Making Shabbat All Week Long

In shul every Friday night and as we make kiddush every Shabbat morning, we recite verses from Parashat Ki Tissa:

וְשָׁמְרוּ בְנֵי יִשְׂרָאֵל אֶת הַשַּׁבָּת לַעֲשׂוֹת אֶת הַשַּׁבָּת לְדֹרֹתָם בְּרִית עוֹלָם: בֵּינִי וּבֵין בְּנֵי יִשְׂרָאֵל אוֹת הוּא לְעֹלָם כִּי שֵׁשֶׁת יָמִים עָשָׂה ה' אֶת הַשָּׁמַיִם וְאֶת הָאָרֶץ וּבַיּוֹם הַשְּׁבִיעִי שָׁבַת וַיִּנָּפֶשׂ:

“The children of Israel shall observe the sabbath, to make the sabbath and eternal covenant for the generations. Between me and the children of Israel is a sign for ever that in six days Hashem made heaven and earth and on the seventh day he rested and was refreshed.” (Exodus 31: 16-17)

The preceding verses have already delineated the idea of six days of work and refraining from labour on the seventh. So, what do the words *Veshamru* (they shall observe) and *La’asot* (to make) add to our understanding? Furthermore, the idea of making anything of durability (let alone for all generations) seems to contradict the restfulness of the day.

Ibn Ezra (d1167) writes that *Veshamru* teaches that we should keep track of the days of the week so that we do not forget when Shabbat will fall; and that particularly on a Friday, we should ensure that everything that needs to be prepared for Shabbat is ready, so that we do not come to violate it.

He compares the *La’asot* with Abraham’s alacrity in preparation of food for the angels (Bereshit 18:7) וַיִּמְהָר לַעֲשׂוֹת אוֹתוֹ. Our verse instructs zealous readiness.

Further, Ibn Ezra admonishes that we must protect our rest from potential action. Therefore, one

should ensure that food is ready before the onset of Shabbat. Moreover, one should not set off on a Friday if there is a risk that one might become delayed and come to violate Shabbat through having placed ourselves in a difficult position.

Rabbenu Bechaya (d1340) explains that everyone who observes (shomer) Shabbat in this lower world compares to one creating it (oseh) in the world above. כל המשמר השבת מלמטה כאלו עשה אותה. The *La’asot* is an act of establishing enduring testimony in one’s acknowledgement and belief in Hashem.

There are different minhagim around standing and sitting for kiddush. The standing represents Edut, (testimony) while the sitting represents the meal ahead.

It is clear from the many memories that children have of their parents and grandparents making Kiddush, that the ritual does establish an enduring demonstrative and memorable commitment to Shabbat. Moreover, many share stories of friendships and relationships been forged through guests and visitors brought home for kiddush.

The Netziv (d1893) explains that בְּרִית עוֹלָם the eternal covenant is achieved through us working a measured week in readiness for a restful Shabbat; and on Shabbat Hashem then extends a blessing to us for provision in the week ahead.

Making Shabbat is an all-week-long activity but with results that stand for all time.

A Loyal Patriotic Citizen

It was a pleasure to interview Judge Barrington Black, to enjoy his rich legal experience; his early days as a criminal defence solicitor, through to a distinguished career as a circuit judge and a Supreme Court justice in Gibraltar.



We take it for granted, today, that the legal profession abounds with Jewish lawyers. It was not always thus.

It was only in 1858, with the passage of the Jews Relief Act, that Jews were allowed to enter Parliament and hold offices, such as in the judiciary, previously closed to them because they could not swear the oath, "and I make this Declaration upon the true Faith of a Christian". Lionel Rothschild had been elected to the City of London constituency in the general elections of 1847 and 1852 but had not been able to take his seat in Parliament.

Previous attempts at legal emancipation in 1833 had failed, amidst quite acrimonious parliamentary debate. (Catholics had only been admitted into Parliament under the Catholic Relief Act in 1829).

The first Jewish QC was Sir Francis Henry Goldsmid, who took silk in 1858. His family were more conspicuously observant than many Jews in public life. Francis was one of the founders of JFS. His father, Sir Isaac Lyon Goldsmid was a successful banker, a founder of University College London and University College Hospital.



Amidst controversy and some opposition, Francis had been granted personal dispensation from swearing the Christian oath of allegiance when called to the bar in 1833. He became member of Parliament for Reading in 1860 and died in an accident at Waterloo station in 1878 "after falling between the platform and the carriage from which he was alighting." His final and enduring contribution to English law might be that the jury in the inquest to his death recommended that footboards of trains should be made level with the platform.

In his obituary, it was noted that, "it was his desire that the Hebrew should make it evident to the world at large that a rigid observer of Mosaism, a loyal patriotic citizen, capable of serving his country in every office... does meet and combine in the same individual." (The term "Judaism" is first found in English in 1516 and in an English translation of the Apocrypha in 1611 but did not become widespread until centuries later.

The Jewish contribution to English law can be traced in different strands, and these do date back long before Sir Francis Henry Goldsmid. Tenets of Torah teaching underpin much jurisprudence; righteous judgement, cleanliness from corruption, not to be awed by the rich or ignore the poor, nor

to favour the poor because of their deficiency. "Justice, justice, shalt thou follow."



In his book, Judge Black recalls his horror at being told by the prosecution counsel that, "your honour, this is a brown envelope case." The prosecutor then explained that he had an envelope containing confidential particulars of 'help' that the defendant had given to the police, and these should mitigate the sentence he was about to deliver!

Laws about Jews date back to Norman times with limits on where they could live and how they could trade.

Henry I (1068-1135) proclaimed, "Be it known that all Jews, wheresoever they may be in the realm, are of right under the tutelage and protection of the King; ... Jews and all their effects are the King's property, and if anyone withhold their money from him, let the King recover it as his own."

As "chattels", the Jews were not "free men" and pointedly excluded from the Magna Carta (1215) "habeas corpus" clause, protecting others against wrongful detention.

Until 1177, Jews could only be buried in England in the one cemetery close to Cripplegate. The bereaved from out of London would be charged exorbitant tolls on their journey to burial. The "Ordinances of the Jewry" 1194 required Jews to live in towns with an "Archa" registry chest which recorded loans and significant legal transactions in which the Crown had an interest. The regulations stemming from this became the Exchequer. The Edict of the Badge 1218 required Jews to wear a prominent identifying badge on the clothing and limited social and commercial interaction with Christians. Edward I passed increasingly onerous burdens in the "Statute of Jewry" 1253 and 1275, prior to the Edict of Expulsion in 1290.

In 1530, when Henry VIII needed support with religious interpretation of biblical divorce provisions, he corresponded with the Italian Rabbi, Jacob Rafael. Documents from this correspondence are on display in the British Library. Even though his six-times-great grandfather had expelled the Jews from the realm, Jewish wisdom and insight was welcome...

Judge Black recommends that Jewish students looking for a career in the law today should study a subject they enjoy, then turn to law. For his part, he would have loved to have studied history. We are grateful to him for enriching the Jewish contribution to English Law and our understanding of it.
