Bereshit – The “Very Good” Question

Very often, as we look at the world around us, we are astounded by both its beauty and its glaring defects. Hashem looked at each stage of Creation and called it “good”. (Bereshit 1:4, 10, 12, 18, 21, 25) On the sixth day, at the culmination, after the creation of humankind, Hashem surveys the totality and concludes, וַיַּבְהֶֽט־טוֹב מְאֹד “and behold it was very good.” (Bereshit 1:31).

We don’t always see it that way. Stunning scenery and a picture postcard paradise are blighted by famine, disease and strife. It is these that often call us to question how Hashem can be all-good, the epitome of perfection.

Moreover, while the Bible represents the creation of mankind as Hashem’s crowning achievement, to all appearances, we are probably the most flawed and destructive of Hashem’s creatures... a *beta* to be worked upon before it is ready for general release.

Can something with the potential to cause such destruction really be called “very good”?

As our commentators wrestle with this question, and they explain the very purpose of Creation, they don’t see it that way at all. They ask, what would be the wonder in an all-powerful Hashem creating an all-beautiful universe? Indeed, if there were no flaws, there could be no appreciation of perfection!

When we look carefully at the text, we see in Bereshit Chapter 1 that Hashem creates mankind out of nothing; mankind is male and female and in Hashem’s image. Hashem instructs this creation to populate the world and to dominate it.

In Bereshit Chapter 2 the story is told over again, but this time, man is rolled out of the dust of the earth, the breath of life is breathed into him and woman is then extracted from within him. This more earthy creation is charged with the responsibility of working the world and tending it.

So, while we have a strident and Godly creature zapped into existence in Chapter 1, a far more humble one is rolled out in Chapter 2.

For secular scholars, this is seen as evidence of different creation myths being clumsily juxtaposed in our Bible. For

our biblical commentators, by contrast, the two accounts highlight the complexity and different dimensions of creation.

On a physical level, we are merely organic matter, part and parcel of our environment, charged with the responsibility to develop it, cultivate it and protect it. However, and moreover, we are also created on a spiritual level. In that, we bear the image of Hashem and we are endowed with phenomenal capacities of creativity, imagination, communication and reason. Wisdom is the ability to be discriminating with power. It is our mission to use these gifts and powers for good.

We are taught that Hashem created the world in such a way that we would become His partners in the completion of creation. This mission is known as Tikkun Olam, the repair or perfection of the universe.

The world is not perfect. It is our duty to make it so. Our capacity to achieve this is “very good”.

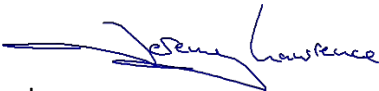
Often, we look at flawed creation and ask where is Hashem. After the sin in Eden. Hashem looked at the world he had given us to perfect and calls out, (Bereshit 3:9) אַיֶּיכָּה Where are you?

Where is mankind?

In the words of Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks, in *To Heal a Fractured World* “As long as there is hunger, poverty and treatable disease in the world, there is work for us to do. As long as nations fight and men hate and corruption stalks the corridors of power. As long as there is unemployment and homelessness, depression and despair our task is not yet done, and we hear, if we listen carefully enough, the voice of Hashem asking the first humans, “Where are you?””

May our endeavours to address our challenges and perfect our environment provide the “very good” answer to God’s question.

Reconciliation and Healing

What a wonderful start to 5780! I should like to thank everyone who helped to make the month of Yamim Tovim so fantastic: our wonderful team of service leaders, Gabbaim and Welcomers, the many of you who participated in Security rosters, everyone who helped with Children's Services, with setting up rooms and rolling Scrolls; everyone who provided hospitality... Particular thanks to Rabbi Laitner for his insights, explanations and sermons; Chazan Eli who is a powerhouse; Shimon and his team for the organisation, planning and publications; Peter and the Kinloss Centre staff, who have everything set up, ready and clean... one seamless changeover after another. Thanks and congratulations to Leora and Harry, our new youth directors, on their first Yom Tov season at Kinloss. What fabulous feedback we have had on your services and programs.

I hope that you will be joining us in the programs ahead and would particularly draw your attention to my conversation with the **Rt Hon, Lord John Alderdice next Wednesday evening (30th Oct) at 8pm.** John Alderdice was the first Speaker of the Northern Ireland assembly 1998-2004 and has played a significant role in factional/ethnic/religious reconciliation in international conflicts. His father was a Presbyterian minister, and John served for many years within the church and as an Elder. He was a consultant psychiatrist and a lecturer in medicine. I was privileged to him lecture earlier this year about models of spiritual and political leadership; about reconciliation and healing. I thought the topic would be interesting around Rosh Hashanah but could not have imagined then how current it would be! His will be a fascinating voice to hear everything that is happening in Parliament and the Lords, in our fractious parties and politics at the moment.

At the beginning of the human story, Hashem instructs Adam not to eat from the fruit of the tree

“or you will surely die” (Bereshit 2, 17). But Adam didn't die! He and Eve were exiled. One of my Rosh Yeshiva's favourite Divrei Torah explored the halachic principle that a person's emissary or Shaliach has the same legal capacity as his principal (the person who sent him). In Ivrit this is expressed by the phrase **שְׁלוּחוֹ שֶׁל אָדָם כְּמוֹתוֹ** (shlucho shel adam kemoto). The self-same phrase also translates as “the sending out of Adam is like his death.” Hence, being sent into exile is like a death penalty!

