Small Details Count – Leora and Harry Salter

Parashat Pekudei is the final Sedra to talk about the building of the Mishkan. Terumah, Tetzaveh, Vayakel and Pekudei all speak about the building of the Mishkan, making a home for G-d. However, this week's Sedra seems to repeat what has already been said in previous Parashiot.

The beginning of Parashat Pekudei says (Chapter 38, Verse 21): "These are the accounting scandal of the Mishkan, the Mishkan of the Testimony, which were counted at the word of Moshe; the work of the Levites in the hand of Ithamar, son of Aaron the Kohen". Rishon continues this theme of summarising what the Mishkan was and how Betzalel built it in the vision of Hashem. The remainder of the Parasha again goes through how different objects in the Mishkan were made.

Why does this week's Sedra continue to list how different items were made for the 4th time?

If we compare the beginning of Sefer Bereshit to the end of Sefer Shemot we can learn a key lesson. The beginning of Sefer Bereshit, Hashem creates the world and everything on the world. This is Hashem bringing Himself onto land to show His greatness.

At the end of Sefer Shemot, man is building things to bring more of G-d into the world. The Mishkan was created so Hashem can rest with the Jewish people. But this was not made by G-d, this was made by man. The chiastic structure highlights that it is now mankind's job to bring Hashem into the world.

This idea can help answer the question raised at the beginning. The nitty gritty details of the making of the objects are mentioned again to show that the details are important. The ultimate goal of the Mishkan was for G-d to rest and bring glory to the Bnei Yisrael. However, the Bnei Yisrael had to go through a process of making things perfectly so that they could reach the final goal.

Rav Adin Steinsaltz Z"l asks a question on Parashat Yitro and Mishpatim. He asks that in Parashat Yitro we have the astonishing miracle of Mount Sinai and the giving of the 10 commandments but the Sedra after is Parashat Mishpatim which goes through the pain staking laws. Why does this happen?

He answers that even though the Bnei Yisrael saw miracles at Mount Sinai, they didn't believe just because of the miracles, they believed because of what followed. Parashat Mishpatim has the small details which are needed for people to continue in their genuine spiritual growth. Big miracles can inspire us to do great things but when we do the small laws and grow as a servant of G-d is when we properly believe.

This thought applies to Parashat Pekudei as well. The small details are mentioned for us, and not just Betzalel, because it highlights just how important small details are. We always need to remember how we got to a certain goal or achievement because that is how our belief in G-d becomes stronger.

“Nazism is born in silence. Therefore, shout about the killings of civilians...”



Last Shabbat in shul, I highlighted the Ukrainian towns and villages where Chassidism began. The Baal Shem Tov, (Yisrael ben Eliezer c1698-1760) was born in Okopy, part of the Kingdom of Poland in his day. It is 200km from Lviv and 300 km southwest of Kyiv. It is very much a part of contemporary Ukraine. We learned from the masters and dynasties he inspired including tLeib Yitzchak miBerdichev, (1740-1809) and read a prayer for peace attributed to his great-grandson, R' Nachman of Bratslav (1772-1810).

The liturgy, literature and niggunim of Jewish Ukraine live on and inspire around the Jewish world.

Pre-Covid pilgrimages to Uman, the resting place of R' Nachman drew up to 40,000 a year for Rosh Hashana. The ancient custom of visiting one's Rebbe for Rosh Hashana was one that that R' Nachman particularly encouraged in his own lifetime. His disciple R' Nosson (R' Nathan Sternharz) encouraged the continuation of the "Rosh Hashana Kibbutz" which has run since 1811. From 1917 till the second world War access was banned by the Russians, though there were occasional risky and clandestine pilgrimages. Devotees returned in 1948 and the numbers have soared since 2,000.

Ukraine has been a region of vibrant Jewish life and thought, but as President Volodymyr Zelensky reminded us in his impassioned speech this week, it has also been the locus of violent Jewish death.

In the heart of Kyiv lies the ravine of Babi Yar. On 26 September 1942 a notice was posted in German, Ukrainian and Russian calling on "all the Jews of the city of Kiev and its vicinity [to] appear on 29 September, by 8 o'clock ... at the corner of Mel'nikova and Dokterivskaya... Bring documents, money and valuables, and also warm clothing, linen, etc. Any Jews who do not follow this order and are found elsewhere will be shot..."

Rounded up, on 29-30 September 1942, around 33,770 Jews were made to undress and stand in rows in front of the ravine and were shot. Some were made to lie on top of the dead bodies and were shot. The corpses and anyone left moving was shot.

Survivor testimony from the few who managed to literally crawl out from under layers of dead bodies after nightfall is chilling. In total around 100,000 were slain and then buried in Babi Yar. In 1944, Paul Blobel, the commander of the Einsatzkommando that directed the massacre, ordered Russian prisoners to dig up and cremate the corpses in an attempt to conceal the atrocity. Blobel was sentenced to death at the Einsatzgruppen Trial at Nuremberg.

In August 1961, the Russian poet Yevgeny Yevtushenko met the writer and eyewitness to the massacre Anatoly Kuznetsov. Kuznetsov took him to the site of the ravine. Yevtushenko was profoundly moved.

"I was expecting to see some sign of respect. But what I saw was absolutely terrible - there were lots of trucks and they were unloading stinking garbage on the tens of thousands of people who were killed. I did not expect that. As soon as I got back to my hotel, I sat down and I began to write - it took probably four or five hours, no more. Most of my poetry is based on either love and tenderness or on shame. It was desperation - shame came to dictate this poem..."

"No monument stands over Babi Yar. A steep cliff only, like the rudest headstone. I am afraid. Today, I am as old as the entire Jewish race itself..."

... Wild grasses rustle over Babi Yar, the trees look sternly, as if passing judgement. Here, silently, all screams, and, hat in hand, I feel my hair changing shade to grey. And I myself, like one long soundless scream, above the thousands of thousands interred. I'm every old man executed here, As I am every child murdered here..."

Shostakovich's 13th Symphony was set as an anthem on the poem. It led to a monument to the Russian dead being erected in 1976. Only after the dissolution of the Soviet Union in 1991 was a monument erected to the Jewish victims.

On 1st March 2022, that monument and the cemetery was hit by a Russian missile.

"Last night we were all bombed in Kyiv. And we all died again in Babyn Yar - from a missile attack ... I am now addressing all the Jews of the world - can't you see what is happening? Therefore, it is very

important that now millions of Jews around the world won't be silent. Nazism is born in silence. Therefore, shout about the killings of civilians. Shout about the killings of Ukrainians..."

Next week is Shabbat Zachor. But we shouldn't wait till then to remember...

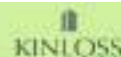
