder night is Saturday Night.)

Wishing you a Shabbat Shalom and safe travels to those going away.

THIS WEEK'S HAFTORAH BY RABBI ANDREWS

This week's Haftorah is from the third chapter of Malachi. The Navi (prophet) proclaims to the nation that the ultimate redemption awaits. The time will come when the evil and the arrogant will be destroyed, and the righteous will prevail.

We read this special Haftorah this week not due to a connection with this week's Parsha, but, rather, because this is the last Shabbat before Pesach. Just as the nation was redeemed from Mitzrayim (Egypt) over three thousand years ago on Passover, so too, our Haftorah tells us, will Eliyahu Hanavi (Elijah the prophet) announce the coming of Mashiach in the future redemption.

The twenty-second verse underscores the Torah foundations for all prophets and prophecies. A true Navi is the one who "remembers the Torah of Moshe, Hashem's servant". Any Navi that contradicts Moshe's Torah is by definition a "false prophet". Many false prophets and Messiahs have arisen throughout history. The only true Messiah will be the one heralded by the true prophet Eliyahu as he proclaims the "coming of the great and awesome day of God".

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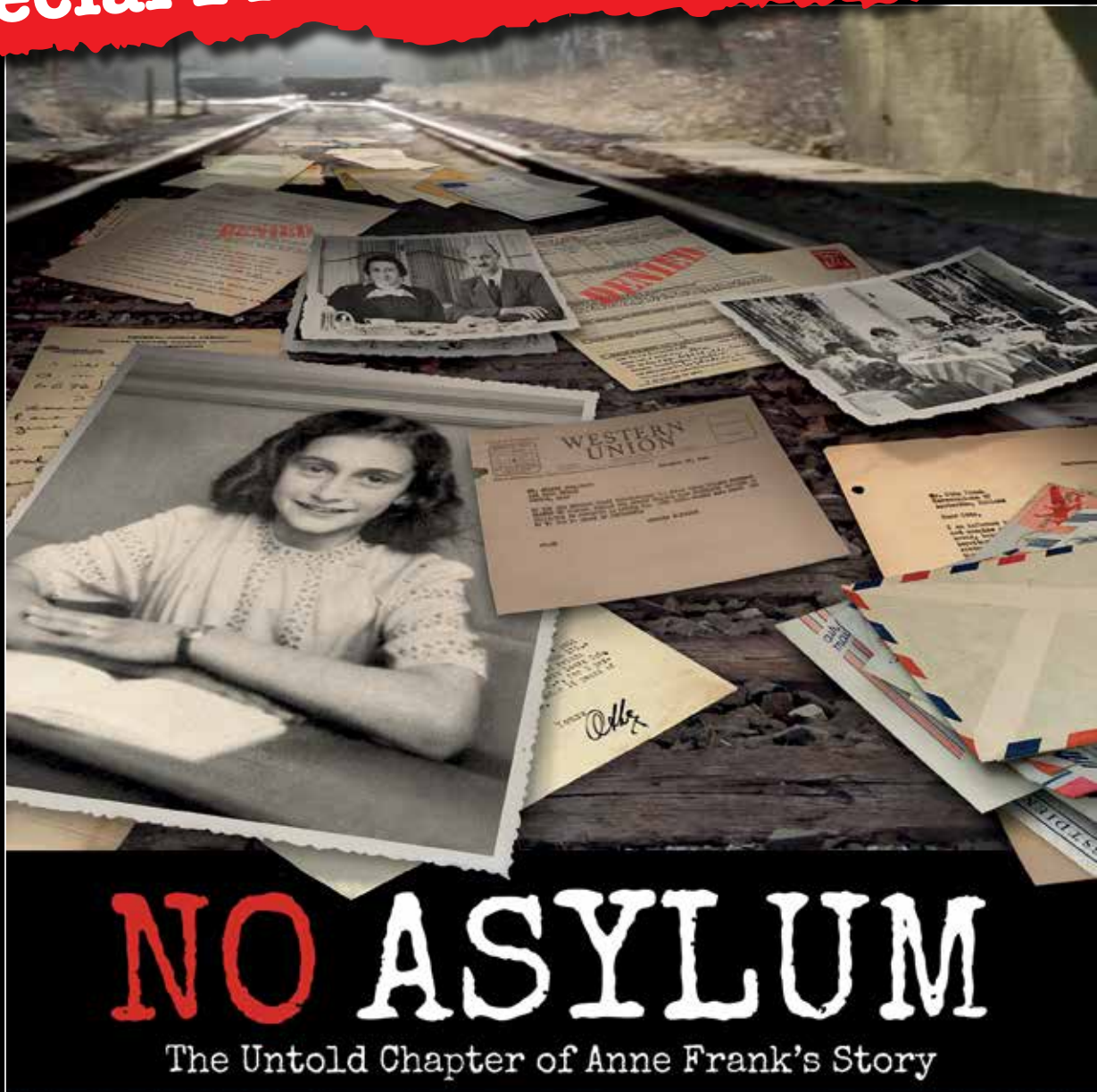

