The opening verse to Sefer Vayikra states:

“He called to Moshe, and Hashem spoke to him from the Tent of Meeting...” (Vayikra 1:1)

So who called to Moshe?

At first the Torah not identify who is calling to Moshe, leaving the reader to deduce from the continuation of the verse that the pronoun “he” must be referring to G-d.

Ramban explains that this verse illustrates the extremely close relationship that had developed between God and Moshe.

They conversed so frequently that by now it now seems redundant for the Torah to have to identify each of the speakers as it is clear who is conversing within the narrative. For this reason, from this point on, the Torah would often refer to G-d casually as “He”.

The intimate relationship between G-d and Moshe carried on after the revelation at Har Sinai: the same “He” that spoke with Moshe throughout Sefer Shemot continued to communicate with Moshe in the same intimate manner in Sefer Vayikra, and on throughout Moshe’s life.

This relationship that existed between Hashem and Moshe, also existed (on a lower level) between Hashem and the Jewish people. However instead of a direct dialogue between them, something physical had to facilitate the conversation – the Mishkan and later the Beit HaMikdash.

Once the Mishkan was built, instead of God’s voice emanating from the top of Har Sinai, it emerged from the kodesh hakodashim (Holy of Holies) in the Mishkan. For this reason, the Mishkan became a ‘portable Har Sinai’, which the Jews would carry along with them wherever they went.

This is why the restrictions that were imposed upon the Jews at Har Sinai because of its sanctity – such as God’s command to Moshe to remove his shoes there (Shemot 3:5) – no longer apply. After the Mishkan was constructed, anyone who wished to do so could wander about the summit of Har Sinai with their shoes on, because the sanctity of Har Sinai had been transferred to the Mishkan and its vessels.

Later, when the Jewish people conquered the Promised Land and moved the hallowed vessels of the Mishkan to a permanent location on Har Moriah – the site of the Beit HaMikdash – the holiness of Har Sinai departed from the Mishkan and dwelt within the confines of the newly constructed Beit

HaMiddash.

From Har Sinai to the Mishkan and to Jerusalem, we see that the sanctity of the Beit HaMikdash is drawn directly from Har Sinai – the original source of its kedusha, which was established by God’s revelation there, allowing the Jewish people to continue to ‘converse’ with Hashem.

The Book of Vayikra has 247 of the 613 mitzvot, which is more than 40% of the mitzvot in less than 15% of the content of the Torah. The Book of Vayikra averages one mitzvah every 3.5 verses (by comparison, Devarim has one mitzvah every 5 verses, Shemot one per 11 verses, Bemidbar one per 25 verses and Bereishit one per 511 verses).

The Rabbi Writes

The **Maftir of Shabbat Zachor**, instructing us to remember to blot out the name of Amalek is one of the only Torah readings where it is considered a mitzvah D'Orayta (from the Torah, itself) to attend (in both senses of being present and listening to each word).

There are four essential Mitzvot of Purim; hearing the **Megillah** on both evening and morning; **Mishloach Manot**, where we give at least one gift of two pieces of ready-to-eat food to another person, **Matanot LeEvyonim**, where we give at least one coin to at least two poor people, who are able to spend it on the day, and **Mishteh** (or party). A minhag of Erev Purim (this year on Wednesday) is to give the **Mechatzit HaShekel** (1/2 Shekel). Because the word Teruma (donation) is used three times in the leining, the tradition has become to give three times the half coin of the realm (locally the 50 pence piece).

Hearing the Megillah is an imperative. Every word must be heard directly and without interruption (booing Haman is an exception.) It must be read (from a kosher scroll) not recited from memory nor played from a recording nor streamed (21st century psak). Directly means without amplification, precluding the use of microphones. Without interruption precludes all manner of intervention where our mind is distracted from the Megillah itself.

In Kinloss we offer many Megillah readings with the hope that both morning and evening everyone is able to fulfil the mitzvah in an environment they will enjoy. Our endeavour is to ensure that the mitzvah is fulfilled in each.

The mitzvot Mishloach Manot of Matanot LeEvyonim and Mishteh all apply on the day of Purim (rather than the preceding night). Correctly, the gifts should be sent before halachic midday (about 12.08pm).

There are many differing opinions on the Mitzvah of getting drunk on Purim Day. The Gemarra (Megillah 7b) states that a person is obligated to drink until he cannot distinguish between "Baruch Mordechai" (Blessed be Mordechai) and "Arur Haman" (Cursed be Haman). It then tells the story that Rabbah became so drunk that he stabbed (and killed) his guest R' Zeira at his banquet. This is not the paradigm we hope to emulate. The two expressions share the same Gematria (502) so according to some opinions you only need to become sufficiently tipsy that you can't do arithmetic.

According to the Rif (1013-1113) there is simply a mitzvah to drink some wine. According to the Baal Hamaor (1126-1186) the story of Rabbah's banquet comes to negate the mitzvah of drinking at all. Rambam (1135-1204) suggests drinking a little, then sleeping so that we are no longer able to focus on Mordechai & Haman. The Ravaya (1140-1225) says that getting drunk is inessential. The Bach (1561-1640) says it is not essential to be extremely drunk, but ideal to be a little

more tipsy than we'd normally be before standing in the presence of Royalty. The Ateret Zakenim (1620-1689) opined that we should be unable to resolve the question of which was the more important occurrence, the elevation of Mordechai or the disgrace of Haman? According to the Chayye Adam (1740-1820), if one will become boorish or unable to perform mitzvot like benching properly, one should not drink.

