The Priestly Blessings

Speak to Aaron and his sons saying, thus shall you bless the Children of Israel; say to them...' (Bemidbar 6,23)

This and the subsequent four verses are the source for the wording of Birkat Kohanim, the Priestly blessings, which emanate from God via the conduit of the Kohanim. The exclusivity of Kohanim in this regard seems to apply only to “duchaning”, the special blessing recited in the Diaspora only on Yom Tov, according to Ashkenazi custom, but every day in many Israeli communities and many Sephardi communities in the Diaspora. In fact, non-Kohanim can and do use this blessing, such as parents blessing children on Friday nights, and the Chazan every day in the repetition of the Shacharit Amida.

Why do Ashkenazi Diaspora communities ‘duchan’ only on Yom Tov? Rabbi Moses Iserlis, the great 16th century Ashkenazi halachist, in his notes on the Shulchan Aruch (the Code of Jewish Law) explains that Kohanim must be in a state of ‘simcha’ (happiness) in order to perform Birkat Kohanim. The only days which qualify in the Diaspora are Yom Tov, when there is a commandment to be in a state of simcha, by enjoying the day to a greater extent than even on Shabbat. Even so, on Yom Tov, duchening only takes place in the Musaf prayer, as that is close to the end of the service when congregants will soon be able to enjoy a festive meal which is one of the main components of this simcha.

Why is the custom different in Israel? Former Chief Rabbi, the late Lord Jakobovits, explains that only in Israel, where the Jews are at home, is the simcha such that Birkat Kohanim can take place on a daily basis, in comparison to the fact of exile even in the most welcoming of Diasporas. As we come out of Shavuot, the festival celebrating the receiving of the Torah, we pray that we may be able to learn, understand and apply the Torah, celebrating the simcha of the Land of Israel, speedily in our days.

The Rabbi Writes

It has been the busiest week but a wonderful one!

Last Wednesday evening I interviewed Lady **Daniela Pears**, who was able to share with us her enthusiasm for a host of worthy causes including Mitzvah Day, for which she is Interfaith Ambassador, JAMI and her most recent initiative, the matchmaking service, wegotogether.net. Daniela cited as her inspirations a number of the elderly people she has befriended through volunteer work at different stages. She believes that it would be a great benefit to our students to engage more with our senior citizens, partly as an act of chessed but also substantially to develop awareness, inspiration and resilience.

Meanwhile, our **Kinloss Cares volunteers** were making cupcakes downstairs for Shavuot distribution. What a wonderful job they do and what a wonderful pre-Shavuot afternoon tea they arranged.

On Thursday we hosted the Memorial Service for the late **Rev Alan Greenbatt**. A thoroughly fitting occasion with a video tribute by **Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks** and an uplifting series of reminiscences by **Chief Rabbi Mirvis**. With video footage of Alan remembering his own youth, evacuation in the war and a Bar Mitzvah that his parents could not attend, through the memories of those who had worked with Alan in the Victoria Club and AJY, his adoptive family and his colleagues, we were taken through 90 moving years of a true servant of Hashem and our Jewish community.

Shavuot was a buzz. It was hardly possible to sit down and digest the cheesecake. Even before Yom Tov was in, **R' Coby Ebrahimoff** led 250 primary kids with their parents through a discussion booklet (having already run the programme in the afternoon in the Suburb!) Our Tikkun Leil was launched by the **Chief Rabbi** with an explanation of Hope, distinguishing between the word Tikvah (which is the faith that there will be salvation of some sort) and Tochelet (which implies a more specific expectation of resolution). Inspired by Rabbi Akiva, the Chief Rabbi acknowledged that there are times in our personal and national lives, when everything might appear gloomy and we might feel removed. Nonetheless, it behoves us to have an optimistic disposition in Hashem's greater plan and for our own sakes, for us to engage with positivity towards the hope of redemption.

The Adult Tikkun Leil continued with **Jo Greenaway**, explaining Chalitza, the process of disengaging from Levirate Marriage in the Book of Ruth, combined with her own experiences at the Beth Din with Chalitza as it continues occasionally today. **R' Ebrahimoff** explained the disparity between the leining cycles in Israel and Diaspora. I picked up the late shift with a look at the life of one of my favourite commentators, Don Isaac Abarbanel (1437-1508) and how his experience as a diplomat and financier to the Kings, Queens and rulers of Europe shaped his anti-Monarchist

views on good government. Unlike Maimonides, who presents appointing a King as one of the 613 mitzvot, and a priority upon reaching the land of Israel, Abarbanel sees it as a dreadful contingency, preferring a more devolved democratic government under God-fearing judges.



While this was going on in the Nisan and Rifca Deal Hall, for his third year, **Moishe Sampson** lead a Gemarra chabura upstairs while **Barry Colman** had a packed programme of shiurim and discussions for the youth.

On first day in the afternoon, we enjoyed the Women's Tikkun hosted by **Sally Saunders**, where **Deborah Clements** spoke on the Eshet Chayil as well as a chance to hear again from Jo Greenaway and from me. Deborah joined **Aviva Steinberg** and **Mozelle Onnie** in receiving Eshet Chayil awards from Kinloss for their invaluable contributions to the wellbeing of our community.

Thanks to everyone who gave their time in running, preparing and hosting these shiurim and services as well as the Youth services, the Family Service on First Day Yom Tov (where amongst other things, we learned how to "sing" Oseh Shalom Bimromayv in Sign Language!), to **Esther Davis** (last Shabbat's Bat Mitzvah) who with her mother, **Tessa**, led the Women's Megillat Rut; to **Rabbi Laitner** to all his support in everything, for his sermons and for his closing shiur on Resilience, with readings and insight from the Book of Ruth and the booklet he has produced for Tribe and Bnei Akiva.

On Tuesday night I was privileged to attend an Eid Dinner hosted by His Excellency the Israeli Ambassador, **Mark Regev**. With guests including members across the community who engage in Interfaith work, Imams and Muslim leaders in British public life. This is a wonderful, quiet initiative, yet of great significance in Hasbara. HE spoke of the predominantly warm relationships that had been enjoyed between Jewish and Muslim communities over centuries.

On Wednesday evening, I addressed the Siyum of our Bat Mitzvah Programmes, where we learned an overview of the Torah's 54 Parshiyot – how they fit together and their thematic development.

What a great kehilla with so much going on. Thank you all for making it so.

Luciana Berger has served as MP for Liverpool Wavertree since 2010. She was a member of the Labour Party until 2019, when she resigned to form The Independent Group with other MPs. She served as a National Executive Committee member of the National Union of Students, but resigned to protest what she considered the committee's apathy towards antisemitism. Berger also served as Director of Labour Friends of Israel. Appointed Labour candidate for Liverpool Wavertree, her selection attracted criticism for resulting from a centrally-imposed all-women shortlist — she was then elected an MP in the 2010 general election. Luciana has criticised what she considered to be increasing antisemitism in the Labour Party and said that, under Corbyn, Labour contained “institutional anti-Semitism”.
