The Most Precious Gift of All

This week we read Parashat Vayakhel, which describes the construction of the Mishkan in the wilderness. Almost all of the details of Vayakhel and Pekudei (next week) parallel the Parshiyot of Terumah and Tetzaveh (a few weeks back), where the blueprints for the Mishkan and the design of the robes and vestments of the Cohanim, were given by God.

There is one notable exception to the repetition. One vessel, the Kiyor or laver, used by the Cohanim to wash their hands and feet was introduced last week distinct from all the other details of the Mishkan. And in our Parasha, Vayakhel, we learn that it wasn't constructed out of the materials or budget that had originally been prescribed.

Why does the Kiyor stand apart?

The Torah tells us that the Kiyor was made out of the copper mirrors brought to Moses by the Israelite women. The midrash fleshes out the story, explaining that Moses was reluctant to accept the mirrors as a gift. "These are objects of vanity!" He protested, "they have no place in God sanctuary!"

God, however, contradicts Moses and explains that the gift of the mirrors is most precious of all. When the Israelite men had been slaves in Egypt, they had become depressed about the future and wondered what purpose was there in life. They had separated themselves from their wives. They were certainly not going to bring children into this kind of world.

According to the midrash, the women would beautify themselves in the mirrors and they would tease their husbands, playfully. They would tell them, "look, I can see us both in here and I am far prettier than you!" The men would be drawn away from their melancholy and back into their family.

Mirrors can be an object of vanity and lust can be a tool of destruction. Here the right motivation turned the mirrors into a tool for good – a precious and acceptable gift in the Mishkan.

I think one significant message in the Midrash is the way the mirrors are used. They weren't just for personal preening – which is what Moses had feared. They were not mere objects of vanity. What was it the women said as they looked in the glass?

They said – "look, I can see us in the mirror..." Not, "look I can see me." Look, I can see us! There was a little bit of teasing – but the goal was to strengthen the partnership and the relationship.

Most of the Mishkan was pure molten gold, crafted structures and specially woven fabrics – new creations from the purest of materials. Of course purity has a welcome and natural home in the Tabernacle. We are taught that in contrast to the other vessels, each mirror remained distinct in the Kiyor – the copper mirrors didn't need to be broken down and renewed.

It is normal to be mindful of God in shul! But when we take our normal living and make it holy – and when we bring sanctity into our daily lives – when we do something different and godly in our most intimate relationships... That is the most precious gift of all.

It works as a looking glass and it works as a metaphor. Looking in the mirror isn't just about how beautiful you are – it's about seeing how beautiful your relationship can be.

Reflect on it!

Oneg - The Spirit of Shabbat

I'm delighted to welcome **Rabbi YY Rubinstein** back to London for **Shabbat UK**. A graduate of Gateshead yeshiva, YY has educated, inspired and entertained as a student chaplain, Rov, mentor and lecturer. He is widely published, often broadcast and much sought after. It is a pleasure to host him in Kinloss for Shabbat UK. We also welcome **Rabbi Cobi Ebrahimoff** ("Rav E"), Tribe Rabbi and educator extraordinaire.

Well done to everyone who supported the Allegra Benita, the Challah Mummy at **Tuesday's Challah Make**. Thanks to everyone who brought their kids, assisted in the set up and clear up. Some beautiful, artistic cinnamon stars and flowers came out of the evening, as well as a challah tortoise!

In my Monday evening shiur, we looked at the idea of "the **Spirit of Shabbat**". By and large we cope well with refraining from melacha (the prohibited labours on Shabbat) and the intricacies of food preparation, etc. When we hear of restrictions because something violates the spirit of Shabbat, (such as what we read, what games we can play and what we may discuss, some people don't always appreciate that this, too is real concept and has halachic force – albeit something which, might differ between countries, cultures and over time.

The origin of these regulations is in Isaiah 58:13-14, where the prophet relates, "If you refrain from trampling the Shabbat, from pursuing your affairs on My holy day; if you call Shabbat "delight," the Lord's holy day "honoured," and if you honour it, and not go in your own way, nor look to your affairs, nor speak of them – then you will seek the Lord's delight. I will set you astride the heights of the earth, and let you enjoy the heritage of your father Yaakov..."

This is the basis for refraining from our weekday work ("pursuing your affairs"), even where that doesn't entail (eg) writing or trade. The Talmud (Shabbat 113b) learns from these verses that our clothes should be different – as they honour Shabbat; and even our leisure, our conversation and our rest should be different – harnessed to "the Lord's delight". There is more to keeping Shabbat than refraining from the activities prohibited to us. Keeping Shabbat properly entails elevating ourselves above the mundane; infusing what remains with a sense of "spiritual and special."

