Parashat Emor – Preserving God’s Good Name

In Parashat Emor, tucked between the laws of fitting offerings and the outline of our calendar year, we are instructed in Chillul and Kiddush Hashem.

The verses state (Vayikra 22, 31-33) “You shall perform My commandments and observe them, I am Hashem. And you shall not desecrate My Holy Name; I shall be sanctified among the Children of Israel; I am Hashem who sanctifies you; Who brought you out of Egypt to be your God. I am Hashem.”

In his Sefer Hamitzvot, Rambam identifies three categories of Chillul Hashem. “Two fall upon the community and one on individuals.”

The first communal category applies when there is pressure to violate any of the Torah’s precepts. Rambam enumerates the following cases. At a time of “Shmad” (ie when there is a sustained policy by the oppressive ruling power to destroy Jewish observance), if under duress to violate any specific mitzvah, in private or in public, and complies, he or she is guilty of Chillul Hashem. Halacha extends this even down to changing a minhag of how to lace one’s shoes.

In the Shoah, poskim in the ghettos and camps (for example Rav Oshry in Kovno) distinguished the “Shmad” of yesteryear, where the endeavour was to subjugate and humiliate local Jewish communities by forcing violations of halacha. In the Shoah, however, the agenda was to kill all Jews and Judaism. Accordingly, the paramount obligation was to survive.

Even if not at a time of Shmad, but still under duress, violation of the laws of idolatry, sexual impropriety or murder would be Chillul Hashem. Where done in an assembly of 10 adult Jews, Rambam establishes this as the even more severe category – Chillul Hashem beRabbim – the public desecration of G-d’s name.

In such circumstances, there is an obligation to Sanctify. The positive mitzvah of Kiddush Hashem is the requirement to become a martyr rather than live a sinner. Rambam makes it clear that to martyr oneself when not required to do so is itself a capital sin. In his letter to the Jews of Yemen, who were under duress to convert to Islam, he ruled it would be wrong to choose death as Islam was not idolatrous. He noted that those who had already lain down their lives for Judaism had acted wrongly, albeit with the purest of motives.

The second communal category is where someone chooses to violate a Torah precept where he or she is not motivated by desire or enjoyment but simply the wilful demonstration

of not being bound by halacha. Popping into a treif restaurant on the way home from Kol Nidrei, when one is not at all hungry and devouring a cheeseburger with bacon – just for the evil thrill would be such an example. At the heart of the transgression is the wilful shrugging off of mitzvot, deriving pleasure in being bad.

The third, and individual, category pertains to conduct which is technically not a violation of other mitzvot. Rambam writes, it applies when “an individual known for piety and rectitude does something that the public perceive as sinful – and therefore for such a person, though within halacha, it is a desecration of God’s Name.”

Within halacha, this translates into two scenarios. The first is our higher expectation of people who are “pillars of the community”. Whether through their frumkeit or office; those identified as role models are responsible for more than their own reputation. Should they do something suspect or “beneath them” (even though technically permissible), they are guilty of diminishing the name of God. Public perception of what is right and wrong, even though it is not informed by halacha, has the capacity to transform the technically permissible into a grave sin. Trying to justify oneself through clever pilpul only exacerbates it as people will question “What kind of God could allow this...?” Amongst instances where this has been manifest, are for example, where halachic principles of ownership and rights have been used to justify copyright violation or digital piracy.

The second scenario is a broader application of this question and extends it to potential ridicule of Jews and halacha by the outside world. It is an interesting sensitivity as it pits a determination to hold true to halacha against societal norms.

An egregious contemporary desecration is where communities/their leaders have used the principles of “moser” (not reporting wrong to the civil authorities) to justify deliberate withholding of reports on child abuse. The laws of “moser” are a meaningful protection against the iniquitous barbarism of historical idolatrous punishment. Today, the consequence of this misplaced “piety” is the endangering of other vulnerable children, and the protection, instead, of their abusers. Those who rely on the laws of “moser” to justify silence are not just misunderstanding the laws of “moser”; they are misunderstanding the fundamental framework of Judaism. When we act in Hashem’s name, we must edify it.

Join the Divine Assembly

This Shabbat we read the third Perek of Pirkei Avot. Within it, Rabbi Chanina ben Teradyon and Rabbi Shimon discuss the occasions when groups of two or three come together or eat together and fail to exchange words of Torah. These are sessions of scoffers or tables of idolaters. If words of Torah are exchanged, then Hashem's Presence dwells among them.

Looking forward to seeing you, greeting you and sharing Torah with you over this most exciting Shabbat.

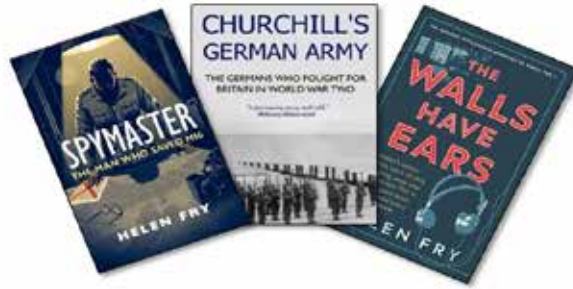
