Sanctity of Body and Time

Tazriya – our regular weekly Parsha, deals with the sanctity of the body. Together with next week’s portion of Metzora, it is one of the Torah’s less savoury parshiyot; it details the lesions and blemishes which render the sufferer ritually impure. Though popularly mistranslated as leprosy, the biblical “tzaraat” צרעת is not a physical contagion but essentially a physical manifestation of a spiritual imperfection. The Talmud (Erchin 16a) identifies it specifically as a punishment for slander or malicious speech.

Essential to the treatment of the “tzaraat” is an appointment with the Kohen, who assesses the markings or scabs and declares them either impure or healthy, to prescribe appropriate quarantine and follow-up. (Vayikra 13,2)

Halacha allows for procrastination in calling the Kohen in a number of circumstances, such as not to upset a recent bride or groom (Mishna Negaim 3:2) or to interfere with Yom Tov celebrations. We certainly learn from this that the “tzaraat” cannot be a normal infection. If it were, halacha would not consider any delay or continued public exposure acceptable. Moreover, the “tzaraat” requires the Kohen to make a declaration. The sufferer can’t simply self diagnose, quarantine him/herself and then immerse in the mikveh once the sores are healed or after a week of bed-rest.

Calling upon the Kohen to diagnose the “tzaraat” (rather than a doctor) is an acknowledgement that the sufferer has recognised his particular symptoms have come as a result of his own inappropriate conduct and a readiness to engage in the spiritual world to set matters right.

As this Shabbat is Rosh Chodesh Nissan, we take out three scrolls. The leining for Tazriya is condensed into six portions with Shevi’i read from the second scroll. This is the Rosh Chodesh leining (Bemidbar 28, 9-15). After Kaddish, the third scroll is used for the special Maftir of Shabbat HaChodesh (Shemot 12, 1-20).

The HaChodesh reading, deals with the sanctification of time. Hashem gives us the responsibility of identifying the new moon and proclaiming Rosh Chodesh, marking and maintaining the calendar. The dawn of our redemption, the Exodus from Egypt are to be eternal markers defining our year. If we have one month, we must have a year of them. As we move through the seasons and the festivals, we chart our lives with reference to the Exodus.

Moreover, we do not just sit back passively and watch the days pass by, checking each off and consigning it to the past. It is our duty to proclaim the months, to label them. We give them their identity.

If we didn’t sanctify time, would it stop? Would the calendar halt, the sun stop rising and setting, waiting for us to announce tomorrow as Rosh Chodesh?

Of course, the sun would rise and set. The years would roll on. But we would not have made them Holy. Participation is the key.

It is perfectly possible to go through life and not mark a calendar. It is possible that we would never question whether there are spiritual ramifications to our health – and often it is a doctor we need, not a priest.

There is a paradox. When we sanctify Time, we have to proclaim the inevitable. It will happen regardless of the proclamation – but the proclamation makes it Holy. When we find tzaraat on our body, the contamination is present, but it is not tamei or spiritually impure until proclamation has been made.

Hashem is calling upon us to turn the inevitable and the incidental into something sacred through our own participation and designation. Even though Hashem’s Presence might be felt, we have a role in making it manifest. Our engagement and our labelling makes the difference.

Often halacha leaves us apprehensive that our lot in life is to tread a tricky tightrope between right and wrong. In fact, Hashem has made us His partner in the sanctification of time and the spiritual cleansing of our world.

In Dark Moments, Renewal and Redemption

This Shabbat is Parshat HaChodesh, the last of the four special Parshiyot (Shekalim, Zachor, Para & HaChodesh) identified in Mishna Megilla (3:4). Shabbat, itself, is Rosh Chodesh, and accordingly we shall read from three Sifrei Torah.

Sanctifying the New Moon (Shemot 12,1) is the first mitzvah given to the nation of Israel as a whole. The mitzvot we learn from Sefer Bereishit (having children, Brit Milah and not eating the hindquarter sinew of a kosher animal) were given to individuals.

The Sfat Emet (1847-1905, second Rebbe of Gur) identifies two significant teachings of renewal within the Mitzvah. As the moon wanes, becomes invisible and then reappears, he identifies growth and renewal in the world of nature. As we say every morning before the Shema,

He illuminates the earth for those who dwell on it, with compassion; and in His goodness renews every day, continually, the work of creation. How many are

Your works, Hashem; You made them all with wisdom, the earth is full of Your possessions.



We should recognise that Hashem mandates development and progress, willing life.

Secondly, in designating Rosh Chodesh Nissan and the Exodus as the startpoint of our calendar, we should reflect on national renewal. Even though we experience depths of pain, alienation and exile, like the return of the moon and the redemption of Pesach, Israel must have faith that when we mark time as holy, Hashem will rise to defend His People.

While the world's attention is drawn to Ukraine, the last few days have been dark in Israel. May our Tehillim and Tefillot be accepted by Hashem; that He protect our people and our land, safeguarding all our citizens and security services. At this time of Redemption may Hashem's glory be renewed in and amongst Israel.

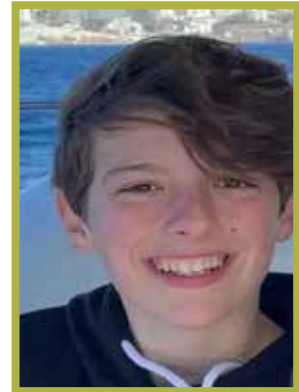