On Wednesday **Dayan Gelley** was our first religious leader in our new interview series. He spoke with passion about his late father and the rabbis at Ponovezh Yeshiva, including the venerable Rav Schach. We covered



a wide range of subjects from the Jewish moral character of the State of Israel, the state of Jewish education in England, his support in principle of halachic organ donation and his belief that assimilation is the most significant challenge confronting the Jewish world today.

Dayan Gelley applauded Shabbat UK as a "tremendous" initiative bringing families and communities together with the opportunity to recharge and refresh, as a catalyst for greater communal involvement and connection.

Asked, if in the style of Pirkei Avot, he could identify three pillars, virtues or "life tips", which he would like to promulgate in his name, Dayan Gelley listed 1) focus on the issue to hand – how can we resolve it, and how do we cut out the noise? 2) the importance on giving – "we often talk about 'give and take', but we should direct ourselves to 'give and give'. Of course if we are giving, then there is taking, but in our marriages and in our service, we should have a "giving attitude". 3) "Never rest on your laurels. Don't be complacent in life – strive for more."

Please join me next Wednesday at 8pm, when I shall be in conversation with Rabbi Joseph Dweck, leader of the S&P Sephardi Jewish Community.

I am looking forward to hearing our young people sing **Lecha Dodi this Friday night** and Adon Olam in our Morning services. I hope that those of you reading this before Shabbat will join me and Mandy with "YY" for an Oneg, some song, schmooze and a Lechayim!

THIS WEEK'S HAFTORAH BY RABBI ANDREWS

This week, we read an additional portion of the Torah, Parshat Shekalim. This is the first in the series of special Torah readings that take us through the Purim season in the lead up to the month of Nisan and the holiday of Pesach. All of these additional readings have their individual Haftorot that touch on the theme of their content.

Parshat Shekalim discusses the annual obligation for every Jew to give half a shekel to the public coffers to support the regular daily offering of sacrifices. The Haftorah, from the 11th and 12 chapters of Melachim II (II Kings), discusses the efforts of King Yehoash (Jehoash) (9th century BCE) to earmark these public funds for the upkeep of the first Bait Hamikdash.

The narrative begins with the new king, Yehoash, renewing the people's covenant with God by destroying all the pagan altars and statues. At the same time, he appointed officers to oversee the Bait Hamikdash. After witnessing the Cohanim's neglect of the Temple maintenance, he ordered that all monies should be placed in a special box that was placed near the mizbeach (altar). These funds would be given directly to the workers and craftsmen who would then repair and help maintain the Temple.

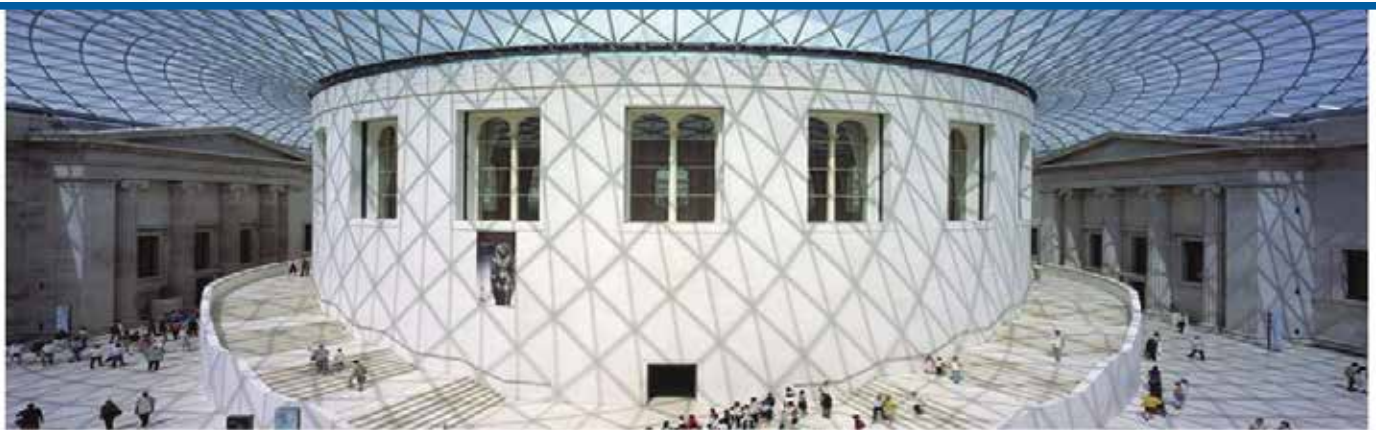

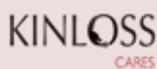
