The Omer and the Day of Inspiration

‘And G-d spoke to Moses saying, ‘Speak to the Children of Israel and say to them, when you come to the Land which I am giving you and you shall gather your harvest, you shall bring an Omer from your first harvest to a Kohen.’ (Vayikra 23:9-10)

These verses introduce the mitzva of bringing the Omer, which, as Rashi (the premier Torah commentator) explains, is an amount of produce brought as a tithe to a Kohen. This is part of the process leading to the Korban HaOmer, an offering brought on the second day of Pesach, which leads to the familiar ritual of counting the Omer which links Pesach and Shavuot.

Why does the Torah state ‘when you come to the Land’? This phrase might seem self-explanatory, for where else than in the Land of Israel could Bnei Yisrael fulfil an agricultural mitzvah such as the bringing of the Omer, which is linked to the Beit Hamikdash (Temple)?

The great medieval commentator Ramban (acronym for Rabbi Moshe ben Nachman) writes that each of the Moadim (festivals) mentioned in this week’s Sidra are introduced with a new, specific mitzva in addition to the generic mitzvot of Yom Tov (such as the simcha of Yom Tov). The new specific mitzva reminds Bnei Yisrael about the particular message of each particular Festival.

Since Shavuot is the culmination of the Omer counting period, Shavuot’s material in this week’s Sidra is introduced by the mitzva of the Omer. The mitzva of the Omer and the subsequent counting help us to ‘grow’ spiritually into the Chag (festival) of Shavuot and the giving of the Torah. The Omer links the physical redemption of Pesach to the ‘mission statement’ for the Jewish people at Shavuot.

The entirety of the mitzva of the Omer provides an opportunity for spiritual growth, an opportunity most fully applicable in the Land of Israel but also with application in the Diaspora through a focused counting of the Omer.

Perhaps the Torah wishes to emphasise that the Land of Israel offers greater opportunities for spiritual development and as such notes the specific role of the Land of Israel in the mitzva of the Omer, a mitzva which brings us from the physical redemption of Pesach to the giving of Torah on Shavuot.

Given the particular spiritual significance of the Omer period and its links to Israel, it is a real pleasure for us to welcome so many distinguished guests from Israel, sharing Torah from Eretz Yisrael, to be with us this Shabbat and at the Day of Inspiration on Sunday. Our thanks go to them and all those who have facilitated this weekend’s events. I do hope you will be able to benefit from this terrific opportunity.

Torah Old and New

It was lovely to join Wednesday morning's Kinloss trip to the Czech Scrolls exhibit at Kent House in Knightsbridge. The building was built and named for

Prince Edward, Duke of Kent and Strathearn (1767-1820), son of George III and the father of Queen Victoria. The Prince was a patron

of the Society for Promoting Christianity among the Jews, so there is some irony that Kent House is now the Westminster Synagogue as well as the home of the Czech Scrolls Museum.

There are records of Jews living in Bohemia and Moravia for over 1,000 years, with a rich culture and scholarship centred in Prague. At the time of the Nazi invasion, there were around 350 synagogues of which 60 were destroyed and the others were converted to storage, used for administration or barracks.

In 1942, in conjunction with some members of the Prague Jewish community, the Nazis set up a programme to bring the religious treasures from the ornate silver trimmings and shul textiles down to shofars and wooden Torah pointers, over 100,000 items to the Jewish Museum in Prague. According to some, there was an intention to set up a Museum for the Annihilated Race. However, unlike the items, which were logged and inventoried with detail, there is scant documentary evidence that a gruesome museum of this nature was actually on the agenda.

Around 1,800 Torah Scrolls were gathered, and stored in a number of disused synagogues in Prague during the war, eventually taken over by the State Jewish Museum established to handle the artefacts in 1950. Of the Jews who had worked on collecting the treasures under the Nazis, and who had hoped that they could be returned after the war, there was only one survivor. The rest had perished in Auschwitz or Terezin.

1,564 scrolls were obtained by the Prague Museum. While the silverware and many other items were retained and remain on display, these were just too many and unfortunately in many cases decaying through poor storage. The Museum arranged for them to be sold and through the agencies of an art dealer,



Eric Estorick, and his client, a London Solicitor, Ralph Yablon they came to London, where they were under the supervision of His Rabbi, Harold Reinhart of the Westminster Synagogue. Though an independent and non-Orthodox Synagogue, considerable care was taken to work with Orthodox scholars and soferim to preserve the scrolls.



With the scrolls are some beautiful Torah bands, many donated from the swaddling cloths of boys at their brit.

Some of the scrolls have been restored to kosher working order. They, along with many



others in good repair are on loan by the Memorial Scrolls Trust to shuls around the world, where as "Czech Torah Scrolls" they highlight the history of their communities and serve to preserve the memory of the scholarship and culture the Nazis set out to destroy. They are silent witnesses and potent teachers.

A visit to the exhibit is worthwhile and moving. It can be arranged through info@memorialscrollstrust.org.

Of course, this Shabbat, we are thrilled to host our fourth **Day of Inspiration**, and celebrate the living Torah, which has been the constant support and guide for our People for millennia. We are particularly delighted to be hosting **Rabbi Gidon Weitzman**, who will be speaking about "Who is My Mummy? Defining Motherhood in the Case of Egg Donation" on Friday evening at 6.45pm, **Rabbi David Aaron**, who will speak on Shabbat morning and **Rabbi Dr Yona Goodman**, who will give the shiur and speak at the Seuda on Shabbat afternoon.

They will be joined by over 30 more great speakers and presenters for the Day of Inspiration on the Sunday, here at Kinloss. I do hope that you will be joining us, too.
