An Aron (Ark) Which Bears U, All

'And you (*plural*) shall make the Ark out of acacia wood...' (Shemot 25:10)

Why have we highlighted the plural? Hebrew is a language which distinguishes between singular and plural verbs. As English does not make this distinction, a reading of this week's Sidra in English translation will not pick up on the fact that the instruction to build the Aron (ark) in the Mishkan (Tabernacle, the portable desert Shul), is given in the *plural*.

Contrastingly, instructions for other Mishkan appurtenances such as the covering of the Aron itself (25:11), the Kaporet (golden cover) (25:17), the Keruvim (Cherubims) (25:18) and the Shulchan (Table) (25:23) are all given in the *singular*. What might lie behind this?

Rabbi Moshe ben Nachman (**Ramban**, 1190-1274), writes that the plural used in our quoted verse is linked to the first section of the Sidra, verses 1-9, which refer to the Jewish people as a whole and discuss the general communal role in constructing the Mishkan. As such, verses 1-9 also contain plural verbs and our verse therefore does too. Ramban explains that perhaps all of the Jewish people had a share in the construction of the Aron, rather than the specific constructors who assembled the other appurtenances of the Mishkan.

Furthermore, as the Torah explains in 25:21-22, the Aron had the Keruvim on top of it and that spot between the Keruvim was the place where Moses heard communication from God, as Rashi notes at verse 22. This communication was, ultimately, for the whole of the people via Moses.

Ramban continues, quoting the Midrash (earliest Rabbinic commentaries on the Torah) that the Aron was a contribution from all of the people, not from any specific group. As the Aron was a place that Torah was taught from, it was more specifically linked to the people as a whole rather than just to a cadre who were more intricately involved in the Mishkan, either as officiants or as constructors of specific pieces of the Mishkan.

Perhaps with the above ideas in mind, Ramban also explains the plural used in the instruction to build the Aron as signifying that those who associate with the Aron will merit greatness in Torah observance and study as a result of their efforts and association.

Ramban's message resonates today, especially for those who associate themselves with synagogue communities such as ours and all facets of Torah observance within them, be those caring, educational, social or any of the ways that the Torah applies in every walk of life.

A Mixed-up Month

The Talmud teaches that as we enter the month of Av, we should diminish our joy in anticipation of the solemnity of Tisha B'Av and the destruction of our Temples and exile. Conversely, as we come into Adar, we should increase in joy. This is the month of salvation. The victory over Haman also paved the way for the return to Israel from exile in Bavel and the building of the Second Temple under Ezra and Nechemia.

The Sfas Emes (R' Yehuda Arie Leib Alter 1847-1905) the 3rd Gerrer Rebbe draws a parallel between Adar and Ellul. Just as Ellul precedes the Rosh Hashana month of Tishrei, the High Holy Days and judgement; so, too, Adar precedes the "New Year" of Nissan. Nissan is identified as the new year for kings' reigns, dating contracts and is also considered the month of creation. Ellul precedes as a month of Teshuva MeYirah (repentance of awe, reverence and fear). The Sfas Emes writes that Adar precedes Nisan as a month of Teshuva MeAhava (repentance of love and companionship). Purim in Adar is the festival of giving Mishloach Manot and Matanot LeEvyonim, of sharing and supporting.

Adar is the month that "doubles up" in a Leap Year (The 3rd, 6th, 8th, 11th, 14th, 17th, and 19th years of the 19-year "Metonic" cycle are leap years. 5782 is the 6th year of the current cycle. The next leap year will be 5784. In a leap year, Purim is in Adar Sheini (it is always a month before Pesach). However, there is a discussion to be had about which is the "real" Adar and which is the "added" one.

Adar I and Adar II both have two days Rosh Chodesh.



Chart for calculating the Molad. The Molad is notionally the time that Jerusalem, the New Moon and Sun are in alignment. Subject for another essay.

The leap year creates some confusion over marking anniversaries and Yahrzeits. Where a bereavement has happened in Adar Sheini in a leap year, we observe the Yahrzeit on the same day in Adar Rishon. However, when it happens in Adar of a regular year, most Ashkenazim observe it in Adar Rishon (some say Kaddish also in Adar Sheini). Most Sephardim observe the

Nachala in Adar Sheini.

Zayin Adar (7th Adar), is the Yahrzeit (and birthday) of Moshe Rabbeinu. As we learn in Devarim 34:6, Moshe was buried by Hashem, himself.



וַיִּקְבֹּר אֱתֹנוּ בְּגִל בְּאַרְצָא מוֹאָב מִזֵּית בֵּית פְּעֹר וְלֹא יָדָע אִישׁ אֶת־קִבְרֹתָיו עַד הַיּוֹם הַזֶּה: The day is traditionally observed as one of recognition of the Chevra Kaddisha, the blessed *klei kodesh* of our community who attend to the dead, wash, clothe and bury them. They fast on Zayin Adar and break the fast with a celebratory banquet in the evening.

In a Leap Year, Zayin Adar is marked by most communities on Adar Sheini (but some also observe the first).

The work of the Chevra Kaddisha is described as *Chesed Shel Emmet* אמת של חסד and is considered particularly Godly. It is the ultimate altruism; care for an individual who can express no gratitude. It shows a love of humanity and as we consider our mortality, it is also a labour of profound humility. How much we appreciate the volunteer men and women of our community who serve on the Chevra; who make themselves available as is necessary and who care for deceased members without distinguishing, rich or poor, observant or secular, saint or scoundrel. (I write generically: None of our members are scoundrels!) I do know that there is always call for more volunteers and invite anyone who would like to know more, or who might like to witness a Tahara (washing and preparation of a body for burial) with a view to potentially joining the Chevra to contact me.

Birthdays in a common year are celebrated in the Adar Sheini of a Leap year. Birthdays in Adar Sheini are observed in Adar of a common year. A consequence of this is that if two babies Ari and Zev are born a week apart in a leap year on 25th Adar Rishon (Ari) and 2nd Adar Sheini (Zev) respectively, but their Bar Mitzvah 13 years on is a common year, then Zev's birthday will be on 2nd Adar and the older Ari's will be three weeks later on 25th Adar.

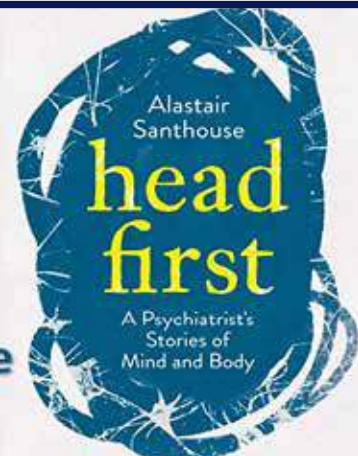
