To look at the themes and ideas in this week's Sedra, we have to look at last week's Sedra. Parashat Terumah speaks about the Mishkan and building a home for Hashem to dwell in. Parashat Tetzaveh introduces the theme of the Nation of Israel entering the Mishkan to worship G-d. The contrast between the two Parashiot highlight a key message.

One may argue that actually this week's Parasha is not about Nation of Israel, rather the Kohanim and their clothing. However, if we take an in depth look at the clothing of the Kohanim then we can see how the Bnei Yisrael are related to the service.

The first idea we are told about is Chapter 28, Verse 7, when it says: "It shall have two shoulder straps attached to its two ends, and it shall be connected." This verse is talking about the shoulder straps the Kohanim have to wear. In verse 19 Hashem tells the Kohanim that the stones on the shoulder pads should have the 12 tribes on them. Verse 12 says: "You should place the two stones on the shoulder straps of the Ephod, remembrance stones for the Children of Israel; and Aaron shall carry their names before Hashem on both his shoulders as a remembrance". Rashi and the Sforno comment that this is for Hashem to remember the righteousness of the Bnei Yisrael. Here we see that the Kohanim's clothes are like this to act as a representative for the Bnei Yisrael.

Another example of this idea can be seen in Verse 21. The next piece of clothing is the breastplate. Again it mentions that "the stones shall be according to the names of the Children of Israel". The Sforno comments that it specifically mentioned the 12 tribes to emphasis the point that the Kohanim care about the whole of Bnei Yisrael. Once again the Kohen Gadol is commanded to carry the names of the tribes, but this time closer to his heart.

The final item that follows this idea is the "Tzitz" (Rashi explains to be a golden plate that went on the forehead of the Kohen Gadol). On this piece it had the words (Verse 36): "Holy to Hashem". The following verses explain that the Kohen Gadol wore this as an atonement for the Bnei Yisrael's sins.

It is true that Kohanim have certain privileges and certain Mitzvot that only they can do. However, they are there to serve as a representative for the Bnei Yisrael. The clearest sign of this is at the end of the Parasha, Chapter 29, Verses 44-44, when it states "I shall consecrate the Tent of Meeting and the Altar, and Aaron and his sons shall I consecrate to be Kohanim to Me. I shall rest among the Children of Israel..." This shows that even though this was a way for the Kohanim to get closer to G-d, it was a service for the Bnei Yisrael to create a relationship with Hashem.

The Kohen Gadol had to carry the responsibility of Am Yisrael, literally, on his head, shoulders and heart but he fulfilled this because the whole of Israel benefited from it. We all have the national goal of becoming closer and making everyone closer to Hashem. We all have this responsibility to ensure that we bring people together for the greater good, just as the Kohanim did for the Bnei Yisrael at the time of the Mishkan.

Even a Fox... But better a Lion...

Rabbi Zarum shared an anecdote about his father, the late Arie' Zarum z"l.

He was sitting next to Dayan Fisher z"l when a young and promising Rabbi stepped to the front of his shul to address the congregation. The Dayan had stood, giving kavod to the Rav. To the Dayan's amusement, Arie' quoted from the Rashi to Bereishit 47:31, where the ageing Yaakov prostrates himself in Yosef's presence. Rashi notes תַּעֲלֶא בְּעֵדְנִיהָ סָגִיד לִיהָ, "even the fox has his day, when you should bow down to it!"

Rabbi Zarum says his father had been taught Rashi from his own father, while looking at foxes in embryonic Tel Aviv.

Normally, a son should show deference to his father. Rashi, quoting from R' Elazar in Megilla 16b notes that every fox has his day - "a person of lesser value who has risen to greatness should be treated according to his status."

The commentaries on the Gemarra and on Rashi himself offer various explanations of the vulpine allusion.

The verse in Shemot states וַיֹּאמֶר הַשִּׁבְעָה לִּי וַיִּשָּׁבַע לוֹ וַיִּשְׁתַּחֲוֶה יִשְׂרָאֵל עַל-רֹאשׁ הַמֶּטָּה: "Swear to me [that you will bury me in Israel, not Egypt] and he swore to him. And Israel bowed himself at the head of the bed."

Rabbi Eliyahu Mizrahi the 15th century Chief Rabbi of Constantinople, observes that Yaakov's gesture was not so much one of respect but of gratitude. Had Yaakov really considered Yosef his superior, he would have had to bow when Yosef entered the room. Rather, the bow comes after Yosef has undertaken to do his father's bidding.

The Maharal of Prague (1520-1609) in his commentary the Gur Aryeh, adds that to have bowed initially could have been demeaning to Yosef. Possibly Yosef would infer that he was being called the fox before his father the lion! Moreover, had Yaakov bowed first, it may have looked like flattery. The Maharal notes that a father showing appreciation to a helpful son after the event is appropriate.

Rav Ovadia MiBartenura (c15 Italy) asserts that Yaakov did appreciate Yosef's undertaking, but suggests that the bow could be interpreted as a gesture of thanks to Hashem for His chessed in preserving the good middot of his successful son.

Every fox has his day.

Ben Azzai notes (Pirkei Avot 4:3) "that there is no person without his/her hour and no thing without its place." Every individual has a moment for which they were created. We may not know when that moment might be – but however long or short our lives, they will have had their moment of purpose. Of course, there is no guarantee that the moment of purpose was joyous or gave any personal satisfaction.

R' Matiya ben Cheres teaches, (Avot 4:20) that we do not know why the wicked endure peace or the righteous are afflicted. But we should rush to be the first to greet any/every person. וְהָיָה זָנְבָא לְאַרְיֹת, וְאֵל תְּהִי רֹאשׁ לְשׁוּעִלִים: We should aspire to be the tail of lions, not the head of a foxes.

According to the Midrash Shmuel (c16 Tzefat), A lion waves its tail above its head. A fox keeps it between his legs. Honourable people are like the lion – they honour those who are less magnificent and are not concerned that their own honour will be diminished. By contrast, dishonourable people are like the fox. They belittle those lesser than themselves in to increase their own sense of self-importance.

Politicians demeaning their adversaries and football players kicking their cats are unedifying role models. Everyone has their moment, and every soul deserves respect – even the ascendant foxes. Nonetheless, as the Midrash Shmuel instructs, our role models should not be scavenging fox-heads, looking for a bite and the chance to bring others low. Rather, we should attach ourselves to lions and present tails high – with welcome greeting to all through our pride in our virtues and our values.
