A God by any other Name...

Last week in Parshat Shemot, as Moses stood at the Burning Bush, he asked God, when I tell the Children of Israel that “the God of their forefathers has sent me to you, they will ask, ‘What is His name?’ – What shall I say to them?” Hashem answers “*E’heyeh Asher E’heyeh...* Tell them Eheyeh has sent me to you.” The word Eheyeh means “I shall be”.

“I shall be who I shall be... I shall be whatever I choose to be...”

At the Burning Bush, Hashem is the God of infinite potential. Not exactly the teamwork of “Yes we can.” God is a singular “I can do it! Yes I can!” God. This infinite potential will come to liberate the Children of Israel from Pharaoh’s bondage.

Parshat Va’eira opens with another God/Moses dialogue. God appears to Moses and says “*Ani Hashem*”. Though the name of God (*Yud Hay Vav Hay*) has indeed appeared previously in the text, God points out to Moses, “I appeared to Abraham, Isaac and to Jacob as ‘*E’l Sh’addai*’ – but with my name ‘*Hashem*’, I had not made Myself known to them.”

The designation *E’l Sh’addai* first appeared in the middle of the Abraham story, when Hashem introduced the covenant of circumcision. It is explained as the God “*She-amar Dai*” – the God who sets limits in this world, defining what is permissible, what prohibited, where the waters of creation start and stop, where the physical ends and the spiritual begins. In the context of circumcision, the Brit Milah tempers the organ most associated with man’s base and physical drive. It cuts it and

limits it and sanctifies the child in a spiritual covenant.



E’heyeh is a name of infinite possibility. *E’l Sh’addai* is a name of limitation.

This God of separation and definition now introduces another public dimension; the dimension of Hashem. The name ‘*Hashem*’ represents judgment, eternal truth and the fulfilment of obligation. God had committed to redeeming the Children of Israel, and now He shall make good on it. God will hold Egypt accountable for its enslavement of the Israelites.

Whereas the name *E’heyeh* is in the future tense and signifies potential, Hashem is rooted in the present. It represents persona, Presence in the here and now. God is telling Moses of a transition from redemption as hope and aspiration to redemption as reality, actual and of the moment.

The message which Moses is required to convey to the Israelites is that the season of change is upon them. Previous generations were aware of the promise and the potential but had not known fulfilment.

God describes the four-pledge platform of deliverance; “I shall take you out... I shall rescue you... I shall redeem you... I shall take you to me for a people – and you shall know that I am Hashem your God.” These expressions are each represented by one of the four cups of wine on Seder night.

A final promise is made “I shall bring you to the land and give it to you as a heritage.” A fifth goblet remains on our Seder Table – the cup of Elijah, for he will herald the messianic era – when we are in the land and all at peace. Then we shall drink this cup, too.

From our earliest days when we were taught of Abraham’s monotheism, our teachers stressed the singular unity of God. It seems jarring to identify these different manifestations; a splitting of the godly atom.

Within the Shema, “*Hashem E’lohaynu Hashem Echad*”, we are at pains to affirm and confirm that behind this name of God and that name of God is one.

Our ancestors have experienced both the anticipation and the fulfilment of God’s promises. We are ‘deemed’ to know God in His fullness. Recounting the promises and drinking the four cups of wine at Seder are established a testament to that. Nonetheless, our individual circumstances do lead us to have different understandings of God and the way He is manifest.

In the same way as the Amidah speaks of “The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and

the God of Jacob” we are encouraged to have our own personal relationship with the God of Israel.

For many of us, parents and grandparents were subjected to the cruellest bondage and oppression humanity has suffered. We have been removed, rescued, redeemed, granted autonomy, recognised as a nation and enabled to enter the land.

It remains our prayer that we share in the blessing of the full completion of that fifth pledge to Moses. May we and our brethren dwell in peace and with security in the Land. May that fifth cup be ours for the drinking.

“*Bayom hahu yihiyeh Hashem echad u-shemo echad*”. May that day come, where all humanity acknowledges with us that God is one and his name is one.

THIS WEEK'S HAFTORAH BY RABBI ANDREWS

In this week's Haftorah, the prophet Yechezkel (Ezekiel) conveys a prophecy regarding Paroh (Pharaoh) and Mitzrayim (Egypt), the "Great Alligator". In this prophecy, Hashem (God) complains that Mitzrayim came to acknowledge the Nile as the exclusive source of its might. For this reason, and the fact that Paroh had reneged on his promise to go to Israel's aid against the attacking Babylonians, Paroh and Mitzrayim were singled out for punishment.

In the parallel Torah reading, we see Moshe telling the Egyptians they cannot stand against God's will and refuse to allow the Jews to go free. Unfortunately, they ignored the message and bore the consequences. Mitzrayim in Yechezkel's time is repeating its error, seeing itself as entirely independent, all-powerful, and god-like. The Midrash further connects Egypt's sin in the Haftorah to that of the Parsha by explaining that the punishments promised in the Haftorah parallel the Ten Plagues begun in the Torah reading.

Towards the end of the Haftorah Hashem speaks to Yechezkel of Nebuchadnezzar (Nebuchadnezzar), who is seen as having done God's work in destroying Tzor, despite the likelihood that he did so for his own reasons. As part of that reward, Hashem says that the Babylonian king will replace Mitzrayim. This implies that Mitzrayim had a role to play in world history and, had it been successful, might have earned a reward. Its failure created the need for a replacement.

In July 2018 she attracted tremendous publicity for attacking Jeremy Corbyn as 'A Racist and Anti-Semite'.



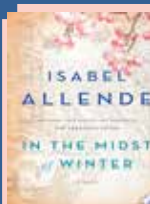
