Trust in G-d – Leora and Harry Salter

Emunah, faith, in G-d is a cornerstone of the Jewish practice and belief. We have the 13 principles of faith where we start of saying 'I believe with faith that is complete'. The Rambam's principles are based into three categories: the nature of belief in Hashem, the authenticity of the Torah and man's responsibility and ultimate reward. A practical example of the principles is shown in the Bracha of revival of the dead, where the Rambam says that we must instil perfect belief whilst saying the Bracha. However, where does complete Emunah come from?

An argument can be made that the first believer in G-d was Noah. Described as a 'righteous man' (6:9) in the beginning of last week's Parasha, Noah believed in Hashem. He had confidence in him that everything would be fine and his family would be saved from the flood.

However, in the same verse it says that Noah 'walked with G-d'; Rashi explains this to mean that Noah needed support with G-d, but Avraham would strengthen himself and walk on his own, thus showing the argument that Avraham was the first believer in G-d.

Avraham did not need G-d's help with his belief, he was a fully committed Jew. It says in this week's Parasha, (15:6), Avraham 'trusted in Hashem'. Rashi comments that Avraham did not request a sign from Hashem about the promise that he would have offspring, but he did require a sign from G-d about the possession of the Land of Canaan. The Sforno also comments that Avraham had complete faith in G-d and at no time did Avraham doubt His promise.

Furthermore, the following words of the verse also show the faith from Avraham. The verse says 'He reckoned it to him as righteousness' and both Rashi and the Sforno agree that this is a credit to his faith in Hashem. The Sforno says that if it was not complete faith in Hashem the he wouldn't have been described as righteous and quotes the book of Ezekiel (19:24): "But when the righteous turns away from his righteousness and commits iniquity...none of his righteous deeds that he has done shall be remembered".

This description of Avraham highlights his faith in G-d. Even though Avraham thought he couldn't have children, after G-d promised it to him, Avraham fully trusted G-d to fulfil his promise, thus showing that Avraham is the first complete believer in Hashem.

Praying for the Weather, or Not

There has certainly been a change in the weather!

On Shemini Atzeret we davened for rain and made the switch to Mashiv HaRuach uMorid HaGeshem משיב הרוח ומוריד הגשם (who causes the wind to blow and the rain to fall) in our Amida.

The second seasonal change in the Amida is in the Birkat HaShanim, where we switch from *veTen Beracha* ותן ברכה (grant blessing) to *veTen Tal uMatar LiVracha* ותן טל ומטר לברכה (grant dew and rain as a blessing). In Israel the switch was made on 7th Cheshvan (1st November 2022) fifteen days after Shemini Atzeret. In Diaspora the change will be made on the evening of Dec 4th, which is 60 days after the autumnal equinox (see Kol Kinloss Bereishit 5783). The delay is to enable the pilgrims to return home to their fields after Sukkot without getting drenched.

If one comes to the end of the Amida and realises that the wrong phrase was said in either place, this is one of the errors that requires going back to the beginning and saying the Amida again. In cases of doubt, or if one catches oneself earlier this might not be necessary (See Mishnah Berura 114 and 117 or notes 76-83 at the back of an Artscroll Siddur for specifics).

What should one do if one is travelling between Israel and Diaspora? If one was in Israel for Yom Tov and until/beyond 7th Cheshvan but returning before the evening of Dec 4th should one follow the Israeli switch and then revert on landing back in London? What should Israeli visitors to England do if they are abroad?

There are a variety of positions depending on how long one has been in Israel and when one is travelling. The mainstream position has a curious anomaly: in one's **private silent** Amida, one should follow the minhag of where one lives – so the *Chutznik* in Israel continues with *veTen Beracha* and the Israeli tourist abroad says *veTen Tal uMatar LiVracha* – even though everyone else is doing the opposite. However, when one is Shaliach Tzibbur, **leading the davening, in the repetition of the Amida**, one should lead it according to the local norm as the repetition is for the congregation and not the leader.

While there is both quirkiness and consistency to this halacha, it reminds me that Tefilla in a minyan has distinct personal and congregational dimensions – even within a single prayer.

It's a fitting thought for Parashat Lech Lecha, where we consider where we come from, where we are at, what is our purpose and where we belong.

This **Wednesday 9th November**, we will be recommencing a Wednesday **8am Shacharit**. Please join us for Shacharit, a light **breakfast, coffee and a short shiur**. I shall be looking at the Book of Mishlei (Proverbs).

Next Shabbat we are very fortunate to host **Rabbi Avraham Steinberg**, who is one of the preeminent religious medical ethicists and not just within the Jewish world. He holds advisory roles in hospitals, and Israeli Government committees. He has helped shape legislation on end-of-life issues and organ donation. Rav Steinberg is also the editor in chief of the Talmudic Encyclopaedia, which is recognised as one of the most outstanding contemporary works of Torah scholarship.



A volume of the Encyclopaedia is being dedicated in honour of Chief Rabbi Lord Sacks z"l, whose second Yahrzeit falls on 13th-14th Nov.

As part of our regular Shabbat schedule, Rav Steinberg will be speaking briefly after the service on Friday night, **"The difference between Jewish and General Medical Ethics"** and at a Shabbat Forum on Shabbat morning **"Recent Issues in Halacha and Genetics"**. He will be giving the shiur after Shabbat mincha (3.45pm) on **"Triage Decisions – Who to Treat, Who to Save?"**

On Friday night join Rav Steinberg for **Dessert and Torah at 90 Windermere Ave at 8.00pm** where he will be sharing **Personal Encounters with Torah Giants** and also a general discussion.

Everyone is invited to a **Shabbat Buffet Lunch** where Rav Steinberg will talk about **"What makes a Human in Halacha"**. Lunch is £10 per person – Booking essential on www.kinloss.org.uk/lunch

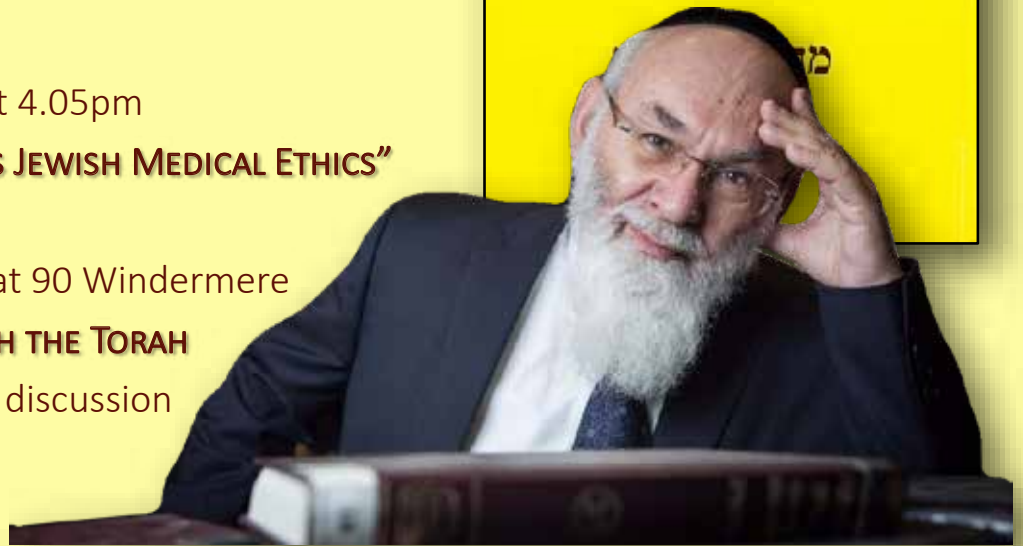
