With all our Flaws

Parshat Noach tells the celebrated account of the flood and Hashem’s destruction of a world that He sees is beset with bloodshed, violence and immorality.

Hashem had created a world of beauty for humanity to serve Him and proclaim His name. It was not just that the world was filled with evil people; the very purpose of Creation was being undermined.

Hashem would start over again.

All considered, Hashem chose quite a cumbersome route. Telling Noach to build the Ark, find the animals, pair them up... This took about 100 years. Even once the flood began, he had to watch the rain pour down, the waters rise for 40 days and 40 nights. Then they floated. It was almost a year till the waters subsided and they landed atop Mount Ararat.

It took just six days for Hashem to create an entire universe from nothing. It should not have taken so long to wipe it away and start afresh.

We have an additional and important question. Why is the story of Noach so bound up with saving an exclusive ark-load of animals? How does it reconcile with Hashem’s parting shot to Jonah in the tale we read over Yom Kippur – “Do you not think I care about these people I have created... and their cattle?”

We must understand that Noach is not to be considered the lucky, morally fitting survivor of a terrible tragedy. Rather, he is the object of a lesson – and the lesson took time.

Noach had to earn his survival. His credentials were that he walked with God. Noach had to build his salvation and take responsibility for animal life. He had to find his creatures and feed them. Hashem demanded of Noach that he habituate himself to unselfish living.

The ark was not simply a life raft or rescue boat. It was a crucible in which was nurtured a new society.

Before the flood, the world had been judged by man as a cursed and hostile environment where produce was the reward for toil and the sweat of the brow. In making him

responsible for the Ark, Hashem inculcated in Noach and his descendants a sense of responsibility for all that remained of life. We must put something of ourselves into maintaining the life around us.

This shift in human responsibility is reflected in the charge given to Noach and his children in the new covenant, which was symbolised by the rainbow. As well as being told that Hashem vowed never again to curse the earth, we are told that Hashem became reconciled to humanity which incorporated the capacity for evil.

Flawed humanity was able to live in Hashem’s world subject to seven core commands, known as the covenant of the children of Noach.

These are prohibitions on murder, theft, sexual impropriety, idolatry, blasphemy and eating the limb of a living animal. There is also a positive requirement to establish a system of courts and justice.

Whereas before, the only commandment to mankind had been do not eat the forbidden fruit – a very personal restriction and inapplicable post-Eden; now, humanity was given a regime based on personal and interpersonal responsibility.

This new regime emphasised respect for human dignity, respect for the Divinity and a sensitivity to nature. In creating the positive requirement to set up courts of justice, Hashem sent a further clear signal. It is not enough for individuals to forbear from doing harm. Humanity must be proactive in establishing, teaching and applying standards for good.

Hashem can create and destroy worlds in an instant. It takes a while longer for mankind to appreciate and to build a just society.

May we triumph over our capacity for ill and aspire to fulfil the words of the prophet Micah: O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you, but to do justice, and to cherish lovingkindness, and to walk humbly with your God?

The Rabbi Writes

What a treat to spend an evening with the insight, anecdotes and humour of Lord John Alderdice!

The former Speaker of the NI Assembly, son of a Presbyterian minister, consultant psychiatrist is now Director of the Centre for the Resolution of Intractable Conflict (CRIC) based at Harris Manchester College at the University of Oxford. He shared with us perspectives on leadership and thoughts on bringing disparate communities together.

Successful conflict resolution means understanding the narratives and perceptions of all the participants. A simple invitation to a meal in a restaurant might be intended by the one party to convey a desire to build a warm relationship. If the other party is not sensitive to emotions or has, for example an eating disorder, then that same invitation could be interpreted as a criticism – “you don’t know how to eat or look after yourself properly!” The warm gesture is interpreted as a dig and causes offence. Elaborating on this, he observed that while religion is often represented as a source of conflict and intolerance, religious education can be a powerful tool for seeing our nuanced similarities and breaking down misapprehension and prejudice.

England’s statement as part of the Good Friday process that it “had no more selfish strategic or economic interest” in Northern Ireland was a significant assurance in resolving differences there. Lord Alderdice said that the Middle East remains a hotspot of intractable conflicts because the external powers can make no such claim. The USA, Russia, Europeans (inter alia) all have selfish agendas.

World leaders, he explained, reflect the zeitgeist, the mood of the peoples at the time. In the last generation, they saw themselves as statesmen striving to resolve conflict – Gorbachev, Peres or de Klerk. Today’s statesmen project a much more



confrontational mien, which is a response to national insecurities; the apprehension that society is being undermined. Many people are alarmed at the pace of societal change. Accordingly, moral standing and values of compassion play second fiddle to the projection of strength and promise of certainty.

Looking ahead, he suggested, we need to understand the difference between settlement (an agreement how to manage outstanding concerns) and ultimate resolution. There is a confidence-building process to be followed. It is not like climbing aboard a bicycle and pedalling like mad. It is like playing an accordion, repetitive coming together and separations, the chance to let the process breathe. A mindset of red lines, echo chamber information gathering and declarations that one could never be friends with / respect a ___ supporter is a worrying obstacle to such comings-together. He warned that we do not begin to realise the extent to which we are being manipulated by selfish interest in a hidden war waged through advanced technologies.

Marie van der Zyl

Marie van der Zyl was elected President of the Board of Deputies of British Jews in May 2018. In the past three years she has played a crucial part in the fight against antisemitism in the Labour Party. Her quote, labelling the Chakrabarti report as a “whitewash”, was carried widely across national media. Marie was at the forefront of the campaign against the so-called “cab-rank” policy, by which the Inner North London Coroner delayed the release of bodies to Jewish families. Her negotiations resulted in its adoption of the internationally recognised IHRA definition of antisemitism.

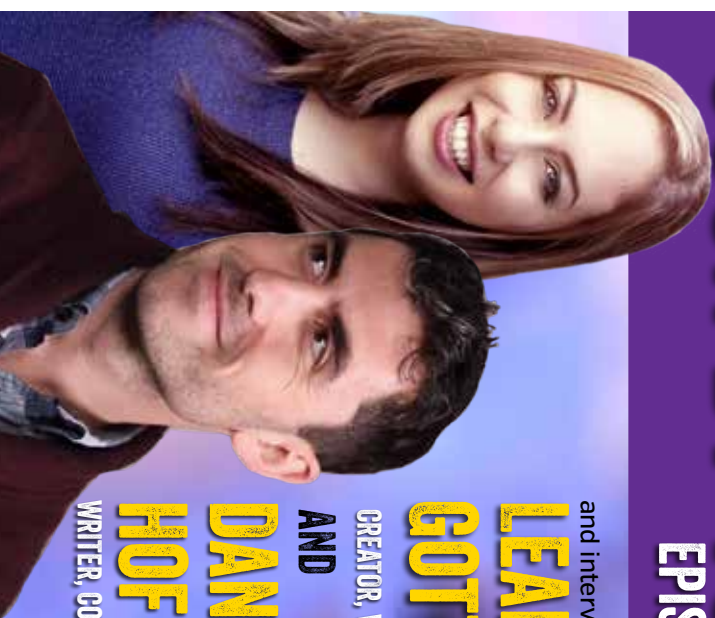
