From Hoshea to Yehoshua...

‘...And Moses called Hoshea bin Nun Yehoshua (Joshua)’ (Bemidbar 13, 16)

Why is Moses’ renaming of Hoshea to Joshua recorded at this point? Why was there a need for this name change?

There is a precedent for a name change, from Avraham who was originally called Avram but whose names was changed to show that he was the father of a multitude of nations (Bereishit 17,5). Joshua, however, has previously been mentioned in the Torah as ‘Yehoshua’, and not Hosea. He is called ‘Yehoshua’ when described as Moses’ assistant in last week’s Sidra, Beha’alotecha (Bemidbar 11,28), and when choosing soldiers to fight against the evil tribe of Amalek (Shemot 17,9).

Rashi, the premier Torah commentator, explains that the phrase ‘called’ is a verb of prayer in this context and not a verb of simple calling. Moses prayed that Joshua would be saved from the evil counsel of the negative spies. To assist Joshua, Moses’ prayer invoked the extra letter ‘hei’ which changes Hoshea to Yehoshua, and put together with the letter ‘yud’ at the start of Yehoshua makes a Name of G-d, to add the blessing of that Name to Yehoshua.

But why did Calev, the other good spy, not receive the same blessing? Perhaps Calev, who when arriving in Israel went alone to Me’arat Hamachpela (the burial ground of Abraham and family in Hebron) to pray for a successful mission, could rely on this merit.

For Yehoshua, another method was appropriate. Moses, when praying during the fight against Amalek, had invoked the Name of ‘yud, hei’. This provided merit for Yehoshua, who was heavily involved in protecting the Am Yisrael during that battle, and it was thus appropriate for Yehoshua to use that merit again, so Moses prayed for him, through use of the phrase Yehoshua, to request for extra merit for his student.

Grasshoppers: Self Perception, Reality & Leadership

Parshat Shlach Lecha, tells of that fateful episode when Moshe sent the Twelve Spies into the Land of Israel.

They were princes of their tribes, men of stature, charged to check out if the land was as good and as bounteous as Hashem had promised. Was it fat or lean, where did the people live; what were their defences?

The twelve toured the land and returned laden with beautiful fruit.

They had factual answers to all of Moshe's questions. But of the twelve, ten were adamant that the conquest of the land would be impossible. Only Joshua and Caleb were confident that Hashem, who had brought them thus far, would sustain them further.

The ten slanderous spies embellished their tale. "We saw giants in the land," they related. "We were in our own eyes as grasshoppers, and so were we in their eyes." **וְנָהֵי בְעֵינֵינוּ כְּחַגְבִּים וְכֵן הָיוּ בְעֵינֵיהֶם (Bemidbar 13:33)**

It is a telling and graphic image. Moshe had imagined that their safe return, and the confirmation the land was flowing with milk and honey would raise the spirits of the Children of Israel. But he hadn't anticipated grasshoppers.

We were in our own eyes as grasshoppers – and so were we in their eyes! This is emotional propaganda – proto-"Project Fear".

Moshe had banked on the facts. But the ten coloured the plain facts with emotion.

The late 15th century commentator Ovadia Sforno notes the impact of the **בְּעֵינֵינוּ / בְּעֵינֵיהֶם** *b-aynaynu* "our eyes" / *b-aynahem* "their eyes" comparison.

In *our eyes* we were grasshoppers; we saw ourselves as inferior, worthless and unable to measure up to them. We lacked confidence.

And what of their eyes? In *their eyes* we were grasshoppers; we were so insignificant that they didn't even bother with the dozen of us. Perhaps, though, an invading swarm would be squashed like insects.

At first blush, the spies' account seems so difficult to fathom.

They had witnessed a year of miracles in Egypt and the wilderness. They had heard Hashem and they had been fed on manna. Why did they imagine that Hashem would abandon them now?

It is suggested that separation from Hashem was precisely their fear. Hashem had promised to bring them out of Egypt and sustain them and bring them to the land. Now they were about to enter the chapters of personal responsibility in the Torah.

Just consider what Hashem had said: When you come to the land you will do this... When you come to the land you will do that... The miraculous nurturing by Hashem and Moshe they were used to would be supplanted by the need to stand on their own feet – and they were frightened of the challenge.

There is another explanation, too. In the wilderness, our princes were princes simply by virtue of their lineage. They could bask in their seniority while there was nothing they had to actually do. However, when they came into the land, upon them would fall the management of the people. They would be charged with personal responsibility – and accountability. But so, too, would every Israelite.

It is easy to be princes in the Wilderness; and men of stature when nobody has any expectations... but when they came into the land, they knew they would be nobodies unless they measured up. It wasn't so easy... lacking confidence and resolve, they knew that they were shirkers – grasshoppers in their own eyes... It wouldn't be long till they were unmasked as mere grasshoppers in the eyes of everyone else.

Of course, modesty is a virtue and it is important that we have a realistic self-image. However, our leaders cannot be grasshoppers in their own sight, nor in eyes of others. May we be blessed with leaders who are men and women of stature, people of clear vision, who look through the eyes of Hashem.

Luciana Berger was elected as the Member of Parliament for Liverpool Wavertree in 2010. Since then, she has held various shadow ministerial positions, including Shadow Minister for Energy and Climate Change, Shadow Minister for Public Health and was the first ever Shadow Cabinet Minister for Mental Health.

Luciana is a member of the Health and Social Care Select Committee. She had previously served as the Parliamentary Chair of the Jewish Labour Movement before her departure from the Labour Party in February. She now sits with The Independent Group of MPs.

Luciana is an advisory board member of the Money and Mental Health Policy Institute, a Vice President of the British Association of Counselling and Psychotherapy, a Vice President of the Jewish Leadership Council and an honorary fellow of the University of Liverpool's Heseltine Institute.

Luciana has received a number of awards for her work including the Jo Cox Memorial Award for Bravery & Heroism at the #No2H8 Crime Award in September 2018, and the Jewish Care Woman of Distinction Award 2019. She was featured in the 2019 Vogue 25 - a list of 25 'high-powered and visionary women whose work is shaping Britain's future.'