More than a pun or clever homonym, there is profundity to the sentiment. As a people exiled from our land, we were projected by others as fossils of a bygone spiritual cult. People who experience alienation describe it as dehumanising or soul destroying. The seasonal theme of Shuva/Teshuva is about return and rehabilitation. Only when we are reconciled within ourselves, even over differences with others, can we begin to heal.

These will be themes I will be exploring with Lord John Alderdice on Wednesday and I look forward to seeing you there!

Rabbi Lawrence In Conversation with...

• Wednesday 30th October - 8pm Rt Hon Lord John Alderdice

John Alderdice is a Psychiatrist by profession, but as Leader of the Alliance Party of Northern Ireland, he played a significant role in the Talks on Northern Ireland including the negotiation of the 1998 Good Friday Agreement. He was the first Speaker of the new Northern Ireland Assembly and has held many international positions including as President of Liberal International. Since 1996 he has sat as a Liberal Democrat life member of the House of Lords, and is currently Director of the Centre for the Resolution of Intractable Conflict and Chairman of the Centre for Democracy and Peace Building in Belfast. Lord Alderdice's areas of special interest are the individual and group psychology of terrorism and violent political conflict and the psychology of religious fundamentalism.



• Wednesday 6th November - 8pm Marie van der Zyl

Marie van der Zyl was elected President of the Board of Deputies of British Jews in May 2018. In the past three years she has played a crucial part in the fight against antisemitism in the Labour Party. Her quote, labelling the Chakrabarti report as a "whitewash", was carried widely across national media. Marie was at the forefront of the campaign against the so-called "cab-rank" policy, by which the Inner North London Coroner delayed the release of bodies to Jewish families. Her negotiations resulted in its adoption of the internationally recognised IHRA definition of antisemitism.

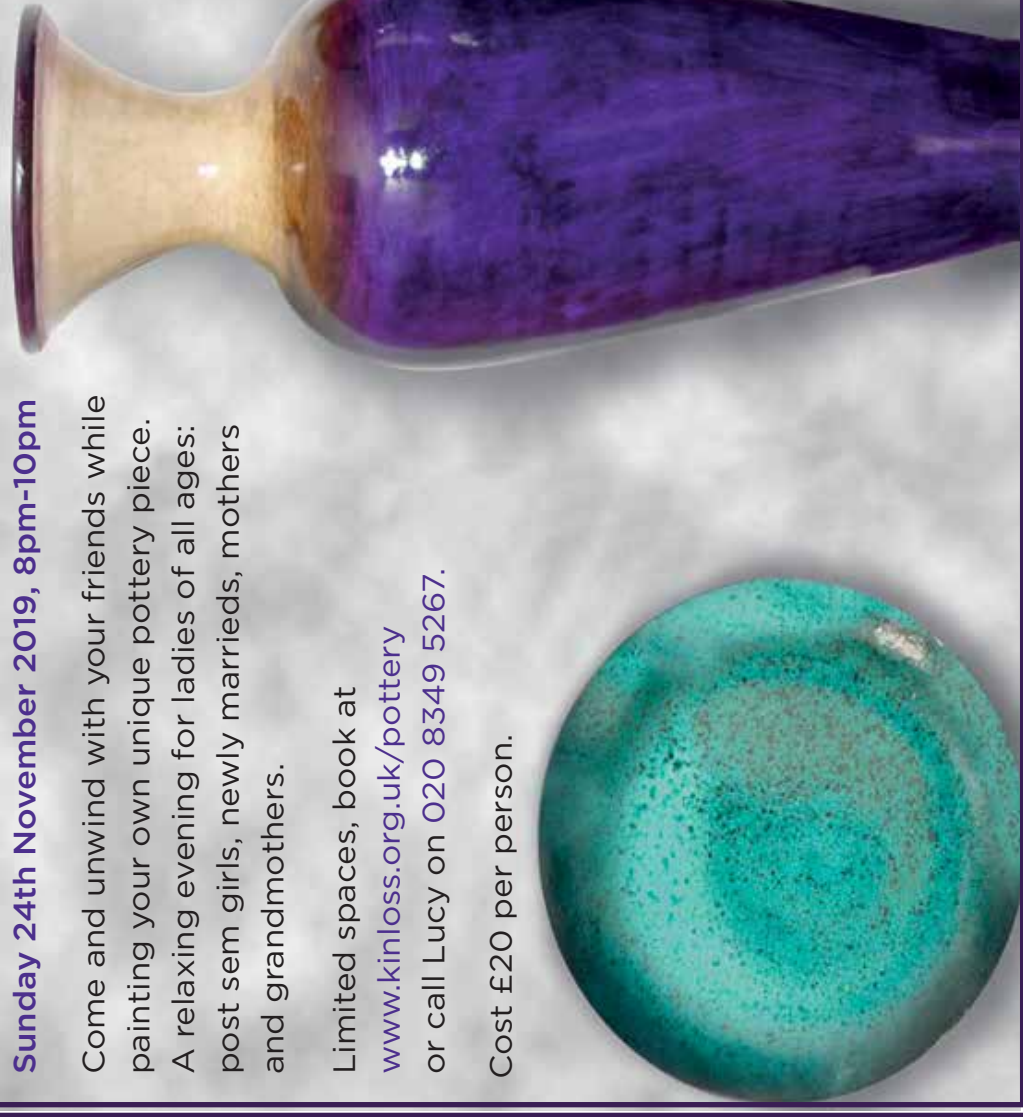
