“Yitro rejoiced over all the good that Hashem had done for Israel, that He had rescued it from the hand of Egypt” (Shemot 18:9)

After Moshe greeted his father-in-law Yitro, he shared stories with him of all the miracles Hashem had performed for the Jewish people, including the manner in which Hashem inflicted suffering and devastation upon the land of Egypt and Pharaoh’s army.

“His flesh became a mass of prickles; He grieved over the destruction of Egypt” (Rashi Shemot 18:9)

According to Rashi, the allusion suggests that, despite his happiness for the Jews, Yitro felt unease over what had happened to the Egyptians. Although a convert to Judaism, Yitro still held an emotional tie to the gentile world.

On this the sages teach “Do not speak derogatorily about gentiles in the presence of a convert for at least ten generations” (Sanhedrin 94) and from Yitro we are learning a quality that all Jews need:

After the splitting of the sea and the drowning of Pharaoh’s army, Israel rejoiced by breaking out with a harmonious song. However, due to the mournful note of this episode we do not recite a full Hallel during the last days of Pesach. But why should we feel saddened by the death of Pharaoh’s army?

One may think that Yitro was upset by the demise of the Egyptians due to a lack in his faith or love for Hashem. But this is not the case. In fact the Torah is hammering this point home in order to teach us Yitro’s attitude towards non-Jews.

Yitro had a deep concern for the welfare of everyone, Jew and non-Jew alike. A quality that all Jews need and which we remind ourselves of every year during the second half of Pesach.

Interview with Lord Pickles

It was a great pleasure to interview Lord Eric Pickles at Kinloss last week. We traced his story from the days of “Eric the Red”, whose great grandfather had been a founder of the independent Labour movement through his repudiation of Communism at the time of the Soviet invasion of Czechoslovakia, his years in local government in Bradford through to 25 years as Member of Parliament for Brentwood and Ongar in Essex and then his appointment to the House of Lords in 2017.

He is an avowed anti-racist with strong support for integrated immigration. He notes the strong contribution made to the country by the many people who have come here over the years but notes the imperative that they learn and are supported to learn English as a first language.

Lord Pickles has a reputation as a “Cheeky Chappie”, with some well-crafted and provocative comments on issues that matter to him.

He values the role of religion in society and was Minister for Faith 2014-2015. With the line that “militant atheists should accept that Britain is a Christian country” he defended the rights of Local Councils to open with religious prayer (and noted that people could stay or leave, and that prayer could be led by rabbis or imams or religious leaders of whichever denomination.)

Lord Pickles led the move for Britain and now over 30 countries to accept the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance (IHRA) working definition of anti-Semitism. As Vice President of the Holocaust Memorial Day Trust he spoke passionately about the new memorial; the Shoah was unique as a genocide in its ambit, scale, dream of worldwide elimination of a people and implementation of a whole legal framework to underpin the atrocity. The latter makes it so important that the memorial can be seen from the windows of the legislature in Westminster. “everyone can imagine being a victim, but few can imagine being a perpetrator.... The Holocaust created monsters from ordinary people... The Holocaust is also about the English

national football team in 1938 doing a Nazi salute...”



Asked about Jeremy Corbyn, Lord Pickles says “I think he’s got a distinguished anti-racist view... but he’s the most unlucky pro-Jewish person I have ever met. He turns up and the person next to him is an anti-Semite and a terrorist... he goes to some ceremony and it turns out that it’s a wreath laying, and the wreath laying was for a terrorist... and then oh my goodness, he lays a wreath there by mistake.... It’s just dreadful. Poor man – he has my sympathy.”

He is appalled at the growth of anti-Semitism but is adamant that “Jewish identity is a fundamental part of British identity and without Jewish identity, Britain would be a lesser nation.”

Lord Pickles is Chair (of Conservative Friends of Israel in the House of Lords. He first visited Israel in 1980. “I like democracies; I like freedom of speech, I like a free press. Israel is the only country in the Middle East where you can sue the government and win... Israel is the bastion of decency and democracy in the Middle East. I love the country and I love the people. I believe it is not only in our interests strategically to support Israel, but it is our interests morally to support Israel.”

This Wednesday evening, I shall be interviewing Dr David Lawson on his research into the Czech Sefer Torah that came to his community in Kingston upon Thames. He will present “Ostrava and its Jews – Now no-one sings you Lullabies”. I am also looking forward to in conversation with Dame Margaret Hodge on Thursday evening 14th March.

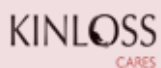