If one is driving – one is required to rely on the "dry" authorities.

In many communities, excessive drinking in the presence of children and even drunken children has become seriously problematic; a health risk and a Chillul Hashem. This is not in any way the spirit of Purim. The Mitzvah of drinking is only in the context of the festive meal.

My thanks to everyone involved in setting up our Purim celebrations, arranging and conducting the leining. It is all appreciated. I'm hoping it will all be fun.

Talking-Torah – Remembrance, Punishment & Rehabilitation

Last Shabbat I introduced a project that I am developing, www.Talking-Torah.com. The goal is to encourage thematic and values-based conversations from the Torah (to augment, rather than supplant other Divrei Torah). It is an evolving site but check in for more materials online.

Parshat Zachor requires that we remember the aggression of Amalek throughout our generations. Moreover, we are bound to eradicate Amalek. There are six "Zichronot" we are supposed to recall every day: The departure from Egypt, the receiving of the Torah, Amalek's attack, the Golden Calf, Hashem's punishment of Miriam, sanctifying Shabbat. Why is it so important to remember the past? Of all episodes in the Chumash why emphasise cases of national and personal wrongdoing?

The verse Devarim 24:9 emphasises remembering what Hashem did to Miriam. Why focus on Hashem's punishment rather than her Lashon Hara?

Parashat Vayikra introduces the idea of sacrifices. Some are part of regular worship and some are a part of atonement for the unintentional sins of leaders and the general populace (Vayikra 3 22, 24ff). Why does bringing an animal to be killed make any difference? Is it more than a stiff fine? If it is unintentional why should who you are make a difference to the consequences?

THIS WEEK'S HAFTORAH BY RABBI ANDREWS

This week's Haftorah from the Book of 1 Shmuel (Samuel) 15:2-34 correlates with the special Torah reading for Parshat Zachor. King Shaul (Saul) was sent by God via His prophet, Shmuel, to destroy the nation of Amalek and their king, Agag. This was an unusual opportunity for the entire people of Amalek could be found at one place at one time.

Shaul was successful in destroying Amalek, yet, showed mercy to Agag as well as the captured cattle. Chaza'l (the Rabbis) inform us that this act of mercy enabled the nation of Amalek to endure and continue to afflict the Jewish people. Haman is called, "the Agagite" as he was a descendant of Agag. As a consequence of his indiscretion, Shaul lost his divine sanction to remain as king of Israel.

The message of Purim is the story of our Haftorah. Hashem works His miracles through the typical passage of time. Actions done today set in motion ripples in time that radiate far into the future.

May this week's celebration of Purim set in motion the redemption of tomorrow!

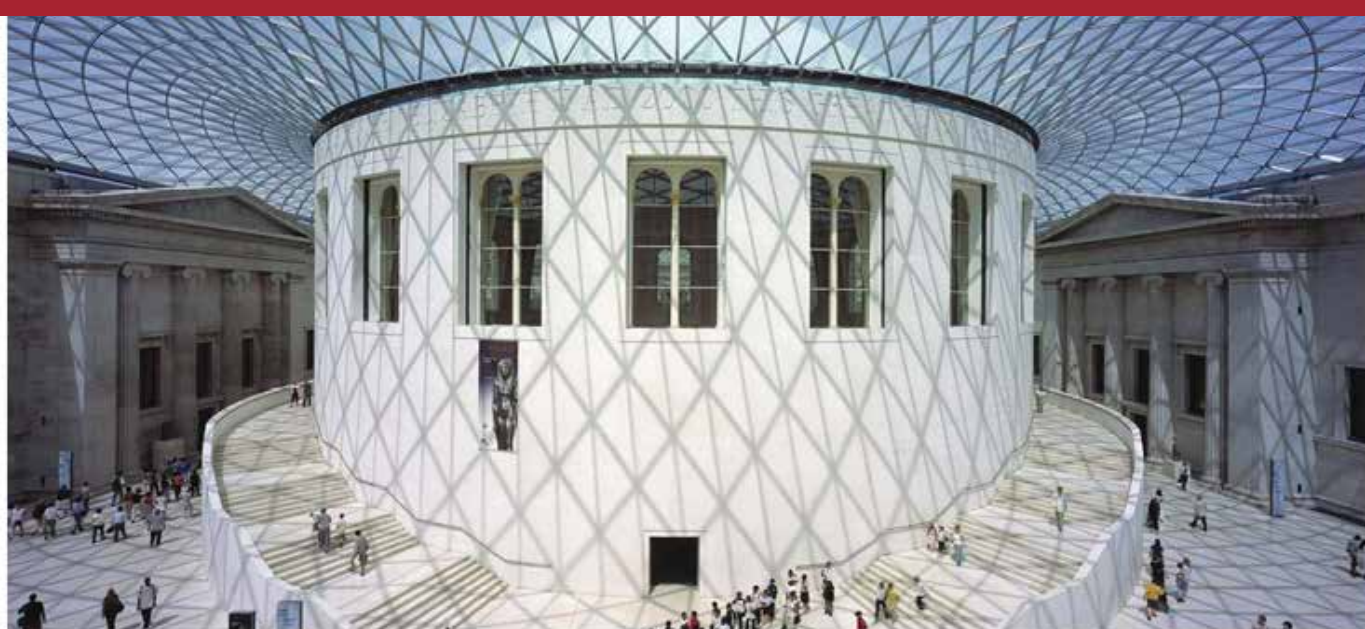