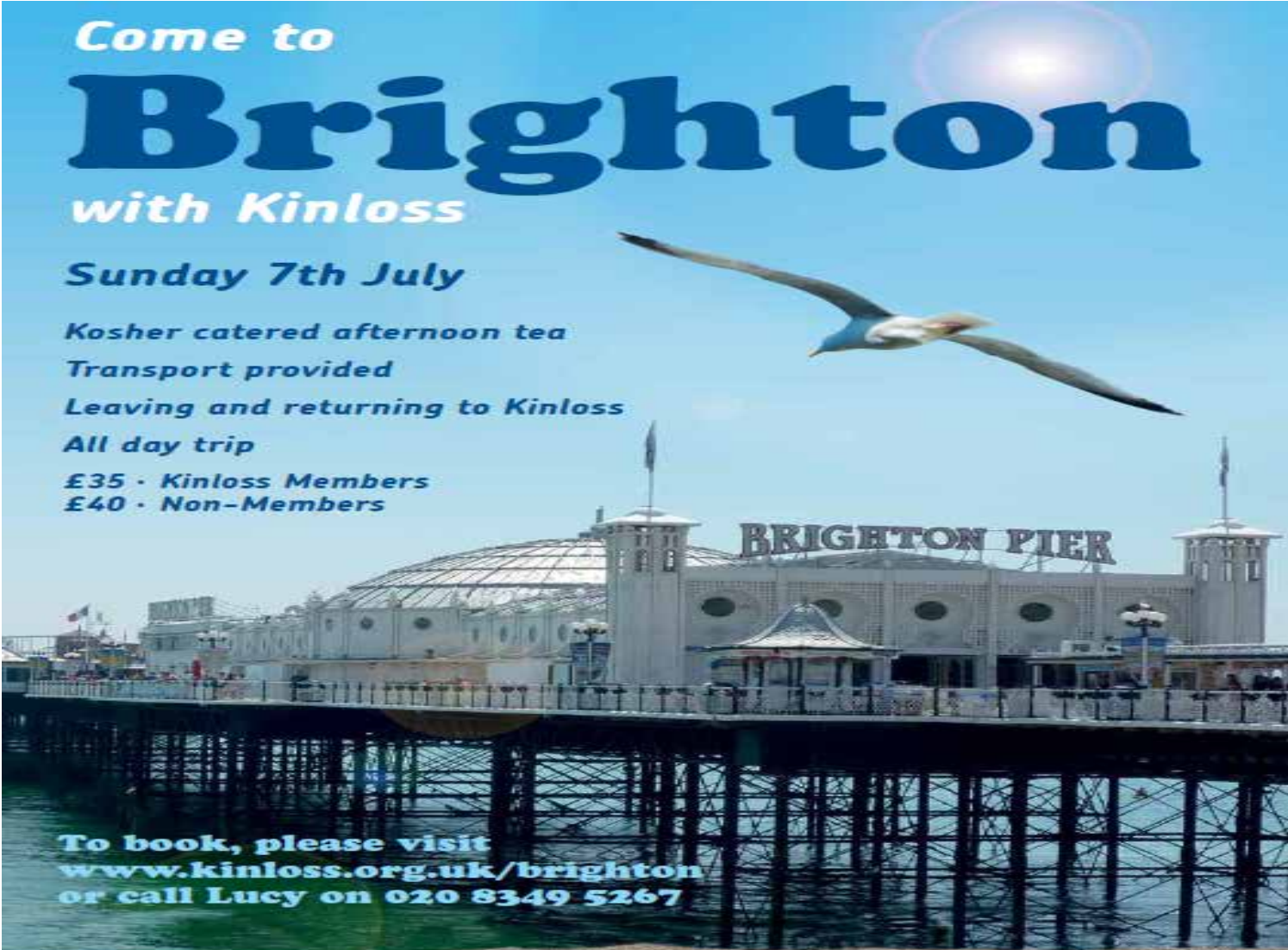
